Twenty-ninth Sunday in Ordinary Time

Reading 1 - Exodus 17:8-13

In those days, Amalek came and waged war against Israel. Moses, therefore, said to Joshua, "Pick out certain men, and tomorrow go out and engage Amalek in battle. I will be standing on top of the hill with the staff of God in my hand." So Joshua did as Moses told him: he engaged Amalek in battle after Moses had climbed to the top of the hill with Aaron and Hur. As long as Moses kept his hands raised up, Israel had the better of the fight, but when he let his hands rest. Amalek had the better of the fight. Moses' hands, however, grew tired; so they put a rock in place for him to sit on. Meanwhile Aaron and Hur supported his hands, one on one side and one on the other, so that his hands remained steady till sunset. And Joshua mowed down Amalek and his people with the edge of the sword.

Gospel - Luke 18:1-8

Jesus told his disciples a parable about the necessity for them to pray always without becoming weary. He said, "There was a judge in a certain town who neither feared God nor respected any human being. And a widow in that town used to come to him and say, 'Render a just decision for me against my adversary.' For a long time the judge was unwilling, but eventually he thought, 'While it is true that I neither fear God nor respect any human being, because this widow keeps bothering me I shall deliver a just decision for her lest she finally come and strike me." The Lord said, "Pay attention to what the dishonest judge says. Will not God then secure the rights of his chosen ones who call out to him day and night? Will he be slow to answer them? I tell you, he will see to it that justice is done for them speedily. But when the Son of Man comes, will he find faith on earth?"

From Fr. Mike's Desk

"Jesus told his disciples a parable about the necessity for them to pray always without becoming See, even two thousand years ago the Disciples of Christ were questioning prayer and asking if it does any good? Sometimes we have all asked that question or have said something like, "Pray, that's all I do is pray and it seems like no one is listening." Or "God answers other people's prayers, but He never seems to answer mine!" Today's readings are given to us to see that both statements are false. Oh sure, I would agree that God does not answer our prayers the way we want them answered, but He will and does answer every prayer we offer. How can we believe that; well just look at the story from the Old Testament. As long as Moses held his arms up in prayer Israel was able to defeat Amalek. However, when he got tired or lowered his arms, Amalek got the better of the fight. While Moses did not utter any words, he knew that God was undeniably with the people if he kept faith in God's promises. So, on that day the prayers of Israel were answered.

Jesus in the parable tells of the unjust judge who decides to rule in the widow's favor. As we are told, he does so, not because he fears God or man, but he is afraid of the widow. A little background will be helpful. This judge is not a Jewish Judge, he is not one who follows the traditions and laws of Israel. In fact, if he did, he would be one of three judges who would hear this case. If this were the case (no pun intended) the widow could even choose one of the judges. No, he is a judge who sits on the bench according to Herod's rule, or he might even be one who was appointed by Rome. That is why he has absolute power. We are made to understand (according to biblical scholars) that the original Greek words of the text translate to tell us that the widow has indeed threatened to use actual physical violence toward the judge. She was not a lady to mess with. So, Jesus tells us that the judge, being a wise man, gives the widow what she wants. Our Lord then goes on to say, if this unjust person would give in to the widow, how much more will a loving God gladly seek to answer our prayers and supplications. So do not give up on prayer Jesus tells us!

But why must we pray so hard sometimes and why does it seem God is not listening? Again, God does listen, and He always answers our prayers, but remember, He listens and answers them according to what He knows what is right and best for us, or

for those we are praying for. God knows that sometimes getting what we ask for or what we want will be harmful in the future days or years ahead. God is not selfish, nor does He seek to harm us. We can only fully understand this when we see things using the eyes of faith. As William Barclay writes in his commentary on today's Gospel, "Only God sees the whole, and therefore, only God knows what is good for us in the long run. That is why Jesus said we must never be discouraged in prayer. That is why he wondered if men's faith would stand the long delays before the Son of Man shall come [return]. We will never grow weary in prayer and our faith will never falter if, after we have offered to God our prayers and request, we add the perfect prayer; Thy will be done.'

We now close with the words Our Savior taught us:

Our Father, who art in heaven,
hallowed be Thy name,
Thy Kingdom come,
Thy will be done on earth,
as it is in heaven.
Give us this day our daily bread.
And forgive us our trespasses,
as we forgive those who trespass again us.
And lead us not into temptation
but deliver us from evil
(For thine is the Kingdom, the Power,
and the Glory, for ever and ever)
Amen.

Aside from the Sacrifice of the Mass this is the most perfect prayer as it comes directly from the Son of God's mouth.

Learn from Vatican II how to see the Church

"Do you love Me? Feed My sheep." These words of Jesus, originally spoken to St Peter, are "also addressed to us, to us as Church," said Pope Francis in his homily at Mass celebrated this past Tuesday, marking the sixtieth anniversary of the opening of the Second Ecumenical Council of the Vatican – Vatican II. In fact, the Pope said, the Council was "one great response" to the Lord's question, "Do you love Me?" "To rekindle her love for the Lord," he said, "the Church, for the first time in her history, devoted a Council to examining herself and reflecting on her nature and mission." Pope Francis then suggested three ways we can learn from the Council to look at the Church, beginning with looking at her from God's point of view, "from on high, with God's eyes, eyes full of love." He warned against looking at the Church from our own point of view, condemning both "progressivism" and "traditionalism" as infidelity, "forms of Pelagian selfishness that puts our own tastes and plans above the love of God."






