Sixteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time

Reading 1 - Genesis 18:1-10a

The LORD appeared to Abraham by the terebinth of Mamre, as he sat in the entrance of his tent, while the day was growing hot. Looking up, Abraham saw three men standing nearby. When he saw them, he ran from the entrance of the tent to greet them; and bowing to the ground, he said: "Sir, if I may ask you this favor, please do not go on past your servant. Let some water be brought, that you may bathe your feet, and then rest yourselves under the tree. Now that you have come this close to your servant, let me bring you a little food, that you may refresh yourselves; and afterward you may go on your way." The men replied, "Very well, do as you have said."

Abraham hastened into the tent and told Sarah, "Quick, three measures of fine flour! Knead it and make rolls." He ran to the herd, picked out a tender, choice steer, and gave it to a servant, who quickly prepared it. It is he whom we proclaim, admonishing everyone and teaching everyone with all wisdom, that we may present everyone perfect in Christ.

Jesus entered a village where a woman whose name was Martha welcomed him. She had a sister named Mary who sat beside the Lord at his feet listening to him speak. Martha, burdened with much serving, came to him and said, "Lord, do you not care that my sister has left me by myself to do the serving? Tell her to help me." The Lord said to her in reply, "Martha, Martha, you are anxious and worried about many things. There is need of only one thing. Mary has chosen the better part and it will not be taken from her."

From Fr. Mike's Desk

The unifying theme seen in our First Reading and our Gospel for this Sunday is hospitality. Hospitality is defined as a relationship between a guest and a host, and it means generously providing care and kindness to whoever is in need. In the Middle East, it was considered a norm that one would take care of strangers. One was to meet the needs of a traveler offering water to wash feet, food and drink and take care of the stranger's every need; even offering full protection. This is at work today when Abraham sees the three travelers coming his way. As we read this account, we realize that Abraham knows that one of these three visitors is God. Abraham gives his special guest his total attention, not only meeting their needs, but also listening to every word his guest spoke. Abraham engages in active listening to God.

Jesus on His way to Jerusalem, stops at the house of Martha and Mary, who offer Him hospitality, and they care more about their guest's needs than themselves. Well, Martha seems to care, because Mary is not doing anything but sitting at the feet of Jesus and listening to all He has to say. Martha is certainly no stranger to the Mid-East customs of hospitality, and she is determined to do her best for her special guest. One cannot blame her for getting upset with her sister, Mary, who is not helping her to put out her absolute best meal. But Martha was also neglecting the other part of hospitality, she was not listening. She was not giving her guest her undivided attention and Mary was. As she sat at the feet of Jesus, Mary listened to every word Jesus said, and as some commentators pointed out she sat at His feet like a male disciple and Jesus, of course, did not care. He did not care, because His word was for everyone, male or female, servant or free, Jew or Gentile. Even when Martha complains to Jesus, He will not tell Mary to stop. In fact, He is not correcting Martha either. He points out to her that listening to His word, the other part of hospitality, is also necessary.

This basic hospitality is what Jesus is asking of each of us. He is asking us to welcome Him into our home, not just our house or apartment, but into the home which is our soul. He, in fact, offers us hospitality every Sunday and weekday when we gather around the altar. He offers Himself to us in the Word and in the sharing of the Sacred Meal of the Eucharist, and we in turn offer our hospitality by accepting Him. Please do not waste this opportunity, do not fail to listen, and do not take it

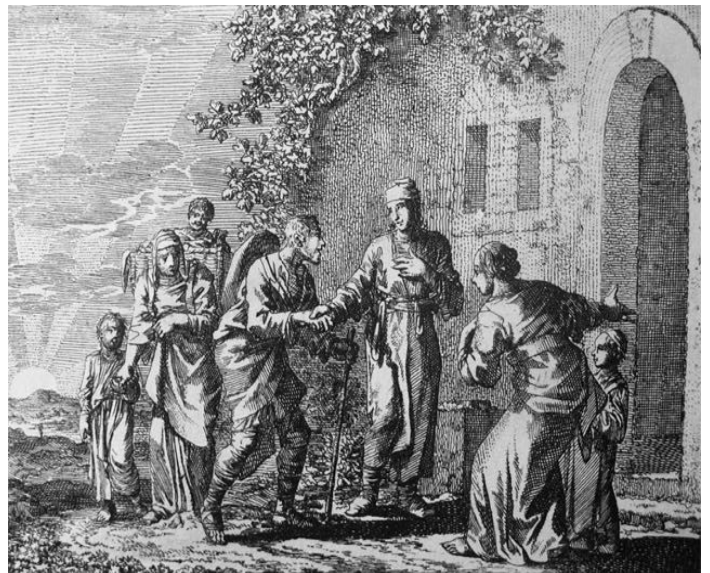
for granted (for there are many people around the world, even in this country who do not have Sunday Mass every week or the gift of daily Mass). Do not become complacent, otherwise we will indeed be inhospitable.

