

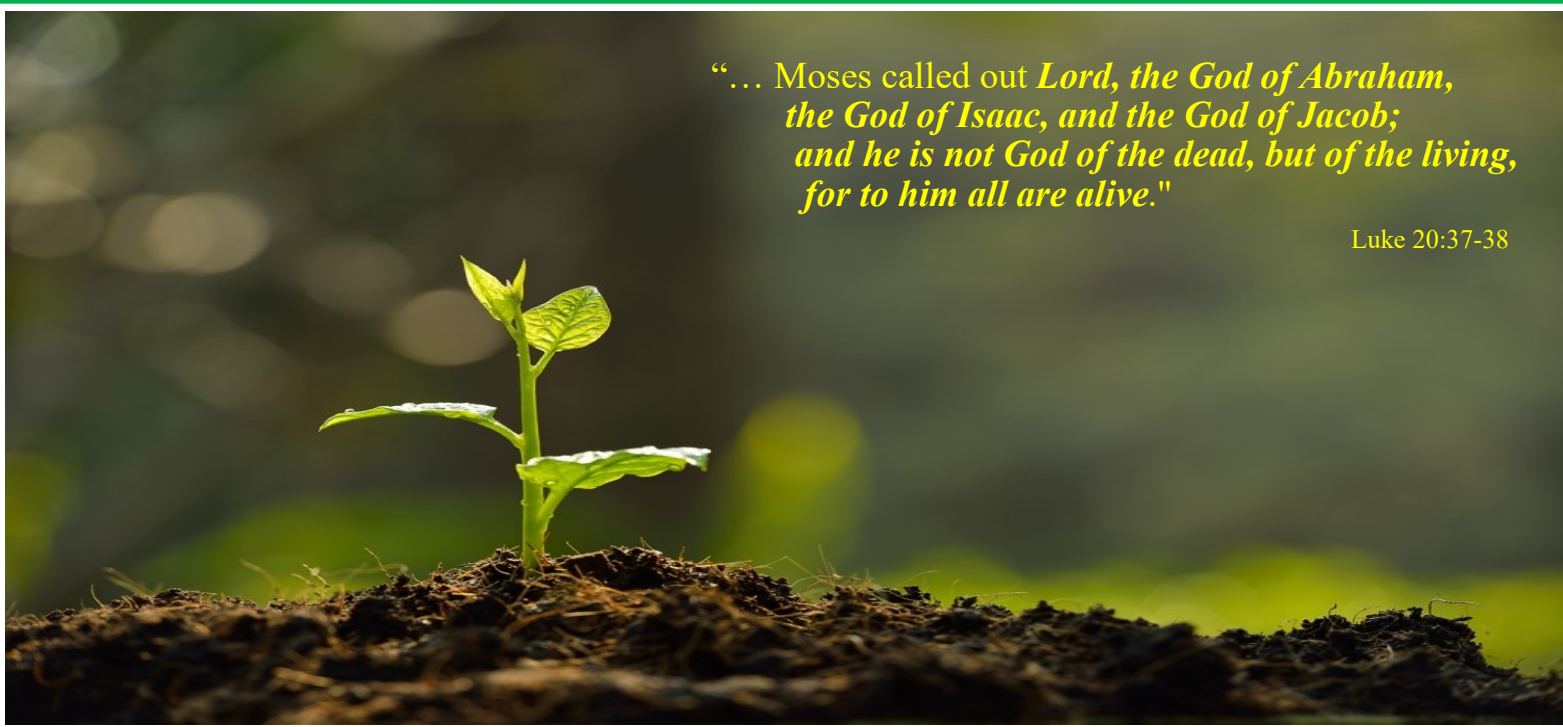

Thirty-second Sunday in Ordinary Time

Reading 1 - 2 Maccabees 7:1-2, 9-14

It happened that seven brothers with their mother were arrested and tortured with whips and scourges by the king, to force them to eat pork in violation of God's law. One of the brothers, speaking for the others, said: "What do you expect to achieve by questioning us? We are ready to die rather than transgress the laws of our ancestors."

At the point of death he said: "You accursed fiend, you are depriving us of this present life, but the King of the world will raise us up to live again forever. It is for his laws that we are dying."

After him the third suffered their cruel sport. He put out his tongue at once when told to do so, and bravely held out his hands, as he spoke these noble words: "It was from Heaven that I received these; for the sake of his laws I disdain them; from him I hope to receive them again." Even the king and his attendants marveled at the young man's courage, because he regarded his sufferings as nothing.

After he had died, they tortured and maltreated the fourth brother in the same way. When he was near death, he said, "It is my choice to die at the hands of men with the hope God gives of being raised up by him; but for you, there will be no resurrection to life."

Reading 2 - 2 Thessalonians 2:16-3:5

Brothers and sisters: May our Lord Jesus Christ himself and God our Father, who has loved us and given us everlasting encouragement and good hope through his grace, encourage your hearts and strengthen them in every good deed and word.

