

Sixth Sunday of Easter

Reading 1 - Acts 15:1-2, 22-29

Some who had come down from Judea were instructing the brothers, "Unless you are circumcised according to the Mosaic practice, you cannot be saved." Because there arose no little dissension and debate by Paul and Barnabas with them, it was decided that Paul, Barnabas, and some of the others should go up to Jerusalem to the apostles and elders about this question.

The apostles and elders, in agreement with the whole church, decided to choose representatives and to send them to Antioch with Paul and Barnabas. The ones chosen were Judas, who was called Barsabbas, and Silas, leaders among the brothers. This is the letter delivered by them:

"The apostles and the elders, your brothers, to the brothers in Antioch, Syria, and Cilicia of Gentile origin: greetings. Since we have heard that some of our number who went out without any mandate from us have upset you with their teachings and disturbed your peace of mind, we have with one accord decided to choose representatives and to send them to you along with our beloved Barnabas and Paul, who have dedicated their lives to the name of our Lord Jesus Christ. So we are sending Judas and Silas who will also convey this same message by word of mouth: 'It is the decision of the Holy Spirit and of us not to place on you any burden beyond these necessities, namely, to abstain from meat sacrificed to idols, from blood, from meats of strangled animals, and from unlawful marriage. If you keep free of these, you will be doing what is right. Farewell."

Reading 2 - Revelation 21:10-14, 22-23

The angel took me in spirit to a great, high mountain and showed me the holy city Jerusalem coming down out of heaven from God. It gleamed with the splendor of God. Its radiance was like that of a precious stone, like jasper, clear as crystal. It had a massive, high wall, with twelve gates where

twelve angels were stationed and on which names were inscribed, the names of the twelve tribes of the Israelites. There were three gates facing east, three north, three south, and three west. The wall of the city had twelve courses of stones as its foundation, on which were inscribed the twelve names of the twelve apostles of the Lamb.

I saw no temple in the city for its temple is the Lord God almighty and the Lamb. The city had no need of sun or moon to shine on it, for the glory of God gave it light, and its lamp was the Lamb.

Gospel - John 14:23-29

Jesus said to his disciples: "Whoever loves me will keep my word, and my Father will love him, and we will come to him and make our dwelling with him. Whoever does not love me does not keep my words; yet the word you hear is not mine but that of the Father who sent me.

"I have told you this while I am with you. The Advocate, the Holy Spirit, whom the Father will send in my name, will teach you everything and remind you of all that I told you. Peace I leave with you; my peace I give to you. Not as the world gives do I give it to you. Do not let your hearts be troubled or afraid. You heard me tell you, 'I am going away and I will come back to you.' If you loved me, you would rejoice that I am going to the Father; for the Father is greater than I. And now I have told you this before it happens, so that when it happens you may believe."

Next Week's Gospel Question

In next week's Gospel Jesus prayed to the Father asking that we may all be one. Do you have that total sense of love for your neighbor so we can all be one, and if not, what are you going to do about it?

Next Week's Readings

From Fr. Mike's Desk

"I have told you this while I am with you. The Advocate, the Holy Spirit, whom the Father will send in My name will teach you everything and remind you of all that I told you." These words spoken by Our Lord at the Last Supper, tell the Apostles that soon He will be taken away from them. They, like the words from last week's Gospel, are the final instructions given to them by the earthly Jesus. But they are also words that are meant to reassure them that everything will be all right after the events of Holy Thursday, Good Friday, and Holy Saturday. Last week, Jesus told the Apostles that they should love one another as He had loved them, and this week He tells them how they (and we) can do this. And that will happen because we will be taught by another Advocate.

The word Advocate is defined as someone who speaks on behalf of another person, especially in a legal context. Implicit in this definition is the idea that the one who is represented, lacks the knowledge, skill, ability or standing to speak for themselves. In our society, many take on the title advocate, and this includes various organizations and newspapers. But Jesus is using the word differently from this understanding. Jesus tells us that the Advocate is more than a legal advisor or representative, Jesus is telling us that the Holy Spirit will be like Him. The Holy Spirit will take on the case or the part of the sinner and save him or her from the spiritual danger of losing eternal life. The Holy Spirit will always be present to the Church to defend, guide, and advise every member. The Spirit abides in every believer and the Spirit takes the place of Christ's presence, while at the same time making Christ present, for they are both equally God. The Holy Spirit helps us to love as Jesus commands us to love and helps us make Christ present in all we say and do so we can continue the work of the Good Shepherd until He comes again!

