As the day was drawing to a close, the Twelve approached him and said, "Dismiss the crowd so that they can go to the surrounding villages and farms and find lodging and provisions; for we are in a deserted place here." He said to them, "Give them some food yourselves." They replied, "Five loaves and two fish are all we have, unless we ourselves go and buy food for all these people." Now the men there numbered about five thousand. Then he said to his disciples, "Have them sit down in groups of about fifty." They did so and made them all sit down. Then taking the five loaves and the two fish, and looking up to heaven, he said the blessing over them, broke them, and gave them to the disciples to set before the crowd. They all ate and were satisfied. And when the leftover fragments were picked up, they filled twelve wicker baskets.

Next Week's Readings

First Reading - 1 Kings 19:16b, 19-21 Psalms 16:1-2, 5, 7-8, 9-10, 11 Second Reading - Galatians 5:1, 13-18 Gospel - Luke 9:51-62

From Fr. Mike's Desk

"Brothers and sisters: I received from the Lord what I also handed on to you, that the Lord Jesus, on the night he was handed over, took bread, and after he had given thanks, broke it and said, 'This is my body that is for you. Do this in remembrance of me.' In the same way also the cup after supper saying: 'This cup is the new covenant in my blood...'" These words from Saint Paul's First **Letter to the Corinthians**, were the same words we heard read on Holy Thursday night at the Mass of the Lord's Supper. On that night we remembered the institution of the Eucharist and the Priesthood. We remembered how Jesus at that holy meal took the bread and wine of the Passover and changed their meaning forever. They were no longer linked to the Passover Lamb of the exodus but were forever linked to the Sacrifice of the Cross carried out by Jesus, the Lamb of God. We recall how the Passover of old set a people free from physical slavery, and now the new Passover sets all people free from the spiritual slavery of sin, death, and darkness.

Today we celebrate the Solemnity of the Body and Blood of Christ, as we focus on another major mystery of our faith and how Christ is truly present in the Blessed Sacrament. While we may not know how the bread and wine are transformed into the Body and Blood of Christ, we do know that it happens through the power and grace of the Holy Spirit. As was noted, the second reading for today is the same we listened to at the Mass of the Lord's Supper, we must also note that the Gospel on Holy Thursday was different. On that night, we heard from John's Gospel, and we centered in on the Washing of the Feet. If you recall, Peter refused to allow Jesus to wash his feet, however, he changed his mind, when Jesus told him that if his feet were not washed, he could not share in Christ's ministry. So, Peter allowed it and then Jesus told Peter and the others, that He was providing them with an example for them to follow. Thus, the Church is to be in service to the world and wash the feet of one another and provide for the hungry, the homeless, and all that the Gospel calls us to do. We are not to fear, because Christ feeds us with His Body and His Blood. Today's Gospel from Luke tells us of the Miracle of the Loaves and Fish, which is a foreshadowing of what Jesus would do at the Last Supper. It is a sign of what life will be like in the Kingdom. It is also a sign of what life is like on this side of the Kingdom, as Christ lovingly feeds us with the Eucharist until we are all in heaven.

The Lord's Supper also reminds us that the food Christ provides us with, is Christ Himself, and that is totally what we celebrate today.

Over the past three years we have been confronted with the effects of COVID. Every time we think we have it beat; it shows up again vigorously. It has brought so many changes to how we live our lives that we do not know what is normal anymore. Yet, we should not allow COVID to totally rule our lives. Yes, we must do everything we know is right to stop the spread and protect us from getting it, but we can not allow it to affect every aspect of our lives. One of the areas most effected (for many) is the practice of our faith. So many are not coming to celebrate the Sacrifice of the Mass in person. I know that many are still cautious, and we do not want to force anyone to do what they feel they should not. So, yes keep watching on the internet (and we will keep broadcasting), but keep in mind this is not as good as attending the Mass in person. Some may have fallen out of the routine of coming to Mass every week, and this has become the new normal. Please try to change this, because in the Mass ,Jesus offers us His Body and Blood so we can have life. He feeds us with His very self so we can live out the Gospel and enter the Kingdom. We cannot be nearer to Him if we are not personally at the celebration. Now, is a great time to start coming back, we need you, and we all need each other to gather so we can give Glory and Praise. Jesus did not suggest that we come together every week, no He commanded us to gather. Not for His sake, but for ours.

On behalf of the entire Parish Staff of St. Edward's we wish all our Fathers a Happy Fathers' Day, and we ask God's blessing on them and their families.

The Saint Joseph Prayer Group



Come pray the **Rosary** and **Chaplet of Divine Mercy** every Thursday night at 7:30 PM in the church. The men and women of the Saint Joseph Prayer Group have been meeting each week for over a year, praying what Pope St. John Paul II called "an exquisitely contemplative prayer". According to tradition, the Blessed Virgin Mary has related to us 15 promises to those who pray the Rosary devoutly. During our prayers this week we will keep in mind the fifth promise, which is:

The soul which recommends itself to me by the recitation of the Rosary, shall not perish.

Contemplate on this promise and consider what it means for your eternal soul.

Liturgy of the Hours

This week we continue our introduction to the Liturgy of the Hours, the official prayer of the Catholic Church. During the past two weeks we have touched upon the two 'hinge hours', lauds (morning prayer) and vespers (evening prayer). This week will we review the Office of Readings (matins) which is one of the Major hours. Typically, this is the longest of the five Canonical hours, and consists of the opening versicle (or invitatory), hymn, several psalms, a passage from Scripture and at times a patristic or magisterial passage, all of which are followed by a concluding prayer. According to the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops, ""The office of readings seeks to provide God's people, and in particular those consecrated to God in a special way, with a wider selection of passages from sacred Scripture for meditation, together with the finest excerpts from spiritual writers. Even though the cycle of scriptural readings at daily Mass is now richer, the treasures of revelation and tradition to be found in the office of readings will also contribute greatly to the spiritual life".

Let's start with a look at the invitatory. The invitatory is a psalm used to start us in prayer. Most often it is Psalm 95, also known as the Venite. The first two lines of this psalm are: "Come, let us sing for joy to the Lord; let us shout aloud to the Rock of our salvation. Let us come before him with thanksgiving and extol him with music and song". This Psalm seeks to put us in the right frame of mind, one in which we sing and shout about the Lord, and go before Him giving thanks and praise.

Next is the versicle, which is a short petition, an example of which would be: "Lord, open my lips. And my mouth will proclaim your praise" (Ps 50/51 v.17). Once again, recitation of this phrase from the Psalm asks God to free up our 'voice', so we can properly proclaim His goodness.

Taken together, the invitatory and versicle open our hearts and minds so that we are best prepared to hear the Word of God, leading us further into the spirit of conversion, and aligning us with His will.
