

From Fr. Mike's Desk


Two weeks ago, we read the account of the Resurrection of Lazarus. As you may recall, Lazarus had been in the tomb for four days (a sure sign that he was truly dead) and he died before Jesus could arrive at Bethany. As we see in the Gospel, Jesus purposely delayed going to see his dying friend. He did this so He could show the gathered crowd, and all of Israel that God was doing great things through His Messiah! Jesus called Lazarus out of the tomb and brought him back to this life. All were amazed, after all, how could you not? In fact, as John tells us, word spread of this event all over Israel, and it certainly reached the ears of the leadership (who now sought to do harm not only to Jesus, but also to Lazarus).

Last week, we read how shortly after Lazarus was raised from the dead, Jesus entered into Jerusalem on what we call Palm Sunday. He entered the city to cheers and great joy on the part of the people, only to have them replaced with shouts of hatred and calls for His death on Good Friday. Today we have three wonderful accounts of His Resurrection, and each one tells us that event was, and is different from anything that came before it, or would come after it. The Resurrection was more powerful than the crossing of the Red Sea, greater than the establishment of the Kingdoms of David and Solomon, and more wonderful than any of Our Lord's previous miracles. Why, because all things that Jesus did. were pointing to this great moment, which transforms and saves humanity from sin, spiritual death and darkness.

As a sign of our new life, and our ability to worship the Father fully, we will renew our baptismal promises. We will be celebrating Easter for the next eight days as we observe its Octave, and the Easter Season will carry one right up to Pentecost Sunday on May 31, This is the most important time of the Church's Year, so make the most of it, even in these times of doubt and fear.

Also, during the Easter Season, our level two students will be receiving Jesus for the first time in the Blessed Sacrament. Hopefully that will be able to happen as it is scheduled. Please keep them and their families in your prayers as they celebrate their First Communion and hopefully will attend and participate at Mass every Sunday. Fr. Mike's Letter for Week 3 of the Corona Virus Crisis

Welcome to April, usually one of my favorite months of the year. The days are certainly getting longer, and warmer (give or take a weather front). April used to be the first month of the year. In fact, the Latin root of April means to open, so hence the name April because it opens the year. This was the case for the longest time, until the calendar was changed, and January became the first month. When this occurred, many people who did not keep up with the change still believed that April first was New Years Day. These people came to be known as April Fools. Today, for many, April first means a day of pranks, and practical jokes.

This year we have no time for jokes or April Fools. This is a time for April Heroes, as we see all of those who work in health care not just the medical professional who are working without end, but those who maintain the health care facilities. Those who make sure the beds, linens, equipment is where it belongs. The Heroes who work in the Supermarkets and Food Stores, the Banks, Drug Stores, Post Offices and Letter Carriers, Auto Techs, and so many more who are working on the front lines, Heroes like our Teachers who, who are conducting lessons on the internet. Students who are getting accustomed to this new way of learning and forced to do schoolwork when they are home and rather sleep or play. Please pray that we can accomplish this, and hopefully we will then do Sunday Masses from April 19th till we are back in the Church.

As I continue to look out my window, I see so many people coming to the church to pray, and this is a sure sign that our faith is growing stronger, not weaker in these trying times. I also want to thank everyone for your kind thoughts and wishes you have sent in cards and messages. Fr. Hyacinth, Deacons Jim and Barry, and I are extremely grateful for these and your prayers. So far, we are doing fine and know I pray for you every single day and I feel your pain about not being able to attend Mass. Hopefully this will be over soon, from our lips to God's ears.

I want to thank the people who work and volunteer at our Parish Social Ministry. They are coming in to help give food to those in need, some of those in need are coming because they have lost their jobs to the Corona Virus, and this number is growing. We are in desperate need of food to help so many so if you can donate food, you can drop it off into the wooden box in the church lobby. Thank you for all who can respond to this urgent call.

Thank you also for your constant financial support to our beautiful parish. Your continued support is over whelming, but I must admit I am not totally surprised your generosity is something I know I can count on, because this is Saint Edward's. Let us continue to pray and support each other and let us pray that the end of April and the beginning of May will see an end to very unpleasant April fool.
