From Fr. Mike's Desk

Prayer is a form of religious practice that seeks a connection to some greater power. Prayer may be individual or communal and it may invoke the use of words or song. Most major religions invoke prayer in one way or another. Prayer can be words of supplication, thanksgiving, worship and praise, and prayer can be used to seek guidance or assistance or to ask for forgiveness. Prayer can be for oneself or offered for others. This is how we define prayer, but these words of definition seem to forget that prayer is a conversation and bridge builder between our loving Father and us.

We see prayer as the subject in today's Gospel, when the disciples asked Jesus how to teach them to pray. As Luke tells us, they made this request after they saw Him praying to the Father. The words Jesus gave them are the words that we pray almost every time we gather as the Living Body of Christ. We know these words as the Lord's Prayer or the Our Father. During Jesus' time it was common for Rabbis to read their followers a prayer. This prayer was to be short and easy to memorize, and it was to summarize what their particular teaching(s) were all about. John the Baptist did this for his disciples and now Jesus' disciples were asking for the same consideration. They, of course, got more than they bargained for. In the words of the Lord's Prayer, we see what the Gospel is all about, when it comes to our relationship with God.

Jesus begins by calling God, Our Father. This word tells us that in prayer we are not coming to someone whom we have to force, or flatter to receive gifts. No, we are coming to a Father who takes great delight in supplying His children what they need. Also by calling God Our Father, we are placing God first in our prayers, as we acknowledge God's glory and the proper respect due Him. All of this is carried out before we make our petitions known. Only when we give God His proper place, will other things take their proper place. The Lord's Prayer covers aspects of our entire life, it covers our present needs as we pray for our daily bread, and it helps us not to worry about tomorrow. It covers our past as we recall our sins and ask for forgiveness, and it deals with our future as we ask not to be led into temptation and to be delivered from evil. (And these words may change a little to make more sense of this request).

To drive this point home, that our God is a

loving Father, Jesus continues to tell us why we can indeed trust God. First, He tells us how we ourselves should act toward the people we love, how we can give them good things. As Jesus points out, if we who are sinful can still do good things, think how much more Our Father in Heaven (who is perfect) will do for us. Jesus also uses the example of the neighbor who comes in the middle of the night for some bread to offer to his guests who arrive so late. Remember last week how hospitality was so important, and how one had to respond to the needs of guests, no matter what or when! That is why the host is so persistent in knocking on the door of his neighbor. Even when he is told to go away, the host will not give up. Therefore, as Jesus tells us, the homeowner gets up to meet the host's needs just so the host will go away. Our Lord is telling us that if we meet the needs of others, even if we are just doing it so they will go away, how much more will God answer our needs and do it without needing to be convinced.

Abraham knows this as he talks to God about the destruction that will happen to the cities on the plain. God decides to tell Abraham what He is about to do, and Abraham is sickened by the news. As we see, he begins to question God and even confronts the just judge of the entire world with the idea that it would be unfair to punish the innocent with the guilty. God agrees and as we see, they go back and forth until Abraham gets God down to ten, just ten innocent people. God does not get angry with Abraham, nor does He tell Abraham to mind his own business. Rather they have such a good relationship that God allows him to advocate for the innocent. As it was with Our Father in faith, so it is for all of us. Why, because we belong to the Body of Christ and are empowered by God the Holy Spirit to have full confidence in God and freely call Him Our Father.

Do not forget the Annual Parish Festival which begins on Friday, August 9, 2019. It will run up and through Sunday August 11th, and it promises to be a very good time. See you there.

