From Fr. Mike's Desk

The opening and closing credits of the BBC Program, *Keeping Up Appearances*, shows the main character *Hyacinth Bucket* (who pronounces her last name as *Bouquet*) preparing her table for one of her elegant dinner parties. On the table, she has her best china, silverware, and place cards where the guests will sit. For all to be perfect, each guest must sit in the proper place around the table. If you have seen the show, you know that Hyacinth, played by *Patricia Routledge*, is always trying to take a higher social station that she does not occupy: according to English Social Standards. As often as she wants people to think she is of the upper crust, her family and those who know her, help her to realize exactly where she belongs. Hyacinth's actions and plans always backfire on her, and we know that would not happen if she were honest with herself about whom she really is and would stop *Keeping Up Appearances*!

Today's Gospel Reading and Jesus' comments would be perfect for poor Hyacinth. He tells us today the true meaning of humility. He tells us how leading a humble life will help us on our journey to Heaven. Christianity defines humility as that quality which helps a person submit him or herself to God and others for the good of all. Humility is said to be the foundation of the spiritual edifice and is inferior only to faith. However, humility is the first virtue in as much as it removes all obstacles to faith. It removes pride and makes one subject to and a fit recipient of grace. Humility comprises all the following attributes: 1. Submission to God and all legitimate authority, 2. Recognition of the virtues and talents of others, particularly those that surpass one's own, and giving due honor when required, 3. Recognition of limits to our talents, abilities or authority and not reaching for what is beyond our grasps.

As Christians, we must try to avoid false humility, which consists of belittling one's own sanctity, gifts, talents, and accomplishments for the sake of receiving praise from others; in short to be very proud of your humility! Christ's call for humility is essential for us to know truly, who we are before God and others and to remind us that we all belong to God our Father. To stress this point even more, and as a way to share what we have with others, Jesus urges that we know the poor and share life with them. Not just to know about the poor, but to know the poor as they truly

are. We should desire to help the poor because it is how we follow the Gospel and show our love for one another. We should not act for any other reason. One possible way to get to know those in need is through supporting or helping at Parish Social Ministry or our St. Vincent De Paul Conference.

We close with this prayer for the Virtue of Humility (found on Catholic Online):

Lord Jesus, when You walked the earth, Your humility obscured Your Kingship. Your meekness confused the arrogant, hindering them from grasping Your purpose, Your nobleness attending to the destitute. Teach me to model after Your eminence, to subject my human nature to humility. Grant me a natural inclination to never view myself greater than anyone. Banish all lingering sparks of self-importance that could elevate me greater than You. Let my heart always imitate your humility!

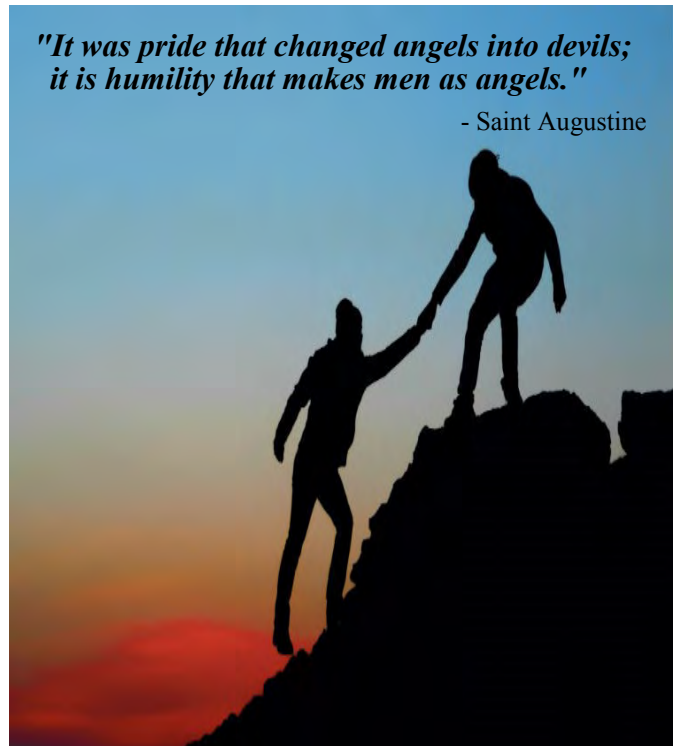
We also pray for all of our students, teachers, administrators, and school staff, as school opens this week. May this be the best year ever!

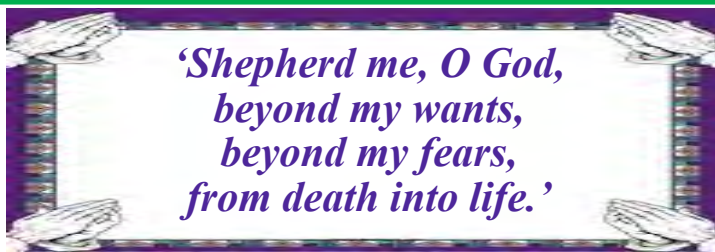

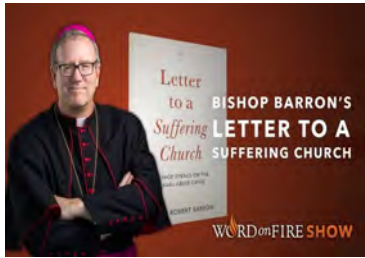

A Message of Importance from Bishop Barron



Week Five: What's the way forward after scandal?

This is the fifth and final video in our study of Bishop Robert Barron's new book, *Letter to a Suffering Church*, which we've been reading as a parish. The book closes with an important question: What's the way forward?

According to Bishop Barron, we need three things. First, we need institutional reforms, building upon the changes put in place in 2002, which have reduced cases of sexual abuse down to a trickle. Second, we need a deep and abiding spiritual reform, beginning with the priesthood but including lay men and women. Third, we need movements of renewal and reform—new orders, new groups, and new works of the Spirit.

As Bishop Barron concludes, "I know many Catholics are sorely tempted just to give up on the Church, to join another religious group, or perhaps to become one of the religiously unaffiliated. But this is not the time to leave; it is the time to stay and fight."

Religious Education Registration Info for the 2019-2020 School Year

Families whose children were enrolled in Religious Education Classes last year will have received by now a Re-Registration Form with registration instructions via email. If you did not, yet receive this email, please contact the Office at 921-8543.

Families who are new to the Religious Education Program may print out a New Family Registration Form from our web site at www.saintedwardre.com. Click on Forms to Print. It is a two

-page form, so please be sure to print both pages. You may also choose to register online by selecting the link: On-Line Registration for NEW Families. We do ask, however, that all new families kindly contact the office by either calling 921-8543 or by emailing the Director at rpettei@st-edwards.org to arrange an appointment to meet with her. Mrs. Pettei will fill you in about the program here at St. Edward's

St. Edward Religious Education is an 8-9 year formation program. Public School Students are required to begin studies in grade 1 and finish their classes in grade 8. We now have a Kindergarten level for those students who want a head start on their Religious Formation.

Preparation for First Holy Communion takes place in grades 1 and 2. Students receive their First Holy Communion in May of grade 2; First Reconciliation in March of grade 2.

Grades 3 through 6 are required continuation years in students' religious education studies.

Preparation for Confirmation takes place in grades 7 and 8. Students receive the Sacrament of Confirmation in the Fall of grade 9.

What is a pocket prayer shawl?

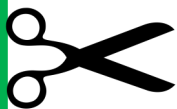
