Third Sunday of Lent

Reading 1 - Exodus 3:1-8a, 13-15

Moses was tending the flock of his father-in-law Jethro, the priest of Midian. Leading the flock across the desert, he came to Horeb, the mountain of God. There an angel of the LORD appeared to Moses in fire flaming out of a bush. As he looked on, he was surprised to see that the bush, though on fire, was not consumed. So Moses decided, "I must go over to look at this remarkable sight, and see why the bush is not burned."

When the LORD saw him coming over to look at it more closely, God called out to him from the bush, "Moses! Moses!" He answered, "Here I am." God said, "Come no nearer! Remove the sandals from your feet, for the place where you stand is holy ground. I am the God of your fathers, "he continued, "the God of Abraham, the God of Isaac, the God of Jacob." Moses hid his face, for he was afraid to look at God. But the LORD said, "I have witnessed the affliction of my people in Egypt and have heard their cry of complaint against their slave drivers, so I know well what they are suffering. Therefore I have come down to rescue them from the hands of the Egyptians and lead them out of that land into a good and spacious land, a land flowing with milk and honey."

Moses said to God, "But when I go to the Israelites and say to them, 'The God of your fathers has sent me to you,' if they ask me, 'What is his name?' what am I to tell them?" God replied, "I am who am." Then he added, "This is what you shall tell the Israelites: I AM sent me to you."

God spoke further to Moses, "Thus shall you say to the Israelites: The LORD, the God of your fathers, the God of Abraham, the God of Isaac, the God of Jacob, has sent me to you.

"This is my name forever; thus am I to be remembered through all generations."

Reading 2 - 1 Corinthians 10:1-6, 10-12

I do not want you to be unaware, brothers and sisters, that our ancestors were all under the cloud and all passed through the sea, and all of them were baptized into Moses in the cloud and in the sea. All ate the same spiritual food, and all drank the same spiritual drink, for they drank from a spiritual rock that followed them, and the rock was the Christ. Yet God was not pleased with most of them, for they were struck down in the desert.

These things happened as examples for us, so that we might not desire evil things, as they did. Do not grumble as some of them did, and suffered death by the destroyer. These things happened to them as an example, and they have been written down as a warning to us, upon whom the end of the ages has come. Therefore, whoever thinks he is standing secure should take care not to fall.

Gospel - Luke 13:1-9

Some people told Jesus about the Galileans whose blood Pilate had mingled with the blood of their sacrifices. Jesus said to them in reply, "Do you think that because these Galileans suffered in this way they were greater sinners than all other Galileans? By no means! But I tell you, if you do not repent, you will all perish as they did! Or those eighteen people who were killed when the tower at Siloam fell on them — do you think they were more guilty than everyone else who lived in Jerusalem? By no means! But I tell you, if you do not repent, you will all perish as they did!"

And he told them this parable: "There once was a person who had a fig tree planted in his orchard, and when he came in search of fruit on it but found none, he said to the gardener, 'For three years now I have come in search of fruit on this fig tree but have found none. So cut it down. Why should it exhaust the soil?' He said to him in reply, 'Sir, leave it for this year also, and I shall cultivate the ground around it and fertilize it; it may bear fruit in the future. If not you can cut it down.""

From Fr. Mike's Desk

A few weeks from today (the 2nd Sunday of Easter) we will celebrate Divine Mercy Sunday, and, on that day, we will bring out the icon of the Divine Mercy. As we look at the icon we will see the following words, "Jesus I trust in you." These words remind us that no matter what happens we can always trust in Jesus to guide us and help us. This idea of trusting in God is not new and it goes back to the very beginning of our relationship with God. At first, God made His promises to Noah, then to Abraham, Isaac, Jacob, and Joseph. Later, God made promises to Moses, Joshua, David, and Solomon. After that, God made His promises to humanity through the Prophets. When God spoke to Moses in the apparition of the Burning Bush, He told Moses that He was to be known as, "I AM WHO AM." God was telling Moses more than he could imagine, for God is telling Moses (and all humanity) that He is, indeed, everything, that He is existence and life, and that all things come from Him, and He holds all things together. When God sends Moses to Pharaoh, He is further showing what that means when He rescues the people from four hundred years of slavery. But if God is with His people, why were they in slavery for four hundred years? The answer comes back to free will, and a very convoluted history that placed the Israelites in a position they should not have allowed themselves to get into. Using their own free will, their cleverness backfired on them, and they were placed in slavery. But even though it may have been their own fault, God was still with them, and when the time was right, He brought their captivity to an end and fully showed the world who He has always been. This is also the case of the Babylonian Captivity, which the people had endured for seventy years. The King of Persia, unknown to himself, became God's instrument, when he released them. But this would only happen when it was the right time for the people of Israel.

Yes, God is always with His people, in good times and in bad, especially when His people feel that they have been abandoned. It should also be remembered that God does not allow or cause bad things to happen, nor does He visit bad things upon us when we sin. If you question this, listen to the very words of the Son of God! As He says, "'Do you think that because these Galileans suffered in this way, they were greater sinners than all other Galileans? By no means...' 'Or those eighteen people who were killed when the tower of Siloam fell on them, do you think they were more guilty than everyone else...by no means!'" Jesus is telling us, that God did not do this or anything else like it. For God is truly trustworthy and He gives us all that we need.

Yet, Jesus does add something else to this thought when He tells His listeners to REPENT! This is what is called for in the Parable of the Fig Tree, which did not bear fruit after three years of tender care. The owner wants to remove it, but the gardener asks the owner to leave it one more season, and he will take care of it. If the tree does not produce any fruit, the gardener will cut it down. If it does not respond, if it refuses to change or grow, it will die. Jesus is the gardener, and we can be that fig tree, and if we do not accept all that God wants to give us to help us to totally trust in Him than we too could be lost!

Luke has gone to great lengths in the Gospel readings for the past two weeks to show us what we as humans can do, how we can resist temptation, how we can become transfigured, and become something new with the help and love of God. Today we are told this can only happen if we accept His love and repent from anything that stands in our way of having a close relationship with God. This is something we all must do, even knowing that we are not perfect and that we sometimes struggle in our relationship with God and others. We must use all that God gives us and trust that He will help us make our faith come alive. This is what Lent is supposed to remind us to do. We, of course, are not just to do this during these 40 days, but every day of our lives. If we are not doing this, let us use Lent to kick-start the process for us.

Remember next weekend we begin the Fourth Sunday of Lent as we have reached the half-way mark of our Lenten Journey. To bring this point home we will wear the Rose-Colored Vestments, so do not waste any time, use this Lent well, and at the same time get ready to celebrate the new life of Easter.

Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are obligatory days of fasting and abstinence for Catholics. In addition, Fridays during Lent are obligatory days of abstinence. For members of the Roman Catholic Church, the norms on fasting are obligatory from age 18 until age 59. When fasting, a person is permitted to eat one full meal, as well as two smaller meals that together are not equal to a full meal. The norms concerning abstinence from meat are binding upon members of the Roman Catholic Church from age 14 onwards.


