# From Fr. Mike's Desk

"Humbly welcome the word that has been planted in you and is able to save your souls. Be doers of the word and not hearers only, deluding yourselves. Religion that is pure and undefiled before God and the Father is this: to care for orphans and widows in their affliction and to keep oneself unstained by the world." These words from the Letter of Saint James give us the theme of today's readings. How do we practice our religion? Sometimes religion gets a bad rap, because some feel it places a barrier between diverse groups of people or even between a person and God. Why do I have to follow a bunch of rules, can't I just talk to God? Why should I follow any religion, after all, the leaders are just out for power and they keep all the money they collect. While this certainly can be true in some cases, especially in those who establish a cult following, this is not the case with True Religion. As Saint James tells his listeners, and as Jesus reaffirms in today's Gospel passage. They both reaffirm that yes, we should be able to freely speak to God, (and we should every day, in fact, many times during the day), and we can talk to God without coming into the Church. However, this does not negate the value or the need for religion and its practices, especially when speaking about the Church.

Remember the Church is the Living Body of Christ; it is all who are Baptized with water in the Name of the Father, and of The Son, and of The Holy Spirit. While the institution and offices are also a part of the Church, they are just a part (a necessary part that acts in the person of Christ who is Priest, Prophet, and King) and not the whole. The Church is the Dwelling Place of the Holy Spirit; therefore, God Himself guides, teaches, and directs the Church along her way. That is why Dogmas, Teachings, Precepts, and Canons of the Church can be trusted since they are based on our Hebrew Traditions (the Law of Moses and the teachings of the Prophets and the Wisdom Books), and the Revelations and Teachings of Our Lord Jesus Christ, given to us continually by the working and grace of the Holy Spirit. The Church does not exist for her own sake, no, she exists to do the will of her groom and founder Jesus. The Church serves as the instrument of the Kingdom of God, calling all to the Father and Eternal Life.

With this being said about True Religion, we must keep in mind that there have been, and will be, people who are not practicing pure, undefiled religion. That is why St. James writes what he does and why Jesus is lashing out against the Pharisees. The Pharisees took care to make sure to purify every cup, jug, kettle, and bed. Not that this is a terrible thing to do, but they forgot why they were doing it. What became more important for them was merely carrying out the purifications, the rituals, and even the prayers without putting their hearts into what they were doing. Our Lord was telling them that they were just practicing their faith for all to see, but they had forgotten to know, love, and serve the Lord or one another. Saint James tells us how we can avoid this mistake, and that is to put our faith into action. We must carry out the Corporal and Spiritual Works of Mercy and follow the Precepts of the Church, and we must carry them out from our hearts. These are important to know because they show us how we can make our practice of our faith true.

**The Corporal Works of Mercy** are: Feed the Hungry, Give Drink to the Thirsty, Clothe the Naked, Shelter the Homeless, Visit the Sick, Visit the Imprisoned, Bury the Dead.

**The Spiritual works of Mercy** are: Instruct the Ignorant, Counsel the Doubtful, Correct the Sinner, Bear Wrongs done to you Patiently, Forgive Offenses Willingly, Comfort the Sorrowful, Pray for the Living and the Dead.

The Precepts of the Church are: Go to Mass on Sundays and Holy Days of Obligation, Go to Confession at Least Once a Year (traditionally during the Season of Lent), Receive the Eucharist at Least once a Year, during the Easter Season (this is known as Easter Duty), To Observe the Days of Fasting and Abstinence, To Help Provide for the Needs of the Church according to Ones Abilities And Station In Life, To Obey the Marriage laws of the Church, To Participate in the Church's Mission to Evangelize.

# **RCIA is now called OCIA**

The Second Vatican Council reinstated what was referred to in the early Church as the "catechumenate," a process of initiation for adults that culminates in baptism. Initially, this was called in English by the acronym RCIA, standing for the **Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults.** It is composed of five distinct periods (evangelization, precatechumenate, catechumenate, purification and enlightenment, and mystagogy), marking the progress of an adult converting to the Catholic faith. However, in November 2021, the U.S. Conference of Catholic Bishops approved a new translation of the name of this process, now calling it **OCIA, the "Order of Christian Initiation of Adults.** 

While it may seem like a small change, many see this as a new turning point. Rites are still part of the order but **the new structure is meant to invite candidates and catechumens into a continuous process of spiritual formation** as opposed to fixed checkpoints on the path to baptism, first Communion and confirmation.

While most converts enter the Church at the Easter Vigil, this new structure acknowledges **that converts could be baptized or welcomed into the Church at any point in the year**, even taking multiple years before making the final decision.

Becoming a Catholic involves a period of intense discernment, and prayer, not simply going through the "rites" at fixed points of the year. Practically speaking, parishes will be adjusting to this new term over the next few years, phasing out the term RCIA and switching over to the use of the term OCIA.