Finally, brothers and sisters, pray for us, so that the word of the Lord may speed forward and be glorified, as it did among you, and that we may be delivered from perverse and wicked people, for not all have faith. But the Lord is faithful; he will strengthen you and guard you from the evil one. We are confident of you in the Lord that what we instruct you, you are doing and will continue to do. May the Lord direct your hearts to the love of God and to the endurance of Christ.

Gospel - Luke 20:27-38

Some Sadducees, those who deny that there is a resurrection, came forward and put this question to Jesus, saying, "Teacher, Moses wrote for us, *If someone's brother dies leaving a wife but no child, his brother must take the wife and raise up descendants for his brother.* Now there were seven brothers; the first married a woman but died childless. Then the second and the third married her, and likewise all the seven died childless. Finally the woman also died. Now at the resurrection whose wife will that woman be? For all seven had been married to her." Jesus said to them, "The children of this age marry and remarry; but those who are deemed worthy to attain to the coming age and to the resurrection of the dead neither marry nor are given in marriage. They can no longer die, for they are like angels; and they are the children of God because they are the ones who will rise. That the dead will rise even Moses made known in the passage about the bush, when he called out 'Lord, the God of Abraham, the God of Isaac, and the God of Jacob; and he is not God of the dead, but of the living, for to him all are alive.'"

Next Week's Gospel Question

In next week's Gospel people are speaking to each other about how "*the temple was adorned with costly stones and votive offerings.*" Jesus overhears the people and tells them that one day the temple will be gone, and that there will be false teachers, calamities, that you will be put at odds with even your own family, and that you will be detained and called to give account for why you are His disciple. Jesus tells them to endure what is to come and promises that in persevering, they will attain something for themselves. What did Jesus promise the people?

From Fr. Mike's Desk

Today's first reading, from *the Second Book of Maccabees* tells us the story of a mother and her heroic sons. We are told that she and her seven sons were arrested and tortured by the Greek King because they refused to follow his pagan rules. As the account continues, we see that each son bravely gave up this life because they knew there was a greater life awaiting them. A life of light and peace and a life in the constant, loving presence of God. In today's Gospel, we are told that Jesus is questioned by Jewish leaders who do not believe in the Resurrection or any other kind of afterlife. The leaders were the *Sadducees*, who represented mostly members of the High Priestly caste. They were a religious and political movement that existed during *the Second Temple Period* and traced themselves back to the Zadokite Priesthood of the First Temple. Some believe that they were instituted to take charge of the Temple after the priests, who were in charge were in league with the Greek Kings, who we read about in the Book of Maccabees. The old priests were thrown out after the rebellion by Judas Maccabee and company and when they re-consecrated the sanctuary there was not enough oil to keep the lamps burning, yet they stayed lit for eight days until new oil arrived. [Today this is celebrated with the observance of Hanukkah.] The Sadducees rejected many views held by their rivals the Pharisees. They did not accept any ideas and customs that came from an Oral Tradition, they believed only in the Torah and in following it literally. They believed strongly in an eye for an eye and a tooth for a tooth but would not invoke the death penalty on the testimony of false or unreliable witnesses; something they seemed quite willing to do when they brought Jesus to trial before them on the first Holy Thursday night. They held to strict Temple practices of sacrifice, especially, that sacrifices should be offered by the priest every day. They were opposed to many ideas held by the Pharisees including the coming of the Messiah, and any divine intervention in the events of mankind's future. Instead, they believed that people had to take total control of everything to survive, which is why they formed alliances with Herod, and Rome so that they could maintain the Jewish state. The Sadducees also did not believe in angels or demons, as they were not found in the Torah or the Talmud, and they certainly did

not believe in the Resurrection from the dead. They ceased to exist as a party when the Romans destroyed the Second Temple in 70 AD.

No, the Sadducees could not accept the Resurrection, so they tried to trap Jesus with this story of the wife who married seven brothers and each one died and then she finally died. They asked Jesus, "*Now, at the resurrection, whose wife will that woman be? For all seven had been married to her?*" Jesus tells them that they are wrong when it comes to the Resurrection, for it is not a continuation of this life, no, it is something completely different. As He tells them, "*They can no longer die, for they are like angels.*" Jesus also tells them that the Resurrection is found in the Torah itself as He relates the story of *Moses and the Burning Bush*. When Moses asks God who He is, God answers that He is the God of Abraham, the God of Isaac, the God of Jacob. As Jesus says, God is the God of the living and not the dead. What we hear today is that the Resurrection from the dead is indeed a reality and something we can all look forward to. But we must be ready for it, we must get out of our lives anything that stands in the way between God and ourselves, between ourselves and others.

This Tuesday is Election Day, make sure you go out to vote. As Christians it is our obligation to fully participate in the electoral process, and to vote for those candidates we believe will best carry out Gospel values and the teachings of the Church. Let us pray to God that the best candidates will be elected and only the best will happen for our town, county, state, country, and the world.

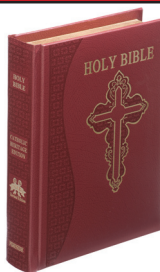