This Thursday is Ascension Thursday, and it is a holy day of obligation, which means we mark this day by attending the celebration of the Eucharist. Masses for this day are Wednesday evening with the Vigil Mass at 5PM. Mass at 9AM and 12:10 PM during the day and 7PM on Thursday Night. Many think that the Solemnity of the Ascension marks the end of the Jesus story, but it is only the end of one chapter of the Salvation won for us by Christ, and it leads us to the next chapter which has the Holy Spirit as the

Advocate, guide, and mover of the Church the main character.

Let us pray; Father at your Son's Ascension into Heaven you promised to send the Holy Spirit upon your Apostles and your Church. You filled them with heavenly wisdom; fill us with the gifts of the Spirit. Grant this through our Lord Jesus Christ your Son, who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, God forever and ever. Amen

THE ASCENSION OF THE LORD

On Thursday, May 26, 2022 we celebrate The Ascension of the Lord. We are fast approaching the end of the Easter season. It was seven weeks ago that we celebrated the joy of the Resurrection on Easter Sunday. St. Luke teaches us in the Acts of the Apostles that Jesus, having revealed his risen glory to his disciples after the Resurrection, returned to his place with the Father in heaven forty days following his resurrection.

The Lord's Ascension into heaven is the fulfillment of his mission to achieve our salvation; we might use the phrase that he has come "full circle" in his return to the Father. However, there is a marvelous new reality that makes all the difference for us. In his return to the Father, Jesus takes with him our human nature. When he first descended from the Father in the Incarnation, Jesus joined his divinity to our humanity in an inseparable bond. Jesus's humanity was and remains real. It was not something that was an illusion nor was it discarded when his earthly ministry was completed. Jesus retains his glorified human nature beyond the boundaries of space and time in heaven. This fact points to the coming reality of the Resurrection of the Just on the last day, when not just the soul, but also the body will be redeemed and the two realities reunited forever in heaven.

LITURGY OF THE HOURS

The Liturgy of the Hours, also known as the Divine Office or the Work of God, is the daily prayer of the Church, marking the hours of each day and sanctifying the day with prayer. There are five canonical Hours; Office of Readings, Morning Prayer, Daytime Prayer, Evening Prayer and Night Prayer. Priests, Deacons and many Religious are obligated to the daily recitation of the Liturgy of the Hours, and the lay faithful are encouraged to do so also. The two most important Hours, or 'hinge Hours' are Morning and Evening Prayer. For this Monday, May 23rd, here are the Readings for the Morning and Evening Prayers:

Morning Prayer - Reading (Romans 10:8b-10: The word is near you, on your lips and in your heart (that is, the word of faith which we preach). For if you confess with your lips that Jesus is Lord, and believe in your heart that God raised him from the dead, you will be saved. Faith in the heart leads to justification, confession on the lips to salvation.

Evening Prayer - Reading (Hebrews 8:1b-3a): We have such a high priest, who has taken his seat at the right hand of the throne of the Majesty in heaven, minister of the sanctuary and of that true tabernacle set up, not by men, but by the Lord. Now every high priest is appointed to offer gifts and sacrifices.

Consider how reciting these simple prayers during the two hinge Hours might help you center your life around God, and bring you closer to the life He has designed for you. The Liturgy of the Hours can be found in book form, and also as downloadable (free) apps for your Android or Apple smartphone. If this is of interest to you, more information will be available in next week's bulletin.

Care for Our Church


St. Edward's church, our church, is a place of worship, reverence and beauty. When you attend Mass, other services, or just come in to pray, please refrain from bringing food and drinks into the nave (the main part of the church). Over the past months the ushers, cleaning people and parishioners have been finding food and candy wrappers, coffee cups, water bottles and other bits of litter in the pews and on the floor. As a show of respect you are asked to refrain from bringing any food or drink into the church. Understandably, if you are taking care of an infant, and need to bring a baby bottle into the church, this is a different circumstance.

Additionally, please refrain from using the kneelers as footrests when they are in the upright position. This places an undue strain on the kneelers, and causes them to break over time. We are fortunate to have a dedicated parishioner who comes to the church every week, and fixes those things which have been broken. This parishioner has been volunteering their time and skills for many years, but lately things are breaking with an increased frequency, so please be mindful. If you find something is broken or in need of repair, please bring it to the attention of one of the ushers so it can be placed on the list of things to be fixed.




