The Readings for the Twenty-first Sunday in Ordinary Time

Reading 1 - Joshua 24:1-2a, 15-17, 18b

Joshua gathered together all the tribes of Israel at Shechem, summoning their elders, their leaders, their judges, and their officers. When they stood in ranks before God, Joshua addressed all the people: "If it does not please you to serve the LORD, decide today whom you will serve, the gods your fathers served beyond the River or the gods of the Amorites in whose country you are now dwelling. As for me and my household, we will serve the LORD."

But the people answered, "Far be it from us to forsake the LORD for the service of other gods. For it was the LORD, our God, who brought us and our fathers up out of the land of Egypt, out of a state of slavery. He performed those great miracles before our very eyes and protected us along our entire journey and among the peoples through whom we passed. Therefore we also will serve the LORD, for he is our God."

Reading 2 – Ephesians 5:21-32

Brothers and sisters:

Be subordinate to one another out of reverence for Christ. Wives should be subordinate to their husbands as to the Lord. For the husband is head of his wife just as Christ is head of the church, he himself the savior of the body. As the church is subordinate to Christ, so wives should be subordinate to their husbands in everything. Husbands, love your wives, even as Christ loved the church and handed himself over for her to sanctify her, cleansing her by the bath of water with the word, that he might present to himself the church in splendor, without spot or wrinkle or any such thing, that she might be holy and without blemish. So also husbands should love their wives as their own bodies. He who loves his wife loves himself. For no one hates his own flesh but rather nourishes and cherishes it, even as Christ does the church, because we are members of his body.

For this reason a man shall leave his father and his mother and be joined to his wife, and the two shall become one flesh.

This is a great mystery, but I speak in reference to Christ and the church.

Gospel – John 6:60-69

Many of Jesus' disciples who were listening said, "This saying is hard; who can accept it?" Since Jesus knew that his disciples were murmuring about this, he said to them, "Does this shock you? What if you were to see the Son of Man ascending to where he was before? It is the spirit that gives life, while the flesh is of no avail. The words I have spoken to you are Spirit and life. But there are some of you who do not believe." Jesus knew from the beginning the ones who would not believe and the one who would betray him. And he said, "For this reason I have told you that no one can come to me unless it is granted him by my Father."

As a result of this, many of his disciples returned to their former way of life and no longer accompanied him. Jesus then said to the Twelve, "Do you also want to leave?" Simon Peter answered him, "Master, to whom shall we go? You have the words of eternal life. We have come to believe and are convinced that you are the Holy One of God."

From Fr. Mike's Desk

Today's readings deal with commitment, primarily our commitment to God, but also to the community. Joshua asks the people, as they are about to enter the Promised Land, if they would serve God or the gods of the people who were living in the Holy Land before they arrived. Joshua gives his answer that he and his household would follow the Lord, but he wants to hear the response of the others. As we read, they too will follow God because of all He did for them in freeing them from slavery in Egypt and leading them across the desert.

Jesus today confronts the twelve with the question, "'Do you also want to leave?' Simon Peter answered him, 'Master, to whom shall we go? You have the words of eternal life. We have come to believe and are convinced that you are the Holy One of God." The Apostles, through Peter, made their commitment to Jesus because they were convinced that he was the Holy One of God, and unlike the others who left Jesus they did not find His words too much to bear. Granted ,they did not totally understand everything Jesus said and did, but they knew in their hearts that He was the Messiah. They knew this because they were called by God, the Father, to hear the words of God the Son. As Jesus says, "For this reason I have told you that no one can come to me unless it is granted him by my Father."

As it was 2021 years ago so it is for us now. Keep in mind that it is not totally our idea that we have responded to Jesus' call, God the Father called you first to the Son. Certainly, we have the free will to say yes or no, but in some way shape or form we have said yes to God, and to eternal life. Now, we know that some are coming to Sunday Mass because other members of the family are making them come (seen mainly in our kids as they are coming because their parents are making them come). Two comments; first, parents thank you for bringing your children, God's special gift to you. Keep bringing them to Mass, even when they fight you! Why, because you are giving them a great gift even if they do not know it. However, do not convince your children to come through punishment or threats, for they will associate God and Mass with punishment. Try to convince them the way Jesus convinced people to come to Him. Convince them with love and compassion, and share with your children how important your faith is to you, how much Jesus means to you and how much you love God and them. When parents/families make Mass a priority the children usually grow up making God and the Mass a major focus in their lives. Even if there is a period where they stop going, they always seem to return. This can, indeed, happen if you give your family a firm foundation.

I direct the second comment to the kids. Kids, even when you do not want to come to Mass or feel that you are getting nothing out of it, come anyway. As you grow older, and hopefully wiser, you will see a great need to come to Mass, as you will need to have your spiritual batteries recharged. You will find great comfort to know that there is a special place where you can come to get away from the world's problems (and even your own) and feel safe and at home with Jesus. This will come in time and if you keep focused, listen to what is being said, and who you are receiving in the Eucharist. Think about how important you are to God. that He called you to Himself and shares everything with you through Jesus. This can only happen if only you are open to God, and the best way to remain open to Him, is to come to the celebration of the Eucharist. Jesus is asking us to make a commitment and as He asked the Apostles, He is asking us, "Will you leave me too?" Hopefully, all of us will answer, "Lord where can we go, you have the words of eternal life. You are the Holy One of God."

With love for your neighbors who have nothing, look around your house to see what furniture, household items, and clothing you no longer use...and give it to the Society of St. Vincent de Paul.





Registration Info for the 2021-2022 School Year




St. Edward's Religious Education is an 8 year faith formation program. Public School Students are required to begin their religious studies in grade 1 and finish their classes in grade 8.

Preparation for the reception of First Reconciliation and First Holy Communion takes place in grades 1 and 2. Students will receive their First Reconciliation in March of grade 2 and their First Holy Communion in May of grade 2. Grades 3 through 6

are required continuation years for students in their religious education studies. Preparation for Confirmation occurs in grades 7 and 8. Students will receive the Sacrament of Confirmation in the Fall of grade 9.

After a year of virtual learning due to the pandemic, we are planning to resume in school classes for religious studies this coming fall. Our scheduled opening date for Sunday classes is September 26th with weekday classes scheduled to begin the following week.



Families whose children were enrolled in Religious Education Classes last year, should have received a Registration Email on May 17th. These emails will be sent out again during the summer. If you did not receive this email on May 17th, please contact Mrs. Braun at abraun@st-edwards.org



God Calls Us to Glory Through Humility

Addressing the faithful gathered in Saint Peter's Square for the Sunday Angelus on the August 15th Solemnity of the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary into heaven, Pope Francis offered his opening reflections on the importance of this Feast, saying "Mary's secret is humility." God looks at the heart, he said, and Mary's humility drew God's gaze to her. He observed that often times the human eye is instead overtaken with appearances and grandeur, while overlooking the essential importance of humility. By looking to Mary assumed into heaven, the Pope said we see how "humility is the way that brings her to Heaven". To rise up to heaven, we need to be humble he said, noting the origin of the word humble comes from the Latin word humus meaning "earth". Our gifts, or wealth, are not what allow us to be exalted by God, but instead, it is our humility, our loving and serving God in total giving that matters, the Pope underscored.
