From Fr. Mike's Desk

What is the Blessed Trinity? Better yet, who is the Blessed Trinity? This great mystery of our faith is perhaps the hardest for people to comprehend, and it is likewise very difficult to explain to non-Christians (and maybe it is just as difficult to explain to Christians too). In fact, throughout the 2021-year history of the Church, many people and groups have decided to ignore the Church's teachings and come up with their own. In the early days of the Church, we saw the Arians who believed the Jesus was not really God. Arias (who was a priest) believed that Jesus was really a demigod who was a special creation by God, and sent to earth to carry out the mission of salvation. Of course, this is a heresy (meaning wrong belief) and the Council of Nicaea discredited it in 325 AD. The Emperor Constantine called the council because the controversy it created was causing bloodshed throughout the Empire. This council declared that anyone who did not believe that Jesus is God from God, Light from Light, True God from True God, is in error. So important is this council's teachings that it was constructed onto a creed (a statement of belief) and we say it at Mass every Sunday and Holy Day of Obligation.

After on, some would come up with the idea that Jesus was not a true human being, but the Second Person of the Trinity coming down to earth and pretended to be one of us. Yes, He was 100% God but He was only taking on the appearance of being human. Therefore. He pretended to die on the Cross. This idea came about because those who pushed it could not understand how Jesus could be God and die on the Cross. Many churches still believe this heresy, and that is not all, even today, there are groups that have come up with wrong ideas as to how they explain the Blessed Trinity. Some believe that Jesus is not God but a saint or someone very special that was given the gift of eternal life because He sacrificed His life for us.

What is the true orthodox teaching of the Church held by Roman Catholics, Eastern Orthodox and Mainstream Protestants? There is One God who exists in Three Divine Persons: The Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit. Each Divine Person is equally God; each Divine Person is a facet of the one and only true God. Wow, what does it mean for us? It means a great deal, but it is not easy to understand totally in this life. I hope

that we will understand more in the next life, when we see God face to face, and experience the One God in Three Divine Persons. There is one trait that this great mystery of faith reveals to us, and that is that God exists in a loving relationship of the Three Persons. In fact, we believe that this great love between the Father and the Son, is that which generates the Holy Spirit. It is this love, which is the force behind all of creation including us. How did we learn about the Blessed Trinity? We learned about it in many ways and one way was from Jesus, Himself. Jesus was always speaking about His unique relationship with the Father. He spoke of how He and the Father were one. Jesus spoke about how He and the Father would send the Holy Spirit upon the Church to continue on His work. We also know about the Blessed Trinity through the power, grace, and working of the Holy Spirit in the Church.

Fr. Mike's Letter for Week 62 of the Corona Virus Crisis

The following letter was posted last week, prior to the Pentecost Sunday, on the St. Edward's website as well as on Flocknote.

This weekend we celebrate the great feast of Pentecost, the last day of the Easter Season. Ten days ago, we celebrated the Ascension of Jesus into heaven, and before He was taken from the sight of the Apostles, He told them to remain in Jerusalem until they received the Holy Spirit. After that they were to go out to all the nations, proclaim the Good News, and baptize in the Name of the Father, and the Son, and the Holy Spirit. They had already seen and experienced a great deal, but they could not fully make sense of it until God the Holy Spirit came upon them and the rest of the Church. As you know, we call Pentecost the birthday of the Church, because it is in the sending of the Holy Spirit that we the Church are empowered to carry out Christ's mission and the Apostles' mission.

We of course receive the Holy Spirit into our souls through the Sacraments of Baptism, and we are completely fed by Jesus in the Eucharist so we can remain strong in our faith and open to all Jesus wants to share with us. We receive the fullness of the Divine Gifts of the Holy Spirit through the Sacrament of Confirmation. It is through the three Sacraments of Initiation that we grow closer and closer to Christ and the Father. This is our birthday too, as we are all the members of the Body of Christ and He is one with us. Let us celebrate these great gifts.

As we read from the *Treatise Against the Heresies*, by *St. Irenaeus* Christ promised, "through the prophets that in these last days, he will pour out his Spirit on his servants ... and that they will prophesy. So, when the Son of God became the Son of Man, the Spirit also descended upon him, becoming accustomed in this way to dwelling with the human race ... inhabiting God's creation. The Spirit accomplished the Father's will in us and gave us new life in Christ." As St. Irenaeus continues, God gave us, "The Spirit of wisdom and understanding, the Spirit of counsel and strength, the Spirit of knowledge and the fear of God". This Spirit came down upon the Lord Jesus and in turn He gave the Spirit to the Church.

So Happy Birthday! As you noticed, the ropes in the Church have been removed as we are now allowed to be at 100% capacity, but not without some limits. Masks must still be worn in the Church, and we are still asked to maintain social distancing (use your common sense, if you are a pew with someone who is not living in your household, leave some space between the two of you). We still are not able to put out Holy Water in the founts, nor can we use worship aides (missalettes). Hopefully, they will come back soon. Keep praying for a return to normalcy, but God willing, it will be a normalcy that is better informed and one which we do not take things for granted.

Happy Pentecost, and for the last time this year... Happy Easter!

Work on the Church Plaza

"As many of you know, the plaza in front of the church entrance is starting to show its age. Many cracks and holes have appeared, and some of the individual bricks and cement are starting to rise in places. In addition, we have been informed that the small walk ramp on the north side of the plaza does not meet code and has to be removed. All in all it has become a tripping problem especially during inclement weather. We have contracted with a firm to replace the existing cement plaza with a new one that will enhance the appearance and which will avoid potential hazardous Construction will begin during the week of June 21 and is expected to take approximately five days. During that time, access to the church will be through the side entrances. We expect to have it completed before the weekend Masses on June 26 & 27. The funds for this project will come from our Capital Campaign account, however, if you would like to make a donation it will be gratefully appreciated and can be dropped off at the rectory."

Pope Francis: Your prayers are being heard, do not give up!

During his Wednesday General Audience this past week, Pope Francis said: "There is a radical objection to prayer, which derives from an observation that we all make: we pray, we ask, and yet sometimes our prayers seem to go unheard: what we have asked for - for ourselves or for others - is not fulfilled". When we pray, stressed the Pope, "we can give in to the risk of not being the ones to serve God, but of expecting Him to serve us". The Pope then went on to say that "the Apostle Paul reminds us that we do not even know what it is appropriate to ask for". What we do know, however, when we pray, is that "we need to be humble, so that our words are actually prayers and not just idle talk that God rejects". Pray sincerely, and trust in Him.




