

Twenty-fifth Sunday in Ordinary Time

Reading 1 - Amos 8:4-7

Hear this, you who trample upon the needy and destroy the poor of the land! "When will the new moon be over," you ask, "that we may sell our grain, and the sabbath, that we may display the wheat? We will diminish the ephah, add to the shekel, and fix our scales for cheating! We will buy the lowly for silver, and the poor for a pair of sandals; even the refuse of the wheat we will sell!" Reading 2 — 1 Timothy 2:1-8

Beloved:

First of all, I ask that supplications, prayers, petitions, and thanksgivings be offered for everyone, for kings and for all in authority, that we may lead a quiet and tranquil life in all devotion and dignity. This is good and pleasing to God our savior, who wills everyone to be saved and to come to knowledge of the truth. For there is one God. There is also one mediator between God and men, the man Christ Jesus, who gave himself as ransom for all. This was the testimony at the proper time. For this I was appointed preacher and apostle — I am speaking the truth, I am not lying —, teacher of the Gentiles in faith and truth.

It is my wish, then, that in every place the men should pray, lifting up holy hands, without anger or argument.

Gospel — Luke 16:1-13

Jesus said to his disciples, "A rich man had a steward who was reported to him for squandering his property. He summoned him and said, 'What is this I hear about you? Prepare a full account of your stewardship, because you can no longer be my steward.' The steward said to himself, 'What shall I do, now that my master is taking the position of steward away from me? I am not strong enough to dig and I am ashamed to beg. I know what I shall do so that, when I am removed from the stewardship, they may welcome me into their homes.' He called in his master's debtors one by one. To the first he said, 'How much do you owe my master?' He replied, 'One hundred measures of olive oil.' He said to him, 'Here is your promissory note. Sit down and quickly write one for fifty.' Then to another the steward said, 'And you, how much do you owe?' He replied, 'One hundred kors of wheat.' The steward said to him, 'Here is your promissory note; write one for eighty.' And the master commended that dishonest steward for acting prudently. "For the children of this world are more prudent in dealing with their own generation than are the children of light. I tell you, make friends for yourselves with dishonest wealth, so that when it fails, you will be welcomed into eternal dwellings. The person who is trustworthy in very small matters is also trustworthy in great ones; and the person who is dishonest in very small matters is also dishonest in great ones. If, therefore, you are not trustworthy with dishonest wealth, who will trust you with true wealth? If you are not trustworthy with what belongs to another, who will give you what is yours? No servant can serve two masters. He will either hate one and love the other, or be devoted to one and despise the other. You cannot serve both God and mammon."

From Fr. Mike's Desk

St. Paul writes in his First Letter to Timothy how we should seek out peace and harmony. As he writes, "...I ask that supplications, prayers, petitions, and thanksgiving be offered for everyone, for kings and for all in authority, that we may lead a quiet and tranquil life in all devotion and dignity. This is good and pleasing to God our savior, who wills everyone to be saved and to come to knowledge of the truth."

St. Paul is telling us how we are to live in this very rapidly changing world. As it is now, so it was two thousand years ago. Yes, there are different problems, and we have different lifestyles, but as the expression goes, the more things change, the more they remain the same. Just as we have now, there is war and destruction, great moral conflicts, dishonesty, and so many people are not sure what to do. Paul knows that the only answer to all doubts, questions, and anxieties is Jesus. That is why the Church for all these years, has always prayed for peace in the world. We have always prayed for all political and state leaders so they can keep the peace and look out for all citizens. Why does St. Paul tell us to do this? His answer is, "For there is one God. There is also one mediator between God and men...Jesus Christ." Only if we pray and invoke Jesus' name can this world become a better place. Only if we pray can we replace dishonesty with honesty, turmoil with calm, and hatred with love.

But, we may say, I do pray. We as a Church pray, and yet we see the world engulfed with so many problems and issues, why? Well as Paul tells us and as Our Lord tells us, our prayers do work, they are answered and God loves us even more for engaging in prayer and seeking His help, but more must be done. As we turn to today's Gospel, we are given another instruction to follow. In the story of the Unjust Steward, we learn that he is about to be let go because he was squandering his master's property. He was taking more for himself then he deserved. He is about to be fired, so he formed a solution. He simply offered to accept less then what was due to his master. This, of course, would win the steward their favor, especially when he went out

looking for a new job. The steward's master knew what he was doing but did not try to stop him. In fact, he commended the steward for acting prudently. Jesus tells us, "For the children of this world are more prudent in dealing with their own generation."

Yes, the steward knew what he was doing, and ves, he succeeded. So why would Jesus hold him up as a person to follow? Jesus is not supporting his dishonesty; however, He is supporting how the steward dealt with the situation. As Christ's followers, living in this crazy world, we are told to act wisely with the things of this world, so we can convert them and ourselves into the next world. We must always strive to be wise in our reacting with the world. We must not allow the world to control us or cause us to have undue worry. If we truly ruled the world instead of it ruling us, then our prayers recommended to us by St. Paul, will be answered. We end with St. Paul's wish from today's letter. "It is my wish, then, that in every place the men should pray, lifting up holy hands, without anger or argument."



Registration Info for Religious Education Classes for the 2022-2023 School Year



St. Edward's Religious Education is an 8 year religious education program. Public School Students are required to begin their religious studies in grade 1 and finish their formation classes in grade 8.

Preparation for the reception of First Reconciliation and First Holy Communion takes place in grades 1 and 2. Students will receive their First Confession in March of grade 2 and then their First Communion in May of that year. Grades 3 through 6 are required continuation study years for students in their religious formation. Preparation for Confirmation occurs in grades 7 and 8. Students receive the Sacrament of Confirmation in the Fall of grade 9.

In person Religious Education Classes will begin the week of September 25th.



Families whose children were already enrolled in Religious Education Classes last year should have received a Registration Email on June 8th. The registration emails were sent out again a number of times over the summer. If you have not yet registered and cannot recover this registration email, kindly contact Mrs. Braun by emailing at abraun@st-edwards.org or by calling 516-921-8543.

Families who are new to the Program may register online by going to the Religious Education Website: saintedwardre.com. Select the link: On-Line Registration for NEW Families. 
