Reading 2 – Ephesians 1:3-14

Blessed be the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, who has blessed us in Christ with every spiritual blessing in the heavens, as he chose us in him, before the foundation of the world, to be holy and without blemish before him. In love he destined us for adoption to himself through Jesus Christ, in accord with the favor of his will, for the praise of the glory of his grace that he granted us in the beloved. In him we have redemption by his blood, the forgiveness of transgressions, in accord with the riches of his grace that he lavished upon us. In all wisdom and insight, he has made known to us the mystery of his will in accord with his favor that he set forth in him as a plan for the fullness of times, to sum up all things in Christ, in heaven and on earth.

In him we were also chosen, destined in accord with the purpose of the One who accomplishes all things according to the intention of his will, so that we might exist for the praise of his glory, we who first hoped in Christ. In him you also, who have heard the word of truth, the gospel of your salvation, and have believed in him, were sealed with the promised holy Spirit, which is the first installment of our inheritance toward redemption as God’s possession, to the praise of his glory.

Gospel – Mark 6:7-13

Jesus summoned the Twelve and began to send them out two by two and gave them authority over unclean spirits. He instructed them to take nothing for the journey but a walking stick — no food, no sack, no money in their belts. They were, however, to wear sandals but not a second tunic. He said to them, *“Wherever you enter a house, stay there until you leave. Whatever place does not welcome you or listen to you, leave there and shake the dust off your feet in testimony against them.”* So they went off and preached repentance. The Twelve drove out many demons, and they anointed with oil many who were sick and cured them.

From Fr. Mike's Desk

“Blessed be the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, who has blessed us in Christ with every spiritual blessing in the heavens, as he chose us in him before the foundation of the world, to be holy and without blemish before him. If ever you feel down and out and think that God is not listening to you or does not seem to care, remember this opening part of Paul's Letter to the Ephesians. In this letter, which we will hear from for the next few weeks, Paul combines Jewish hopes and ideals with the whole mission of Jesus (which is to make these hopes and ideals true for the entire world). Christ's great mission, which brings salvation to us all, shows us the true love that God the Father has for us, by setting us free from sin and death. In Christ, as Paul tells us several times, there is no longer Jew or Greek, slave or free, even woman or man. No, for we are all one in Christ, and it is Christ who presents the whole human family to the Father.

Sometimes you hear the Gospel referred to as the **Good News**, for that is what the word Gospel means, and maybe sometimes you wondered what the Good News really is. Paul sums it up for us in this Letter as well as the other letters written in his name. As was quoted above, this belief in what the Father has done through Jesus is what gives the Apostles the ability to go forward, drive out evil spirits, preach repentance to others and help us all prepare to celebrate the new life gained for us. This is what Jesus sent them out to do two by two, and because they believed in Him, they were able to do it. This is also, what Jesus commands us to do and we can do even better than the Apostles because of Baptism and Confirmation. Moreover, because of these two sacraments, we will, or we should be able to carry out our mission even when people (even people whom we love) reject us. Keep in mind the Prophet Amos, (from our first reading) did not abandon his mission even when the priests of the Northern Kingdom ordered him to stop. God sent Amos to the people so hopefully they would change, but they did not, and soon the Assyrians destroyed them. Amos did what he was called to do, if the people would not listen that was their doing. The same is true for the people that God sends us to speak the Good News. Do not get down or frightened, just keep in mind Paul's letter.

Also, remember the 2021 Catholic Ministry Appeal we still have to raise more to meet our goal of \$105,500. When we meet our goal, we will receive a rebate over \$25,000, which will allow St. Edward's to preach the Good News to the people of Syosset. There is still time to donate to this very worthwhile appeal.

There is still available space in several grades of our beautiful St. Edward's School, and if you are considering a change in your child's or grandchild's education or if you know a friend who is looking for something different and better for their children consider a Catholic education. Fr. Mike's Letter for Week 68 of the Corona Virus Crisis

The following letter was posted last week, prior to The Fourteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time, on the St. Edward's website as well as on Flocknote.

Last weekend we remembered that date in July of 1776. On that day, a new nation came into the world, The United States of America. Two Hundred and Forty-Five years ago, those lands which were called the 13 British Colonies, became an independent nation. As you recall accounts of the steps that were taken over many years, you would realize that American Independence was not easy to secure and like many things, not everybody was for it! Our Lady of Mount Carmel



This coming Friday, July 16th, is the Feast Day of Our Lady of Mount Carmel. Our Lady of Mount Carmel, or Virgin of Carmel, is the title given to the Blessed Virgin Mary in her role as patroness of the Carmelite Order.

The first Carmelites were Christian hermits living on Mount Carmel in the Holy Land during the late 12th and early to mid-13th century. They built in the midst of their hermitages a chapel which they dedicated to the Blessed Virgin, whom they conceived of in chivalric terms as the "Lady of the place."

Since the 15th century, popular devotion to Our Lady of Mount Carmel has centered on the Scapular of Our Lady of Mount Carmel, also known as the Brown Scapular. Traditionally, Mary is said to have given the Scapular to an early Carmelite named Saint Simon Stock (1165-1265).

A tradition first attested to in the late 14th century says that Saint Simon Stock, believed to be an early English prior general of the Carmelite Order soon after its migration to England, had a vision of the Blessed Virgin Mary in which she gave him the Brown Scapular. This formed part of the Carmelite habit after 1287. In Stock's vision, Mary promised that those who died wearing the scapular would be saved. This is a devotional sacramental signifying the wearer's consecration to Mary and affiliation with the Carmelite order. It symbolizes her special protection and calls the wearers to consecrate themselves to her in a special way.

The Carmelites consider the Blessed Virgin Mary to be a perfect model of the interior life of prayer and contemplation to which Carmelites aspire, as well as a model of virtue, in the person who was closest in life to Jesus Christ. She is seen as the one who points Christians most surely to Christ. As she says to the servants at the wedding at Cana, "Do whatever he [Jesus] tells you." Carmelites look to the Virgin Mary as a Spiritual Mother. The Stella Maris Monastery (Star of the Sea) on Mount Carmel, named after a traditional title of the Blessed Virgin Mary, is considered the spiritual headquarters of the order.

Devotees of the Blessed Mother of Mount Carmel might raise petitions to her through this prayer:

O most beautiful flower of Mt. Carmel, fruitful vine, splendor of Heaven, Blessed Mother of the Son of God, Immaculate Virgin, assist me in my necessity. O Star of the Sea, help me and show me you are my Mother. O Holy Mary, Mother of God, Queen of Heaven and earth, I humbly beseech you from the bottom of my heart to succor me in this necessity (make request). There are none that can withstand your power. O Mary, conceived without sin, pray for us who have recourse to thee. Sweet Mother I place this cause in your hands. Amen.


