Brothers and sisters: I consider everything as a loss because of the supreme good of knowing Christ Jesus my Lord. For his sake I have accepted the loss of all things and I consider them so much rubbish, that I may gain Christ and be found in him, not having any righteousness of my own based on the law but that which comes through faith in Christ, the righteousness from God, depending on faith to know him and the power of his resurrection and the sharing of his sufferings by being conformed to his death, if somehow I may attain the resurrection from the dead.

It is not that I have already taken hold of it or have already attained perfect maturity, but I continue my pursuit in hope that I may possess it, since I have indeed been taken possession of by Christ Jesus. Brothers and sisters, I for my part do not consider myself to have taken possession. Just one thing: forgetting what lies behind but straining forward to what lies ahead, I continue my pursuit toward the goal, the prize of God's upward calling, in Christ Jesus.

#### Gospel - Luke 15:1-3, 11-32

Jesus went to the Mount of Olives. But early in the morning he arrived again in the temple area, and all the people started coming to him, and he sat down and taught them. Then the scribes and the Pharisees brought a woman who had been caught in adultery and made her stand in the middle. They said to him, "Teacher, this woman was caught in the very act of committing adultery. Now in the law, Moses commanded us to stone such women. So what do you say?" They said this to test him, so that they could have some charge to bring against him. Jesus bent down and began to write on the ground with his finger. But when they continued asking him, he straightened up and said to them, "Let the one among you who is without sin be the first to throw a stone at her." Again he bent down and wrote on the ground. And in response, they went away one by one, beginning with the elders. So he was left alone with the woman before him. Then Jesus straightened up and said to her, "Woman, where are they? Has no one condemned you?" She replied, "No one, sir." Then Jesus said, "Neither do I condemn you. Go, and from now on do not sin any more."

## From Fr. Mike's Desk

Last weekend's Gospel told us the story of the Prodigal Son and the actions of the loving father. It also showed us the lesson that we should be willing to forgive as the father forgave his younger son, and that we should rejoice when a person repents and seeks forgiveness. We also should not judge people nor be indignant when a person wishes to reconcile with us or others. This week we are told the story of the woman caught in adultery. This woman was brought to Jesus by the Scribes and the Pharisees to trap Him. Notice what they say to Jesus; "'Teacher, this woman was caught in the very act of committing adultery. Now in the law. Moses commanded us to stone such a woman. So, what do you say?" If Jesus said, follow the Law of Moses, they would have immediately said what about all your talk of forgiveness? If Jesus said, let her go, then they would have said that He did not follow the law, thus He could not be sent by God. So, Jesus produces the perfect solution, and it gives us a perfect lesson to follow. Jesus says, "'Let the one among you who is without sin be the first to throw a stone at her." We are told that in response to His words they went away one by one beginning with the elders, and not a single stone was thrown. They realized, as they looked closely at their own lives, that they were not totally without sin. Hopefully after this exchange with the Son of God, they gained knowledge about forgiveness, and learned not to be so quick to judge.

Now comes the next part of the story, and another lesson for us. Jesus asked her, "'Woman, where are they? Has no one condemned you?"" She replied, "'No one sir." And Jesus said, "Neither do I condemn you. Go and from now on do not sin anymore." Our Lord readily forgives this woman, and He does not hold her sin against her, nor does He condemn her. However, Jesus does tell her to amend her live and strive to become a new person. Jesus did not condemn her, and neither should we when it comes to others or even ourselves. This does not mean that we should not be sorry for our sins or try to repent and change our lives. But it does mean that we should not think that our sins are so bad that God cannot forgive us. If Jesus could easily forgive this woman, so He forgives us! If you do not believe this, just look up at the Cross. Why do you think He suffered like that? He came down from heaven to save us and bring us to the new life of the Resurrection.

While we are on the topic, do you have a Crucifix hanging in every bedroom in your house? If the answer is no, why is that so? The Crucifix is a basic symbol of our faith, it reminds us of what Christ did to rescue us from sin, darkness, and spiritual death. It also reminds us that the Cross is not the end of the story, but the necessary step to the Resurrection. We will venerate the Cross on Good Friday because on that blessed tree, God conquered the sin trusted upon us by the tree found in the Garden of Eden. The Crucifix speaks directly to our hearts, and it says so much more than what we can say with our lips. Sometimes people say they do not like looking at the Cross because it is sad to look at the figure of the dead Christ, and it is scary! Good, it is supposed to invoke these emotions and so much more (even positive feelings). By looking at Christ on the Cross, we see the true King of Kings whose throne on the Cross means more than any earthly king's throne.

#### LENTEN RULES - FASTING & ABSTINENCE



Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are obligatory days of fasting and abstinence for Catholics. In addition, Fridays during Lent are obligatory days of abstinence. For members of the Roman Catholic Church, the norms on fasting are obligatory from age 18 until age 59. When fasting, a person is permitted to eat one full meal, as well as two smaller meals that together are not equal to a full meal. The norms concerning abstinence from meat are binding upon members of the Roman Catholic Church from age 14 onwards.




