From Fr. Mike's Desk

Many years ago Kermit the Frog sang about how it was not easy being Green, and yet what was first a lament would end up on a happy note, with the comment that Green was the color of spring and tall trees. As we see in this week's readings, one could say that it is not easy to follow God's will or to be Christ's disciple. The Prophet Jeremiah had the most unpopular job of anyone in the Old Testament. He was constantly sent out to warn the people of their utter destruction. This destruction would occur because the people, as a whole, had turned away from doing God's will. As history tells us, the Babylonians conquered the southern kingdom of Judah, and for a period of seventy years, the cream of Judah's society was in exile. They would remain in Babylon until the Persian Empire conquered Babylon and set Israel free. Jeremiah spoke the truth, but the people refused to listen to him. As a result, it led them to put the prophet into a mud-filled cistern hoping to silence him. Their plan did not succeed, but it does show us the type of life he lived in God's service.

Today we have Jesus telling us, "I have come to set the earth on fire... do you think that I have come to establish peace on earth? No I tell you, but rather division." Jesus tells us we will have division among family members, friends, fellow citizens, and the like. However, this prediction about division does not seem to be a part of the Christian Message. No, the Message speaks of peace, forgiveness, harmony and love. Yet this talk of division is a part of the Message, because so many in the world do not want to listen to the Message and in fact, they want it destroyed. Governments around the world and throughout history have taken steps to deride the Message and persecute those who follow it. Family members have disowned members of their family who become one with Christ, even to this very hour.

Discipleship has always demanded a cost, one way or another, and from all of us! That is, if we allow our faith to be truly alive and change our lives. If we merely acknowledge the Gospel, but never let it truly change who we are and how we react to things happening in this world, we are not being true disciples. No, we are then essentially being bystanders and not really paying any cost! However if we want to be more than bystanders we must seek to make the world a better place according to the Christian Message, and as Jesus


tells us, that can bring about fire in our lives. Still, no matter what cost we pay, it will be worth it. Moreover, no matter what we give up, we will gain so much more in return! Think of how good it feels to know you have done something good for others and how good it feels to know that you are doing God's will. Think of how awful it feels to be selfish and have put your will before God. Which would you want to experience?

Thanks to all who came out last week and supported our Annual Parish Festival. It was a great time, and everyone enjoyed themselves. A special thanks to the members of the Joseph J. Gorman Council of the Knights of Columbus who have been running this festival for so many years. Thanks to all your hard work and for the cost of discipleship you paid for the good of the parish. We are all looking forward to next year.







A Message of Importance from Bishop Barron



Week Three: We have been here before

This week, we focus on Chapter 3 of Bishop Robert Barron's new book, *Letter to a Suffering Church*, which our parish is reading together. Bishop Barron observes that while our present abuse crisis is unique in many ways, the current darkness must be seen in historical perspective. The Church, from the very beginning and at every point in its development, has been marked to varying degrees by sin, scandal, stupidity, misbehavior, misfortune, and wickedness. In this chapter, Bishop Barron recounts some of the misdeeds and outrageous sins of priests, bishops, and popes in Catholic history. But he also shows how the Church still emerged on the other side, since there is nevertheless something good, even indestructibly good, about the Mystical Body of Christ.



Preparation for First Holy Communion takes place in grades 1 and 2. Students receive their First Holy Communion in May of grade 2; First Reconciliation in March of grade 2. Grades 3 through 6 are required continuation years in students' religious education studies. Preparation for Confirmation takes place in grades 7 and 8. Students receive the Sacrament of Confirmation in the Fall of grade 9.


