He said to them, "The harvest is abundant but the laborers are few; so ask the master of the harvest to send out laborers for his harvest. Go on your way; behold, I am sending you like lambs among wolves. Carry no money bag, no sack, no sandals; and greet no one along the way. Into whatever house you enter, first say, 'Peace to this household.' If a peaceful person lives there, your peace will rest on him; but if not, it will return to you. Stay in the same house and eat and drink what is offered to you, for the laborer deserves his payment. Do not move about from one house to another. Whatever town you enter and they welcome you, eat what is set before you, cure the sick in it and say to them, 'The kingdom of God is at hand for you.' Whatever town you enter and they do not receive you, go out into the streets and say, 'The dust of your town that clings to our feet, even that we shake off against you.' Yet know this: the kingdom of God is at hand. I tell you, it will be more tolerable for Sodom on that day than for that town."

The seventy-two returned rejoicing, and said, "Lord, even the demons are subject to us because of your name." Jesus said, "I have observed Satan fall like lightning from the sky. Behold, I have given you the power to 'tread upon serpents' and scorpions and upon the full force of the enemy and nothing will harm you. Nevertheless, do not rejoice because the spirits are subject to you, but rejoice because your names are written in heaven."

From Fr. Mike's Desk

By the year 1776 there had been a number of military engagements between British Soldiers and American patriots. King George III had declared the colonies to be in a state of rebellion, and more troops were on the way. On April 12th, North Carolina authorized its delegates to the Second Continental Congress to cooperate with other colonies who might advocate independence. On June 7th, Virginia's Richard Henry Lee proposed, "that these United Colonies are, and or right ought to be free and independent states." Despite opposition from conservatives who did not agree with independence (at least at that time), June 11th saw the creation of a committee to draft a declaration for independence. On that committee were: John Adams, Benjamin Franklin, Thomas Jefferson, Roger Sherman, and New York's Robert Livingston. The declaration was to explain to the world the legal and moral reasons why America should be a free and independent nation; according to the political thought of the 1700's. Thomas Jefferson's thoughts and style are seen in the completed document, and he details all of the ways the king violated the social contract with the people of the colonies, and as a result of this the colonies must separate from Great Britain.

The document became known as the Declaration of Independence and it concludes with the following announcement on independence, "We, therefore, the Representatives of the United States of America, in General Congress Assembled, appealing to the Supreme Judge of the world for the rectitude of our intentions do, in the Name and by the Authority of good People of the Colonies, solemnly publish and decree, that these United Colonies are, and of right ought to be Free And Independent States; that they are Absolved from all Allegiance to the British Crown, and that all political connection between them and the State of Great Britain is and ought to be totally dissolved." On July 2nd, Congress approved Lee's resolution and cleared the way for the adoption of the Declaration by 12 Colonies on July 4, 1776. New York abstained, but later by July 15th received instructions to sign it and all 13 Colonies signed the document that gave birth to our beloved country.

As all the delegates could not wait to sign the Declaration of Independence, Jesus tells us today, that there is something greater than having your name attached to this historic document. As Jesus tells the seventy-two on their return; "Behold, I

have given you the power to tread upon serpents and scorpions and upon the full force of the enemy and nothing will harm you. Nevertheless, do not rejoice because spirits are subject to you, but rejoice because your names are written in heaven." Their names were written in heaven, because they were following Christ and carrying on the mission of Salvation. As it was for the twelve and the seventy-two, so it is for each of us. Jesus personally sent out the twelve and the seventy-two, and likewise He personally sends you and me. When? Well that happened the day of our Baptism, and we were further encouraged the day we received our First Communion, and each time after that, and when we were fully gifted, the day we were confirmed. The seventy-two had the ability to cast out demons, heal the sick, and they were granted this individually and communally through the Church by the power and grace of the Holy Spirit.

As we celebrate America's 246th Birthday tomorrow, we celebrate all the good things that our country stands for. We are also remembering on this 14th Sunday of Ordinary Time all that Jesus calls us to do to make the world a better place. So much of what our Founding Fathers wanted for this new nation, Jesus wants for all humanity. So much of what we have struggled to build here, God wants us to build not only here in America, but in the entire world through His Universal Church.

Let us pray for our nation and our world: Father of the family of nations, open our hearts to greater love of your Son. Grant that the boundaries of nations will not set limits to our love and give us courage to build a land that serves you in truth and justice. We ask this through Christ our Lord. Amen.

Liturgy of the Hours



For the past several weeks we have gone over the various prayer times of the Liturgy of the Hours, and summarized their meaning and purpose, so as to encourage the faithful to incorporate at least some of the prayers into their daily lives. But it must be acknowledged that undertaking even part of the daily prayers can be daunting. Questions arise such as: where do I start, or, how can I be consistent? As with most new endeavors, the simple way is usually the best.

If you are single, begin with just Morning or Evening Prayer. Are you up early but can spare a couple of minutes? Then Morning Prayer can help get your day off to a good start. If you're a night owl, then you can most likely find some time for Evening Prayer.

For parents with children, make Evening (bedtime) prayer part of your 'family time'. As parents, if you find yourselves very busy, then take turns, with Dad leading the children in prayer one night, and Mom leading them the next. The need for families to pray together is important not only so that children might grow up in an atmosphere of prayer and devotion, but also because through prayer a family can find nourishment for its faith and strength for its unity.

And for couples, whether married or not, find the time together that works for both of you. If you can be together for breakfast, lunch or dinner, then include the respective prayer 'Hour' into something you do together. If apart, promise to pray at a specific time together.