We close with the prayer from St. Martha's Feast Day, July 29th. Let us pray: Almighty ever-living God, whose Son was pleased to be welcomed in Saint Martha's house as a guest, grant we pray, that through her intercession, serving Christ faithfully in our brothers and sisters, we may merit to be received by you in the halls of heaven. Through our Lord Jesus Christ, Your Son who lives and reigns with You in the unity of the Holy Spirit, God for ever and ever. Amen

Our Lady of Mount Carmel



Our Lady of Mount Carmel, or Virgin of Carmel, is the title given to the Blessed Virgin Mary in her role as patroness of the Carmelite Order, particularly within the Catholic Church. The first Carmelites were Christian hermits living on Mount Carmel in the Holy Land during the late 12th and early to mid-13th century. They built in the midst of their hermitages a chapel which they dedicated to the Blessed Virgin, whom they conceived of in chivalric terms as the "Lady of the place." Our Lady of Mount Carmel was adopted in the 19th century as the patron saint of Chile.

Since the 15th century, popular devotion to Our Lady of Mount Carmel has centered on the Scapular of Our Lady of Mount Carmel, also known as the Brown Scapular. Traditionally, Mary is said to have given the Scapular to an early Carmelite named Saint Simon Stock (1165-1265). The liturgical feast of Our Lady of Mount Carmel is celebrated on 16 July.

The solemn liturgical feast of Our Lady of Mount Carmel was probably first celebrated in England in the later part of the 14th century. Its object was thanksgiving to Mary, the patroness of the Carmelite Order, for the benefits she had accorded to it through its difficult early years. The institution of the feast may have come in the wake of the vindication of their title "Brothers of the Blessed Virgin Mary" at Cambridge, England, in 1374. The date chosen was 17 July; on the European mainland this date conflicted with the feast of St. Alexis, requiring a shift to 16 July, which remains the Feast of Our Lady of Mount Carmel on the Roman Calendar of the Catholic Church. The Latin poem "*Flos Carmeli*" (meaning "Flower of Carmel") first appears as the sequence for this Mass.

A 1996 doctrinal statement approved by the Congregation for Divine Worship and the Discipline of the Sacraments states that - Devotion to Our Lady of Mount Carmel is bound to the history and spiritual values of the Order of the Brothers of the Blessed Virgin Mary of Mount Carmel and is expressed through the scapular. Thus, whoever receives the scapular becomes a member of the order and pledges him/herself to live according to its spirituality in accordance with the characteristics of his/her state in life.

Disalced Carmelite Fr. Kieran Kavanaugh summarizes this spirituality: The scapular is a Marian habit or garment. It is both a sign and pledge. A sign of belonging to Mary; a pledge of her motherly protection, not only in this life but after death. As a sign, it is a conventional sign signifying three elements strictly joined: first, belonging to a religious family particularly devoted to Mary, especially dear to Mary, the Carmelite Order; second, consecration to Mary, devotion to and trust in her Immaculate Heart; third, an urge to become like Mary by imitating her virtues, above all her humility, chastity, and spirit of prayer.

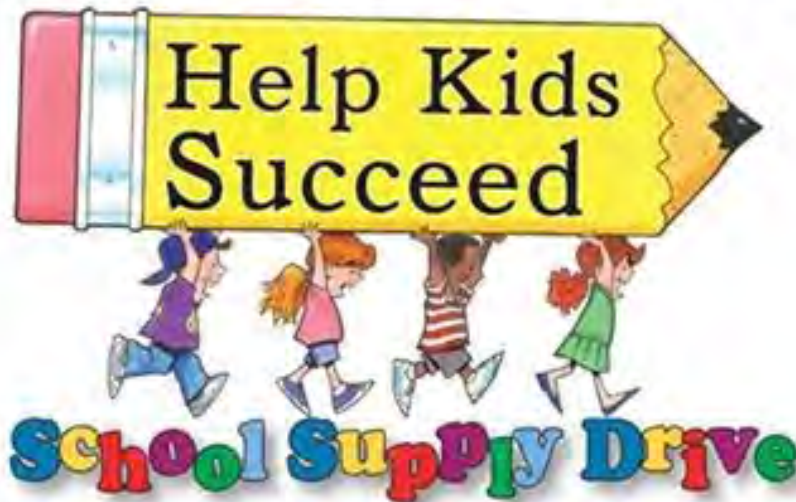

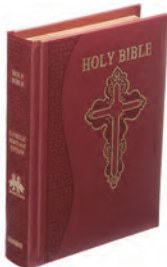
