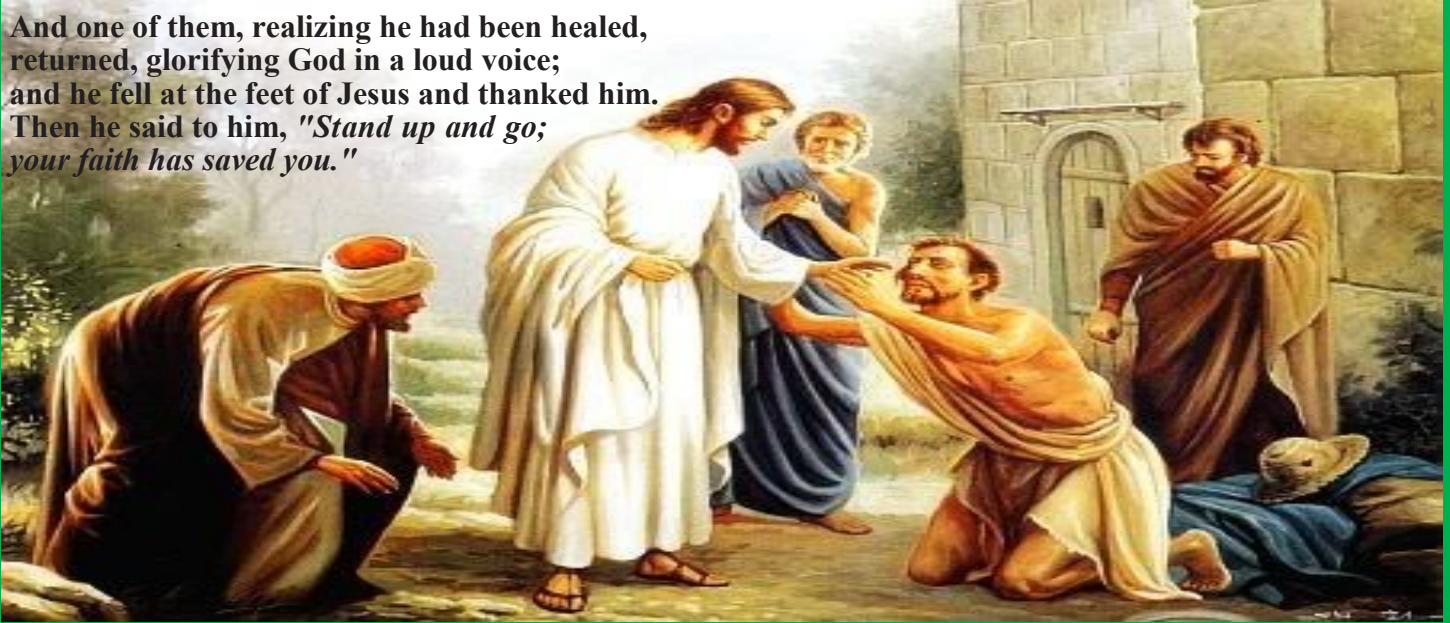

From Fr. Mike's Desk

Thanksgiving Day is a little more than a month away, and I am sure that most of us have already made plans on how and where we will be spending the day. Of course, some of us may still be holding out to see what may develop. Now you may ask, what does Thanksgiving have to do with the 28th Sunday of Ordinary Time? Not much really, except for the fact that today's Gospel reading is the same reading we usually hear proclaimed on Thanksgiving Day. It is the story of the Ten Lepers and it is a very familiar one, many of us know it by heart. We also can see it depicted on one of our church windows.

As we listen to the account, the ten approach Jesus from a distance and cry out for His help. Jesus tells them to go and show themselves to the priest so they could be declared clean according to the Law of Moses. The ten go as Jesus commanded, and on the way to the priest, they realize that Jesus healed them. We assume that they continued on to the priest to be declared clean, because without this they could not reenter the community to return to their families and to their old lives. However, one of the ten goes back to Jesus when he realized he was made whole. This man was a Samaritan, and we know that Jews and Samaritans usually had nothing to do with each other. However, it appears that leprosy provided them with something in common so they overlooked their ancient hatred. Yet this non-Jew came back to Jesus to give thanks, as he realized what God did for him through Jesus. He could not make another move without first giving thanks. It appears that he was more aware of God working in his life than the others.

Naaman, from our first reading, is also a foreigner who realized what God did for him through the words of the Prophet Elisha (with a slight assist from the slave girl). God's cure of Naaman was so powerful that Naaman converted, believing only in the True God of Israel. As we read, "...I will no longer offer holocaust or sacrifice to any other god except the Lord." The great significance of these two foreigners thanking God and clearly seeing God at work in their lives, reminds us that God created us all and that God's love and mercy are freely given to all. As we see in today's Psalm, "All the ends of the earth have seen the salvation by our God. Sing joyfully to the Lord, all you lands; break into songs of praise." This was true of God in the Old Testament and it is most especially true of God in the New

Testament and in the spreading of the Church throughout the world.

Today's readings also challenge us to look at our lives and ask how many times we fail to say thank you to God for all of the good He had done for us in our lives. How often do we thank God for always being present in our lives, always being there to help, comfort and love us more than we can ever love ourselves? As I mentioned above, we have a little more than a month before we celebrate Thanksgiving Day, let us take time to consider what we have to thank God for and how we can encourage others to thank God, just as the slave girl did for Naaman.

Please keep in your prayers our young people who will be receiving the Sacrament of Confirmation on Saturday October 26 at 11AM and 2:30 PM. This year we are scheduled to have our Ordinary, the Most Rev. John O. Barres the Bishop of Rockville Centre. We look forward to his coming and for his confirming our young people, helping to become full adult members of the Church.

If today were not a Sunday we would be celebrating the feast day of our Patron Saint Edward the Confessor. While he did not die on this day, today is the day they remember when they translated his body from one place to another shrine. He was greatly loved by the people of England because he was such a holy and humble man, and it is an honor to have him as the patron saint of our parish family.

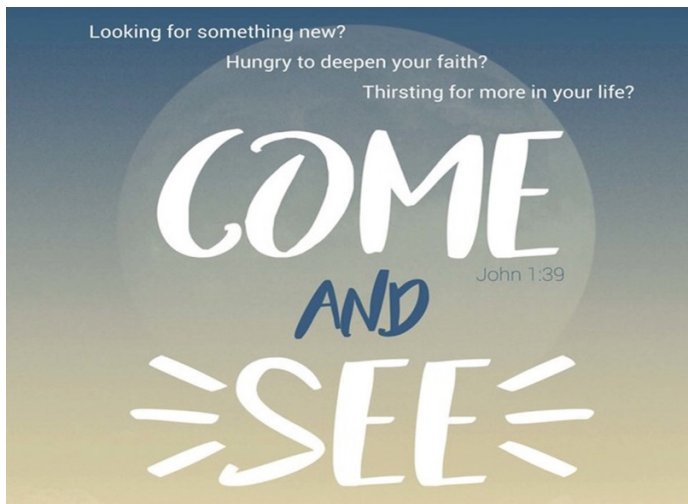

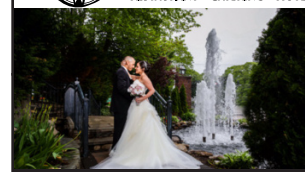

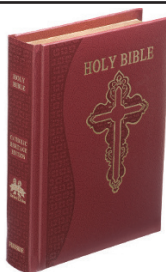
