

From Fr. Mike's Desk

"Jesus answered and said to her, 'If you knew the gift of God and who is saying to you, "Give me a drink" you would ask him and he would give you living water.' The woman said to him, 'Sir, you do not even have a bucket and the cistern is deep, where then can you get this living water? Are you greater than our father Jacob, who gave us this cistern?' Jesus answered, 'everyone who drinks this water will be thirsty again; but whoever drinks the water I shall give will never thirst; the water I shall give will become...a spring of water welling up to eternal life.'"

Water is a common theme of today's readings. In one account, water meets the immediate need of very thirsty people in the desert, and in the other, we are told about water that will satisfy the soul. Both are necessary to live in this world and to increase our spiritual life. Who can blame the Israelites in the desert for being upset when they did not have water, and who could blame them for complaining? However, we still have to ask the question, why did they have such a great lack of faith in God? After all, they had seem everything God did to set them free from over 400 years of slavery in Egypt. He sent the plagues, the Passover, the parting of the Red Sea, and He gave them the Ten Commandments. He gave them the quail and the manna from heaven and still they complained and even asked if the Lord was in their midst? This great lack of faith, was also their great sin, fortunately that did not stop God from providing water from the rock. The significance of water coming from the rock is that in the Old Testament, the Rock refers to God (the Rock of Ages that never ends and is the foundation of the world). This is a sign that the Rock will never abandon His people even when they abandon

In today's Gospel, the Samaritan woman goes to the well also looking for water to satisfy her physical thirst, but she receives so much more. She does not come away with physical water; no, she comes away with the true spirit of God and the new life given to her through Jesus. She asks Jesus, "'are you greater than our father Jacob?" The answer to that is you bet, much greater! For it was with God that Jacob made a covenant and it is with God, made one of us, that the woman has this encounter. After her encounter, she believed in Jesus, in fact the whole town believed in Him. They believed first by listening to her, and then by listening to Him, and not wanting to let Him go. Jesus gives them new life, forgiveness for their sins, and a hope and faith that reaches deep into the heart and never disappoints as St. Paul tells us in today's letter. The people of this Samaritan village knew that they could truly trust in God, because of Jesus. Can the same be said about us? Can we say the same as we walk through our lives and trials? Can we trust enough in God that He will mend what is broken and pick us up when we fall down, and that He will be the Good Shepherd who leaves the 99

and goes out and searchers for us when we are lost? On the other hand, will we be like the Israelites in the desert who saw God do all of those wonderful things and still disbelieved? How will you answer these questions? If you do not know or if you do not like your answers, then continue using this holy season to help you and truly prepare for the great celebration of our new life, Easter!

Two weeks ago, at the Rite of Election, Wen Bo took the next step toward full initiation into the Church. Also this year we have Eduardo and Feliz who are being brought into full communion with the Church by receiving Confirmation and Eucharist. Let us keep them in our prayers.
