Observe them carefully, for thus will you give evidence of your wisdom and intelligence to the nations, who will hear of all these statutes and say, ‘This great nation is truly a wise and intelligent people.’ For what great nation is there that has gods so close to it as the LORD, our God, is to us whenever we call upon him? Or what great nation has statutes and decrees that are as just as this whole law which I am setting before you today?”

Living in the presence of the Lord.



James 1: 17-18, 21b-22, 27

Dearest brothers and sisters:

All good giving and every perfect gift is from above, coming down from the Father of lights, with whom there is no alteration or shadow caused by change. He willed to give us birth by the word of truth that we may be a kind of first fruits of his creatures. Humbly welcome the word that has been planted in you and is able to save your souls. Be doers of the word and not hearers only, deluding yourselves. Religion that is pure and undefiled before God and the Father is this: to care for orphans and widows in their affliction and to keep oneself unstained by the world.

Gospel – Mark 7:1-8, 14-15, 21-23

When the Pharisees with some scribes who had come from Jerusalem gathered around Jesus, they observed that some of his disciples ate their meals with unclean, that is, unwashed, hands.

—For the Pharisees and, in fact, all Jews, do not eat without carefully washing their hands, keeping the tradition of the elders. And on coming from the marketplace they do not eat without purifying themselves. And there are many other things that they have traditionally observed, the purification of cups and jugs and kettles and beds. —

So the Pharisees and scribes questioned him, “Why do your disciples not follow the tradition of the elders but instead eat a meal with unclean hands?” He responded, *“Well did Isaiah prophesy about you hypocrites, as it is written:*

This people honors me with their lips,

but their hearts are far from me;

in vain do they worship me,

teaching as doctrines human precepts.

You disregard God’s commandment but cling to human tradition.”

He summoned the crowd again and said to them, *“Hear me, all of you, and understand. Nothing that enters one from outside can defile that person; but the things that come out from within are what defile. From within people, from their hearts, come evil thoughts, unchastity, theft, murder, adultery, greed, malice, deceit, licentiousness, envy, blasphemy, arrogance, folly. All these evils come from within and they defile.”*

From Fr. Mike's Desk

"Humbly welcome the word that has been planted in you and is able to save your souls. Be doers of the word and not hearers only, deluding yourselves. Religion that is pure and undefiled before God and the Father is this: to care for orphans and widows in their affliction and keep oneself unstained by the world." These words, from the Letter of Saint James, give us the theme of today's readings. How do we practice our religion? Sometimes religion gets a bad rap, because some feel it places a barrier between different groups of people, or between a person and God. After all, why do I have to follow a whole bunch of rules, can't I just talk to God? And why should I follow a religion, after all the leaders are just out for power and money. While this may be true in the cases of some who practice religion or establish a cult, this is not the case with True Religion as Saint James tells us about, and Jesus calls His listeners to in today's Gospel passage. Yes, we should all be able to talk to God directly, and indeed we should every day, and many times. And yes, we can approach God without coming to the Church, but that does not negate the value of or the need for religion and its practices and customs.

Remember, **the Church is the Living Body of Christ**; it is all who are baptized with water in the name of the Father, and the Son, and the Holy Spirit. While the institution and offices are a part of the Church, they are just a part, (a necessary part which **acts in the person of Christ who is Priest, Prophet and King**) and not the whole. **The Church is the dwelling place of the Holy Spirit**; therefore, it is God, Himself, who guides, teaches, and directs the Church along its way. That is why Dogmas, Teachings, Precepts and Canons of the Church can be trusted since they are based on our Hebrew Traditions (the Law of Moses and the Prophets, and the wisdom books), the Revelation and Teachings of our Lord Jesus Christ, and are given to us through the grace and workings of the Holy Spirit. The Church does not exist for its own sake, but to do the will of her groom and founder, Jesus Christ, the Son of God. The Church serves as the instrument of the Kingdom of God, calling all to the Father and eternal life.

With this being said about true religion, we must keep in mind, that there has been, and there are people who are truly practicing pure, undefiled religion. That is why St. James writes his advice and why Jesus is lashing out against the Pharisees; because they take care to make sure every cup, jug, kettle, and bed are clean inside and out. This is not a bad thing, but the problem was they forgot why they were doing it. What became more important to them was the need to carryout the purifications, the rituals, and even the prayers without putting their hearts and souls into it. In reality they were practicing their faith for all to see, and they had forgotten to love, the Lord and one another. How do we avoid the mistakes of the Scribes

and Pharisees, and how can we make sure that our practice is true and from the heart? We can follow, **The Corporal and Spiritual Works of Mercy**, and follow from our hearts the **Precepts of the Church**.

The Corporal Works of Mercy are: Feed the hungry, Give drink to the thirsty, Clothe the naked, Shelter the homeless, Visit the sick, Visit the imprisoned, Bury the dead.

The Spiritual Works of Mercy are: Instruct the ignorant, Counsel the doubtful, Correct the sinner, Bear wrongs done to you patiently, Forgive offenses willingly, Comfort the sorrowful, Pray for the living and the dead.

