From Fr. Mike's Desk

"If I speak in human and angelic tongues but do not have love, I am a resounding gong or a clashing cymbal. And if I have the gift of prophecy and comprehend all mysteries and all knowledge; if I have all faith so as to move mountains but do not have love, I am nothing... Love is patient, love is kind...Love never fails...So faith, hope and love remain these three; but the greatest of these is love." This quote from St. Paul's First Letter to the Corinthians (chapter 13) gives us great insight into what Jesus is telling us this week in Luke's Gospel Reading. The Apostles ask Jesus to increase their faith, and notice the answer that Jesus gave them, "If you have faith the size of a mustard seed you would say to the mulberry tree, 'Be uprooted and planted in the sea; and it will obey you." Pay attention now to what Jesus is saying about faith! If you have even a small amount of TRUE FATIH, you can do anything. So in a sense Jesus is saying to do the things that I do you already have enough faith. But it must be true faith, a pure faith, and a faith that comes from the heart. The good thing about this true faith is that all of us already have it. The problem is most of us are not totally in touch with the gift. Therefore, like the Apostles, we ask Jesus to increase our faith because we think we do not have enough. So stop asking for more faith, rather ask Jesus to help us encounter the faith we already have been given. Also, let us ask Him to help us not allow setbacks to weaken our faith as the Prophet Habakkuk tells us today.

So how do we encounter the faith we already have? We must try to lead lives that will keep us more in touch with Christ. We can achieve this through prayer and spending quality time with Jesus. We can achieve this by joining in the celebration of the Eucharist and receiving the other Sacraments. In addition, we should read the Scriptures and the lives of the Saints. We must also keep our hearts open to the Holy Spirit. Doing these things can help us to get past the challenges of this life, and help us avoid setbacks or at least to quickly recover from them.

There is, of course, one more thing we must do, and St. Paul tells us in the letter quoted above. We must have love! Love is what helps us to put our faith into practice; love helps us to be better disciples. This is shown to us in the second part of today's Gospel, when Jesus ends with the words, "When you have done all you have been commanded, say 'We are unprofitable servants; we have done what we are obliged to do." So what does this rather harsh reply have to do with love? Well, on its own, it really does not have anything to do with it, but let us consider what TRUE LOVE is all about, and how we should act out of love. Christ uses the metaphor of the servant to remind us that we are God's servants and that we can never repay God or approach His level. Yet, unworthy servants that we are, God still calls us to join Him in His eternal plan for our salvation. When we do our part, we must not expect great [additional] rewards; we should act purely out of love. We should say, I do what I do out of love for God, the One who loved us first. When we act out of love like this, it is easier to put our faith into action and to be in touch with Pure Faith. So look out, because there will be a great deal of flying mulberry trees making their way to the sea.

Please keep in your prayers our young people who will be receiving the Sacrament of Confirmation on Saturday October 26 at 11AM and 2:30 PM. This year we are scheduled to have our Ordinary, the Most Rev. John O. Barres the Bishop of Rockville Centre. We look forward to his coming and for his confirming our young people, helping to become full adult members of the Church.