A Message of Importance from Bishop Barron

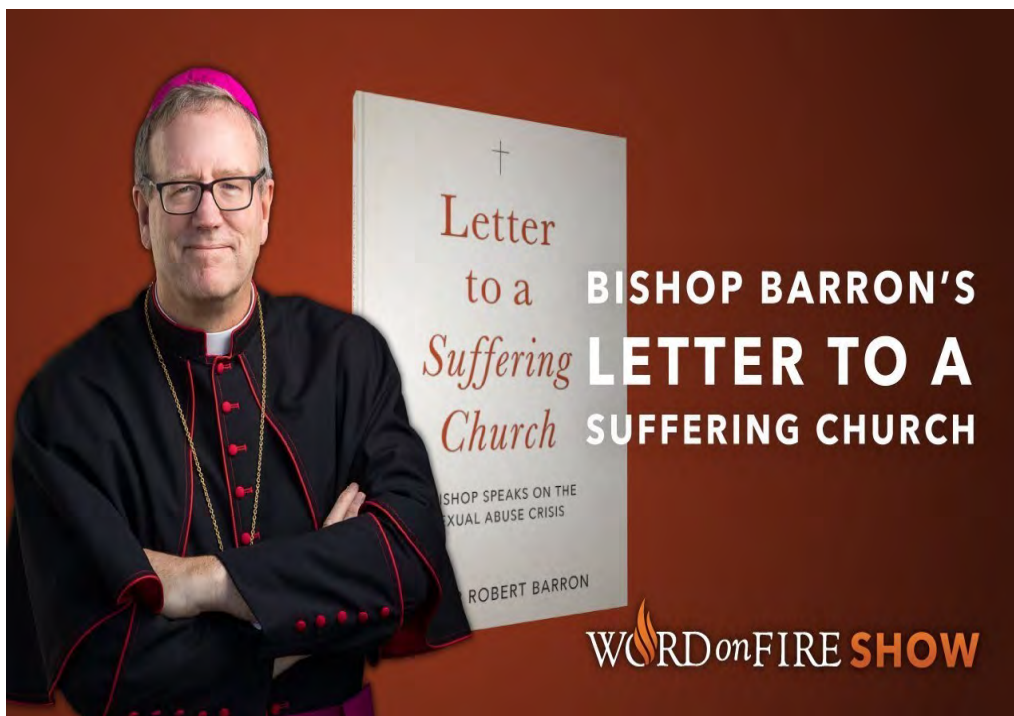
Fellow Parishioners, we are aware of the horrific sexual abuse crisis that has haunted our Church. We all grieve the wicked ways that priest have abused children, seminarians, and other vulnerable people. We are saddened and extremely distressed, to say the least.

With these scandals in mind, our parish has decided to share with you a new book by Bishop Robert Barron. His book is titled *Letter to a Suffering Church: A Bishop Speaks on the Sexual Abuse Crisis*.

A copy of the book for each family in the parish is available to be picked up after all Masses this weekend in the vestibule. Copies will be left in the vestibule during the week of 7/29.

Our parish has decided to read the book together, as a parish, one chapter per week over five weeks. To help us with that, Bishop Barron has created a short email or text message to guide us along. The video series will start on 8/5 to give everyone an opportunity to pick up the book and to start reading. Each message will contain a short video reflection by Bishop Barron followed by a few discussion questions we can discuss together as a parish, using our Flocknote system. It's a chance for you to dialogue with fellow parishioners and to ask questions of and interact with your priests about this topic.

So please be sure to take a copy of the book as you leave Mass and know that we at St. Edward's care deeply about helping you navigate these stormy waters. God bless you!

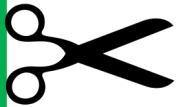

Religious Education Registration Info for the 2019-2020 School Year

Families whose children were enrolled in Religious Education Classes last year will have received by now a Re-Registration Form with registration instructions via email. If you did not, yet receive this email, please contact the Office at 921-8543.

Families who are new to the Religious Education Program may print out a New Family Registration Form from our web site at www.saintedwardre.com. Click on Forms to Print. It is a two-page form, so please be sure to print both pages. You may also choose to register online by selecting the link: On-Line Registration for NEW Families. We do ask, however, that all new families kindly contact the office by either calling 921-8543 or by emailing the Director at rpettei@st-edwards.org to arrange an appointment to meet with her. Mrs. Pettei will fill you in about the program here at St. Edward's

St. Edward Religious Education is an 8-9 year formation program. Public School Students are required to begin studies in grade 1 and finish their classes in grade 8. We now have a Kindergarten level for those students who want a head start on their Religious Formation.

Preparation for First Holy Communion takes place in grades 1 and 2. Students receive their First Holy Communion in May of grade 2; First Reconciliation in March of grade 2. Grades 3 through 6 are required continuation years in students' religious education studies. Preparation for Confirmation takes place in grades 7 and 8. Students receive the Sacrament of Confirmation in the Fall of grade 9.

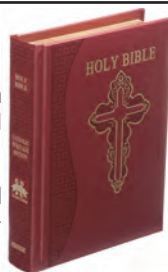
