The Readings for The Nineteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time

Reading 1 - 1 Kings 19:4-8

Elijah went a day's journey into the desert, until he came to a broom tree and sat beneath it. He prayed for death saying: "This is enough, O LORD! Take my life, for I am no better than my fathers." He lay down and fell asleep under the broom tree, but then an angel touched him and ordered him to get up and eat. Elijah looked and there at his head was a hearth cake and a jug of water.

After he ate and drank, he lay down again, but the angel of the LORD came back a second time, touched him, and ordered, "Get up and eat, else the journey will be too long for you!"

He got up, ate, and drank; then strengthened by that food, he walked forty days and forty nights to the mountain of God, Horeb.

Reading 2 – Ephesians 4:30-5:2

Brothers and sisters: Do not grieve the Holy Spirit of God, with which you were sealed for the day of redemption. All bitterness, fury, anger, shouting, and reviling must be removed from you, along with all malice. And be kind to one another, compassionate, forgiving one another as God has forgiven you in Christ.

So be imitators of God, as beloved children, and live in love, as Christ loved us and handed himself over for us as a sacrificial offering to God for a fragrant aroma.

Gospel – John 6:41-51

The Jews murmured about Jesus because he said, "***I am the bread that came down from heaven,***" and they said, "Is this not Jesus, the son of Joseph? Do we not know his father and mother? Then how can he say, 'I have come down from heaven'?" Jesus answered and said to them, "***Stop murmuring among yourselves. No one can come to me unless the Father who sent me draw him, and I will raise him on the last day. It is written in the prophets: They shall all be taught by God. Everyone who listens to my Father and learns from him comes to me. Not that anyone has seen the Father except the one who is from God; he has seen the Father. Amen, amen, I say to you, whoever believes has eternal life. I am the bread of life. Your ancestors ate the manna in the desert, but they died; this is the bread that comes down from heaven so that one may eat it and not die. I am the living bread that came down from heaven; whoever eats this bread will live forever; and the bread that I will give is my flesh for the life of the world.***"

From Fr. Mike's Desk

Last week's Gospel began with a very important search. As we were told, the people were looking high and low for Jesus and the Apostles. So not finding Him, the crowd decided to go to Capernaum on the other side of the Lake, and when they found Him, they were overjoyed. However, Jesus did not greet them with open arms, in fact He challenged them, as He questioned their motives in seeking Him out. He instructed them not to look for food that perishes, but for the food that endures for eternal life.

They asked Jesus what can they do to accomplish the works of God and obtain eternal life? Jesus told them to believe in the one the Father sent and to understand that He sent the true bread which came down from heaven. They said, "Sir, give us this bread always." He then told them, "I am the bread of life, whoever comes to me will never hunger, and whoever believes in me will never thirst."

As we pick up the Gospel account this weekend, we see the people very unhappy with His answer. They cannot believe that He has come down from Heaven, after all they knew where He was from, and they know He is the son of Joseph and Mary. To make the situation worse, Jesus tells them that only those who are drawn by the Father can and will believe and follow Him. As the discourse continues, Jesus will tell them again that He is the bread of life which has come down from heaven, and who ever eats this bread will never die and will live forever. Today's Gospel then closes with, "I am the living bread that comes down from heaven; whoever eats this bread will live forever; and the bread I will give is my flesh for the life of the world." As we will see two weeks from now, this statement was too hard for them to bear!

The crowd is constantly making the mistake of looking at Jesus only through human eyes. Now we may say, well that's all we have, how else can we look at Him? The truth is we have more than our physical eyes to see with. We have our spiritual eyes, that can see things a lot clearer than we can imagine. We have the eyes of faith, truth and life that have been given to us from the beginning, as we are all made in the image and likeness of God. These eyes are made sharper through Baptism, Confirmation and by eating the Bread of Life that comes down from heaven - the Blessed Sacrament.

Truly, if you cannot see through the eyes, and hear with the ears of faith, you cannot eat the flesh of the Son of Man. However, if we are guided by the Holy Spirit (for as St. Paul tells us that no one can say Jesus is Lord except through the Holy Spirit), we will know that the flesh and blood of Jesus is found in the Blessed Sacrament. Certainly, the words of Jesus are hard to

understand and bear, but after they saw all that He accomplished, especially in the Miracle of the Loaves and Fish, they should have stopped and prayed for a greater understanding. Come to think of it, so should we! Let's face it, sometimes we all can be spiritually blind and deaf, sometimes we only choose to see what we want to see, and not what God wants us to see or say to us.

Next Sunday we celebrate *the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary into Heaven*. This is a Solemnity, which means it supersedes the Sunday of Ordinary Time. Also speaking at all the Masses next weekend will be **Father Bernard Olszewski who represents Cross Catholic Outreach**. This worthwhile group has been here before and we have always been very generous to them. He **WILL NOT be taking up a second collection but will be asking for our help**. Thank you for listening with the ears of faith.

Obligation to Return to Church

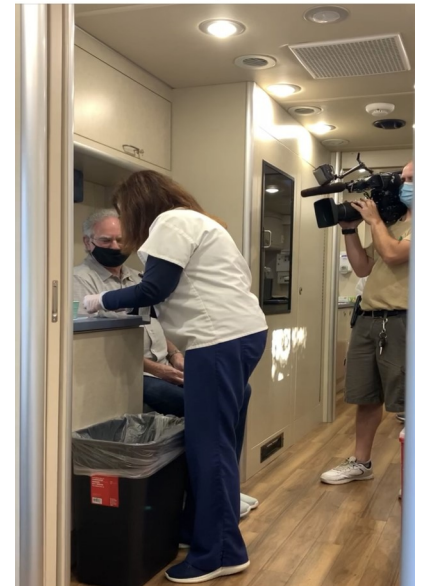

We've missed all of you and look forward to having everyone back once again.



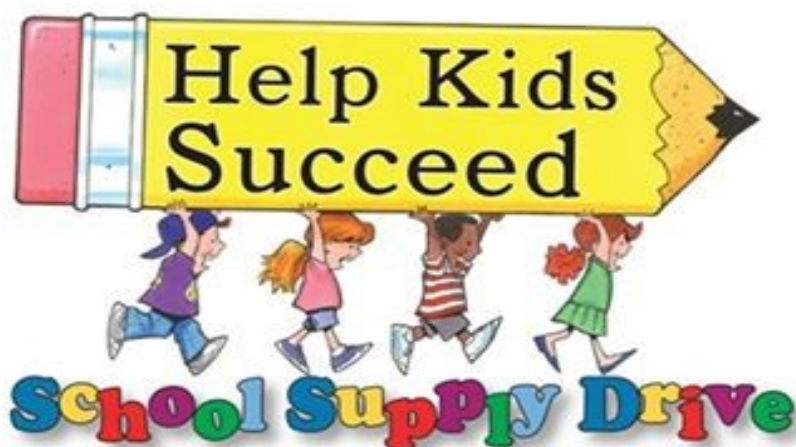
St. Francis Hospital - COVID-19 Walk-In Clinic

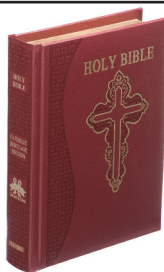
