

## **Thirteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time**

#### Reading 1 - 1 Kings 19:16b,19-21

The LORD said to Elijah: "You shall anoint Elisha, son of Shaphat of Abelmeholah, as prophet to succeed you."

Elijah set out and came upon Elisha, son of Shaphat, as he was plowing with twelve yoke of oxen; he was following the twelfth. Elijah went over to him and threw his cloak over him. Elisha left the oxen, ran after Elijah, and said, "Please, let me kiss my father and mother goodbye, and I will follow you." Elijah answered, "Go back! Have I done anything to you?" Elisha left him, and taking the yoke of oxen, slaughtered them; he used the plowing equipment for fuel to boil their flesh, and gave it to his people to eat. Then Elisha left and followed Elijah as his attendant.

#### Reading 2 - Galatians 5:1, 13-18

Brothers and sisters:

For freedom Christ set us free; so stand firm and do not submit again to the yoke of slavery.

For you were called for freedom, brothers and sisters. But do not use this freedom as an opportunity for the flesh; rather, serve one another through love. For the whole law is fulfilled in one statement, namely, *You shall love your neighbor as yourself.*  But if you go on biting and devouring one another, beware that you are not consumed by one another.

I say, then: live by the Spirit and you will certainly not gratify the desire of the flesh. For the flesh has desires against the Spirit, and the Spirit against the flesh; these are opposed to each other, so that you may not do what you want. But if you are guided by the Spirit, you are not under the law.

#### **Gospel - Luke 9:51-62**

When the days for Jesus' being taken up were fulfilled, he resolutely determined to journey to Jerusalem, and he sent messengers ahead of him. On the way they entered a Samaritan village to prepare for his reception there, but they would not welcome him because the destination of his journey was Jerusalem. When the disciples James and John saw this they asked, "Lord, do you want us to call down fire from heaven to consume them?" Jesus turned and rebuked them, and they journeyed to another village.

As they were proceeding on their journey someone said to him, "I will follow you wherever you go." Jesus answered him, "Foxes have dens and birds of the sky have nests, but the Son of Man has nowhere to rest his head."

And to another he said, "Follow me." But he replied, "Lord, let me go first and bury my father." But he answered him, "Let the dead bury their dead. But you, go and proclaim the kingdom of God." And another said, "I will follow you, Lord, but first let me say farewell to my family at home." To him Jesus said, "No one who sets a hand to the plow and looks to what was left behind is fit for the kingdom of God."

## From Fr. Mike's Desk

For the past two weeks we have been in Ordinary Time, however, during the past two weekends we have been celebrating Solemnities of the Lord featuring Trinity Sunday and The Body and Blood of Our Lord, Jesus Christ. Well, this weekend we now return to normal (so to speak). Today we celebrate the 13<sup>th</sup> Sunday of Ordinary Time, picking us up were we left off just before Ash Wednesday, but just so you know we left off with the 8<sup>th</sup> Sunday and today we are taking up with the 13<sup>th</sup>, don't ask! Today's first reading and the gospel reading have a lot to do with being called, or desire to be added, and the seriousness of commitment.

In the reading from the First Book of Kings, the great prophet Elijah comes up to a young man named Elisha who was plowing, most likely his father's field with 12 yokes of oxen. Elijah went to Elisha and threw his cloak over him, as a sign that he was chosen by God. Elisha, caught by surprise, asked the prophet if he could go and say goodbye to his parents. With that, Elijah tells the young man to go back (as if he were not worthy of the task), so Elisha decides not to go back and immediately follows the prophet and will become his successor. Notice that Elisha did not say no to Elijah, he just wanted to say goodbye to his family and, his old way of life. It may seem cruel, but when God calls, He cannot be put on hold. That is why Elijah told the young man to go back, but deep down he knew that God chose Elisha to be his follower.

This takes us to today's Gospel where Jesus shows us two types of commitment! The first is His sense of commitment to the mission. Our Lord, (as Luke tells us) was making the final and faithful journey to Jerusalem from Galilee. He sent word to a certain Samaritan village asking them to provide for His overnight needs. The people did not agree because, while they liked Him, He was going on to Jerusalem and not paying attention to them. This, of course, was not the case. We are told that James and John asked Jesus whether they should call down fire from heaven to consume the village. Jesus told them no, because that is not the mission He is on. The Kingdom of God is to be established by a commitment to peace, love, mercy, and compassion, not destruction.

This brings us to the other type of commitment, ours! Notice how three people came up to Jesus or were approached by Jesus and they had answers that Jesus dismissed. One asks to follow Jesus, but He told him that there was no resting place, or home and with that he went away. The other person told Jesus that he had to go bury his father first. Jesus gives him the famous answer, let the dead bury the dead, but join us and proclaim the good news. As it has been pointed out, the man's father was not yet dead, nor was he expected to die soon. The man could not follow Jesus while his parents were still alive. Finally, the last person said the same thing that Elisha said and wanted to say goodbye to his family. Jesus answers him with, "No one who sets a hand to the plow and looks to what is left behind is fit for the kingdom of God."

To be a disciple means never to look back but always forward. Now you may say, well I am glad I decided not to become a disciple because I do not know if I can keep such a commitment. Well, I hate to tell you, actually, I love to tell you, that you and I, and every Christian are disciples. And every Christian must make the commitment, or we are just fooling ourselves, and we will not be able to follow our Baptismal Promises. The challenges placed before us are different from the first century, but in some ways, they are the same. If we wish to obtain the Kingdom of God in heaven, we must strive to create it here on earth. And we do it by following Jesus to the best of our abilities and gifts. Pray about it and make discipleship your everyday life.

What did Jesus mean by saying "the Son of Man has nowhere to rest His head"? Jesus was telling those who said they would follow him anywhere that there is a cost to following Him, and asking them to consider the lifestyle that Jesus led. Our Lord was functionally homeless; He and His disciples stayed in the homes of those who would take them in (see Luke 10:6–8). It was as if Jesus were saying, "Are you sure you want to be homeless with Me?" The fact that Jesus had nowhere to lay His head does not mean that every Christian today is called to live a life of poverty or forsake family and friends and become homeless. But every Christian should be willing to forsake all. Every believer is called to give up any idol that stands in the way of following Christ wholeheartedly. In reflecting upon your own life, would you be willing to forsake all?

## Liturgy of the Hours



Over the past several weeks we have gone over most of the major Canonical hours of the Liturgy of the Hours, the official prayer of the Catholic Church. The only major hour remaining to discuss is Daytime Prayer, which can be prayed at Midmorning, Midday, or Midafternoon. The United States Conference of Catholic Bishops elaborates on Daytime Prayer by saying: "Following a very ancient tradition Christians have made a practice of praying out of private devotion at various times of the day, even in the

course of their work, in imitation of the Church in apostolic times. In different ways with the passage of time this tradition has taken the form of a liturgical celebration. Liturgical custom in both East and West has retained midmorning, midday, and midafternoon prayer, mainly because these hours were linked to a commemoration of the events of the Lord's passion and of the first preaching of the Gospel".

How often do you take time out during the daytime hours to stop and pray? Sometimes? Rarely? Ever? Maybe consider adding this to your routine, a little at a time. Doesn't God deserve to hear your voice? He is always listening.


