

Gospel – Mark 4:35-41

On that day, as evening drew on, Jesus said to his disciples: "Let us cross to the other side." Leaving the crowd, they took Jesus with them in the boat just as he was. And other boats were with him. A violent squall came up and waves were breaking over the boat, so that it was already filling up. Jesus was in the stern, asleep on a cushion. They woke him and said to him, "Teacher, do you not care that we are perishing?" He woke up, rebuked the wind, and said to the sea, "Quiet! Be still!" The wind ceased and there was great calm. Then he asked them, "Why are you terrified? Do you not yet have faith?" They were filled with great awe and said to one another, "Who then is this whom even wind and sea obey?"

Prayer to St. Michael

St. Michael the Archangel, defend us in battle, be our protection against the wickedness and snares of the devil. May God rebuke him we humbly pray; and do thou, O Prince of the Heavenly host, by the power of God, cast into hell Satan and all the evil spirits who prowl about the world seeking the ruin of souls. From Fr. Mike's Desk

Last week Jesus told the gathered crowds and the Apostles two parables which deal with the sowing of seed, how the seed grows and how the farmer does not know how any of it happens. Jesus then mentioned the mustard seed which grows into a large bush and the birds of the air build their nest in it. The parable with the seed compares to the Kingdom or Reign of God, and no matter what mankind does or fails to do, it will still appear, but we are better off if we cooperate with God. If we do this, we will help be co-creators of the Kingdom. This leads us to the mustard seed which grows into a big bush which represents the Church, which grows so large, so it can do its part to establish the Reign of God.

After Jesus is done speaking, Mark tells us that He and the Apostles go across the Sea of Galilee, and Jesus is so tired that He falls asleep in the stern of the boat on a cushion. In the middle of their passage a sudden violent windstorm comes over the sea and it is tossing the boat which begins to take on water. The Apostles filled with fear, wake Jesus up and plead with Him to help. Within moments Jesus commands the wind and the waves to be calm and silent. After He does this, Jesus asks the Apostles, "Why are you terrified? Do you not yet have faith?" Now, it is not unusual for Jesus to carryout a miracle right after giving a major discourse, but there is more behind the miracle of the Calming of The Sea.

As we saw in the first parable last week, the Reign of God belongs not to humanity, but to God, and nothing we can do will stop its progress, and it proceeds according to God's will not ours. This week we are reminded that only God has command over the forces of nature, and the very fact that

Jesus can command them, signifies who He truly is. Notice Jesus uses the same words to calm the sea that He used to drive out the demon from the man in the synagogue ("Quiet! Be still!"). Jesus came to the man's aid with these words, He came to the Apostles aid with the same words, and yes, He comes to our aid with these words. Jesus is always present to us, He is always with us and the story of the boat on the stormy sea, is the same story of us in our sometimes-stormy lives. If we listen with our hearts, we can hear Jesus telling us be quiet, be still.

Now I am giving you an assignment. Why is it so important for Mark to point out that Jesus is resting on a cushion, in the boat's stern? There is a meaning behind it, and if you look at the other Gospels account of this miracle, they do not mention this. The answer will be given next week!

On the Cross, Jesus Prayed for Each of Us

During his general audience this past Wednesday, Pope Francis concludes a long series of catechetical lessons on "prayer," focusing on the priestly prayer of Jesus. Pope Francis said "the most beautiful thing to remember" is "the grace that we do not only pray, but that, so to speak, we have been 'prayed for,' we have already been received in Jesus's dialogue with the Father, in communion with the Holy Spirit." He went on to say that "Prayer...is one of the most evident features in Jesus' life... because the dialogue with the Father was the incandescent core of His whole existence." Jesus' prayer, the Pope said, "is intense, the prayer of Jesus is unique and also becomes the model for our prayer." Pope Francis insisted, "Jesus prayed for everyone, He also prayed for me, for each one of you. Each one of us can say: 'Jesus prayed for me on the Cross.' He prayed. Jesus can say to each one of us: 'I prayed for you, at the Last Supper, and on the wood of the Cross."



May God bless these children who received the Eucharist for the first time this May and June.