The Precepts of the Church are: Go to Mass on Sundays and Holy Days of Obligation, Go to Confession at least once a year, Receive the Eucharist at least once a year during the Easter Season (known as the Easter Duty), Observe the Days of Fasting and Abstinence, Help provide for the needs of the Church according to one's ability and station in life (also known as Tithing), To obey the marriage laws of the Church and this one which is extra, participate in the Church's mission to evangelize.

So go out and carry on the good work that God has begun in you and do it always from the heart!

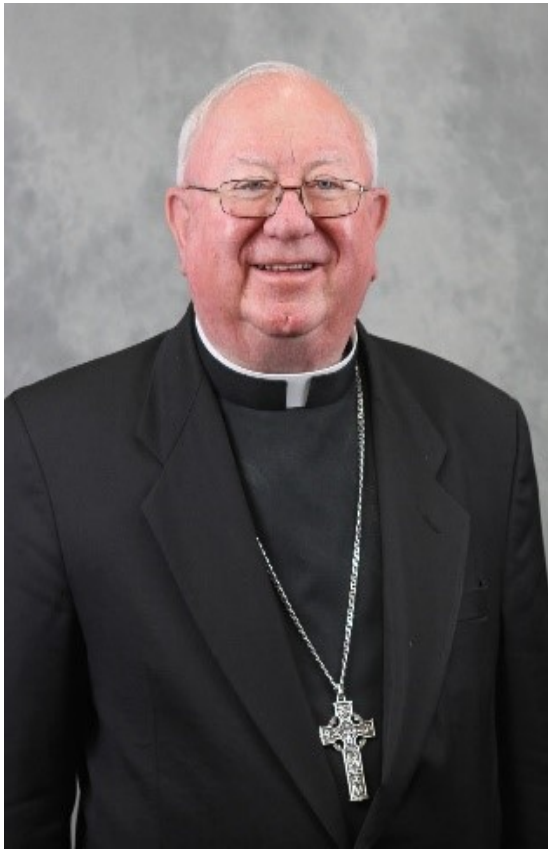

Registration Info for the 2021-2022 School Year

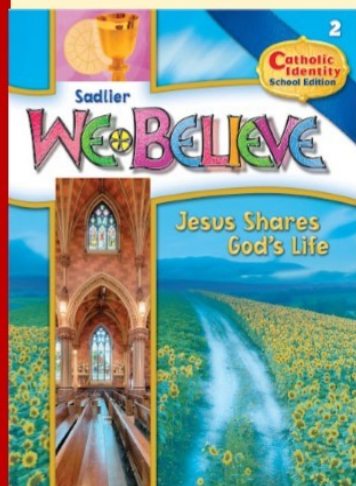


St. Edward's Religious Education is an 8 year faith formation program. Public School Students are required to begin their religious studies in grade 1 and finish their classes in grade 8.

Preparation for the reception of First Reconciliation and First Holy Communion takes place in grades 1 and 2. Students will receive their First Reconciliation in March of grade 2 and their First Holy Communion in May of grade 2. Grades 3 through 6

are required continuation years for students in their religious education studies. Preparation for Confirmation occurs in grades 7 and 8. Students will receive the Sacrament of Confirmation in the Fall of grade 9.

After a year of virtual learning due to the pandemic, we are planning to resume in- school classes for religious studies this coming fall. Our scheduled opening date for Sunday classes is September 26th with weekday classes scheduled to begin the following week.



Families whose children were enrolled in Religious Education Classes last year, should have received a Registration Email on May 17th. These emails will be sent out again during the summer. If you did not receive this email on May 17th, please contact Mrs. Braun at abraun@st-edwards.org

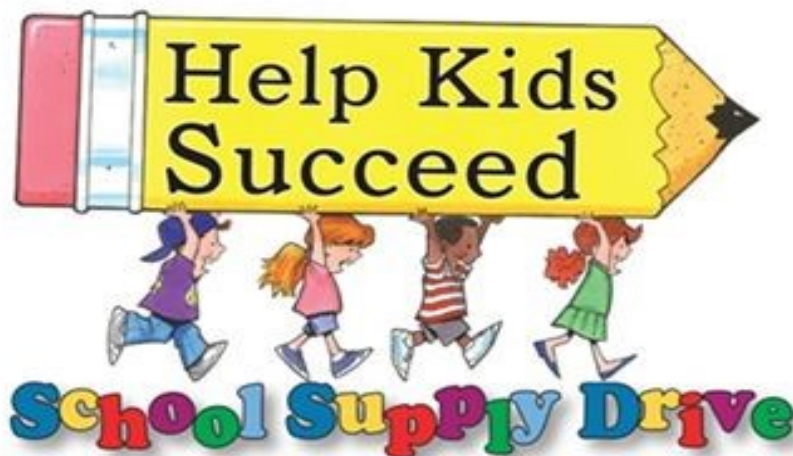

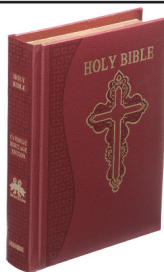
