Brothers and sisters:

Let us give thanks to the Father, who has made you fit to share in the inheritance of the holy ones in light. He delivered us from the power of darkness and transferred us to the kingdom of his beloved Son, in whom we have redemption, the forgiveness of sins.

He is the image of the invisible God, the firstborn of all creation. For in him were created all things in heaven and on earth, the visible and the invisible, whether thrones or dominions or principalities or powers; all things were created through him and for him. He is before all things, and in him all things hold together. He is the head of the body, the church. He is the beginning, the firstborn from the dead, that in all things he himself might be preeminent. For in him all the fullness was pleased to dwell, and through him to reconcile all things for him, making peace by the blood of his cross through him, whether those on earth or those in heaven.

Gospel - Luke 23:35-43

The rulers sneered at Jesus and said, "He saved others, let him save himself if he is the chosen one, the Christ of God." Even the soldiers jeered at him. As they approached to offer him wine they called out, "If you are King of the Jews, save yourself." Above him there was an inscription that read, "This is the King of the Jews."

Now one of the criminals hanging there reviled Jesus, saying, "Are you not the Christ? Save yourself and us." The other, however, rebuking him, said in reply, "Have you no fear of God, for you are subject to the same condemnation? And indeed, we have been condemned justly, for the sentence we received corresponds to our crimes, but this man has done nothing criminal." Then he said, "Jesus, remember me when you come into your kingdom." He replied to him, "Amen, I say to you, today you will be with me in Paradise."

Next Week's Gospel Question

As we read next week's Gospel, we hear Jesus telling His disciples that Noah listened to God and prepared for what was to come, in order to save his family and himself. Those who were unprepared were carried away by the flood. Jesus therefore admonishes his disciples to stay awake (prepare yourselves)! As you go about the days of your life, how are you preparing yourself and your family for the day when your Lord and Savior will come again? How much time do you have left?

From Fr. Mike's Desk

At the end of chapter three in the Book of Genesis, we read that after Adam and Eve ate of the fruit of the Tree of the Knowledge of Good and Evil, God expelled them from the Garden of Eden. As it is written, "The Lord God therefore banished him from the Garden of Eden, to till the ground from which he had been taken. When He expelled the man, He settled him east of Eden; and He stationed the Cherubim and fiery revolving sword." This account tells us how sin entered the human family, and how humanity was expelled from Paradise.

"Jesus, remember me when You come into Your kingdom.' He replied to him, 'Amen I say to you, today you will be with Me in Paradise." What an answer to a prayer, but this not just an answer for the repentant thief, but for every prayer uttered by humanity. By these words and by the actions of our Savior, God removed the great obstacle which sin placed between God and humanity. God destroyed sin, spiritual death, and the darkness that comes from them, and the Church with the singing of "Alleluia" replaces the sneers of the rulers at the foot of the cross. Jesus the Christ, the King of Kings has saved us, and He did it from the throne of His cross. He opened the gates of heaven and bid us to enter a place far greater than the Garden of Eden. Now the Kingdom of God is open to all who acknowledge Jesus as king of their heart and soul.

Keep in mind, that our King is not one who oppresses anyone or treats us like slaves. Our King does not force Himself on us, no He allows us to choose life with Him. He is indeed a king who wishes to be in a personal relationship with us, even allowing us to call the one who sent Him, Abba/Father.


This is the last Sunday of the Liturgical Year, and it is indeed fitting that we end the year with this acknowledgement of Jesus as our King and the total focus of our lives. As we end this year (just as we do with the end of the secular year) let us look at how far we have grown in the practice of our faith and in our relationship with God. Have we served God with all our heart, soul, mind and in our very being? Have we put ourselves in service to our brothers and sisters? Have we tried our best to avoid sin, have we sought forgiveness of those we have hurt, and have we offered forgiveness to those who have hurt us? After we answer these questions, we will next Sunday, the first Sunday of the liturgical

year, which is the First Sunday of Advent; start the cycle all over again. We hope that in starting again, the new year will be better, and we will have grown. As we light the first Advent candle, we seek to get closer and closer to the world's true light, Jesus our King.

This Thursday, November 24, is Thanksgiving Day, and we will have Mass at a special time, 10:00 AM. Please bring any food items you would like to have blessed for your table. We will bless them at this Mass. On behalf of Fr. Hyacinth, Fr. Celestine, Msgr. Beckmann, Deacons Jim, Barry, and the entire staff of St. Edward's, we wish you and your family a happy and blessed Thanksgiving.


