Sixteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time

Reading 1 - Genesis 18:20-32

In those days, the LORD said: "The outcry against Sodom and Gomorrah is so great, and their sin so grave, that I must go down and see whether or not their actions fully correspond to the cry against them that comes to me. I mean to find out."

While Abraham's visitors walked on farther toward Sodom, the LORD remained standing before Abraham. Then Abraham drew nearer and said: "Will you sweep away the innocent with the guilty? Suppose there were fifty innocent people in the city; would you wipe out the place, rather than spare it for the sake of the fifty innocent people within it? Far be it from you to do such a thing, to make the innocent die with the guilty so that the innocent and the guilty would be treated alike! Should not the judge of all the world act with justice?" The LORD replied, "If I find fifty innocent people in the city of Sodom, I will spare the whole place for their sake." Abraham spoke up again: "See how I am presuming to speak to my Lord, though I am but dust and ashes! What if there are five less than fifty innocent people? Will you destroy the whole city because of those five?" He answered, "I will not destroy it, if I find forty-five there." But Abraham persisted, saying "What if only forty are found there?" He replied, "I will forbear doing it for the sake of the forty." Then Abraham said, "Let not my Lord grow impatient if I go on. What if only thirty are found there?" He replied, "I will forbear doing it if I can find but thirty there." Still Abraham went on, "Since I have thus dared to speak to my Lord, what if there are no more than twenty?" The LORD answered, "I will not destroy it, for the sake of the twenty." But he still persisted: "Please, let not my Lord grow angry if I speak up this last time. What if there are at least ten there?" He replied, "For the sake of those ten, I will not destroy it."

Reading 2 - Colossians 2:12-14

Brothers and sisters:

You were buried with him in baptism, in which you were also raised with him through faith in the power of God, who raised him from the dead. And even when you were dead in transgressions and the uncircumcision of your flesh, he brought you to life along with him, having forgiven us all our transgressions; obliterating the bond against us, with its legal claims, which was opposed to us, he also removed it from our midst, nailing it to the cross.

Gospel - Luke 11:1-13

Jesus was praying in a certain place, and when he had finished, one of his disciples said to him, "Lord, teach us to pray just as John taught his disciples." He said to them, "When you pray, say: Father, hallowed be your name, your kingdom come. Give us each day our daily bread and forgive us our sins for we ourselves forgive everyone in debt to us, and do not subject us to the final test."

And he said to them, "Suppose one of you has a friend to whom he goes at midnight and says, 'Friend, lend me three loaves of bread, for a friend of mine has arrived at my house from a journey and I have nothing to offer him,' and he says in reply from within, 'Do not bother me; the door has already been locked and my children and I are already in bed. I cannot get up to give you anything.' I tell you, if he does not get up to give the visitor the loaves because of their friendship, he will get up to give him whatever he needs because of his persistence.

"And I tell you, ask and you will receive; seek and you will find; knock and the door will be opened to you. For everyone who asks, receives; and the one who seeks, finds; and to the one who knocks, the door will be opened. What father among you would hand his son a snake when he asks for a fish? Or hand him a scorpion when he asks for an egg? If you then, who are wicked, know how to give good gifts to your children, how much more will the Father in heaven give the Holy Spirit to those who ask him?"

From Fr. Mike's Desk

"Then Abraham drew near and said: 'Will you sweep away the innocent with the guilty?'... 'Should not the judge of all the world act with justice?'... Abraham spoke up again: 'See how I am presuming to speak to my Lord'...still Abraham went on, 'Since I have thus dared to speak to my Lord'... 'Please let not my Lord grow angry if I speak up this last time.' "...one of His disciples said to him, 'Lord, teach us to pray...He said to them, 'When you pray say: Father, hallowed be your name..."

Abraham, the disciples, and Jesus are saying the same thing in this week's reading. Correction, they are doing the same thing, they are praying! Abraham in his persistence is praying to God asking Him to spare the innocent in Sodom and Gomorrah. Each time he asks God to spare the innocent, from 50 to 45, to 40, all the way down to ten, he is praying to God making his petitions and asking God to act with justice and mercy. Jesus tells those who are asking Him how to pray, what are the proper words to use which will fulfill all our needs and every type of prayer.

Why do we pray? Prayer is crucial to our relationship with God and with one another. As we see from Abraham's conversation with God; we should not be afraid to speak to God. In prayer, we get to know God and what God wants for us, and it helps us to truly know who we are, and what we are all about. Prayer can help us totally surrender ourselves to God and help us to free ourselves from the distractions of this world. Jesus' answer in the Gospel tells us that we should consider prayer as the most important activity of our life. Prayer gives us the insight and the ability to do everything that really matters. Still very few of us approach prayer in this manner, and there are times we purposely turn away from prayer.

This usually happens when we realize that we have not been the best person we can be. When we feel we cannot talk to God because of our short comings, or believe God will not listen to us, we might think, so why bother. So, what should we do when we find ourselves in these situations? **Pray, Pray, and Pray again,** that is the solution to these situations. When we have sinned or failed in life, these are the most important times to pray. We should not allow guilt or any other feelings to get in our way. These are times when we need to feel God's presence the most. Pray because God will forgive you. He already has, but we need to know and feel His forgiveness. Pray because God loves us and all He wants to do is free us from sin and heal

us. Pray because God wants to raise you to a better life.

What should we do when we believe that God is not answering our prayers? Should we keep praying or just give up? Of course, the answer is keep praying. Keep praying because God does hear and answer our prayers, maybe not with the answer we want or expect, but God does answer every prayer. We realize this when we employ a very necessary element, time! Time allows us to see God's solution. This is true even when the unthinkable happens. How can I keep praying when prayer does not seem to be fruitful or give me that same peace of mind it offered before? This would appear to be a bad situation; however, it is not. It is not because this dryness indicates many times that our spiritual life is growing. These growing pains tell us that the prayer that used to work is no longer enough. The following will explain this predicament. When we were younger, we learned to ride a tricycle, and we did so with great joy until we moved on to a bicycle with training wheels. Then one day we no longer needed the training wheels, and we could ride the bike faster and totally by ourselves. We were content with the bike until we learned how to drive a car. As it happens in this example, so it does with our spiritual life. Therefore, we need to find what type and style of prayer will help us in our current station and circumstances in our life. We cannot discover new ways of prayer without praying about and asking God what direction we should go. We also need the guidance of a spiritual advisor. When we are indeed open to this, we will grow in our spiritual life and soon our prayer will be more fruitful. There are several types of prayer, and we will look at this next week.








Sacristan Needed for Weekend Masses


