

From Fr. Mike's Desk

As we get closer to the end of the Liturgical Year (the last day being two weeks from today with the Feast of Christ the King), our gospel readings focus more and more on the Second Coming of Christ, and the life we hope to share in the Resurrection. Today's gospel tells us of the challenge the Sadducees present to Jesus about the nature of the Resurrection. As we read in the account's beginning, they denied the Resurrection of the dead. They denied it because it was not part of the ancient tradition of Judaism. The teaching of the Resurrection entered into the faith of Israel during the time of the Babylonian Captivity: the time when the children of Abraham encountered the ideas of the Zoroastrians.

Theologians believe that God used this encounter with the religion of the Persian Empire, to supply the people of Israel with a vital part of the Divine Revelation. Remember that the Persian understanding was quite different from what Israel gained from the revelation. The Pharisees (who were the descendants of the exiles) believed in the Resurrection and they greeted Jesus warmly because He preached about it. There was a problem however. The Pharisees' understanding was somewhat different from Our Lord's understanding, and what the Church understands today. Therefore, this is part of the motive behind the Sadducees attempt to trap Jesus. They hope that they can prove Him wrong, the Pharisees wrong, and the whole idea of life after death. If they prove the idea wrong and Jesus wrong. He certainly cannot be the Messiah. Nevertheless, they could not prove Him wrong because the Resurrection is not of human conception, but a Divine conception and part of the Divine Revelation. It was part of the Messiah's mission to make it known, especially when Jesus proclaimed the Kingdom of God has arrived.

Unfortunately, many people do not understand the Resurrection from the dead, and this is partly understandable because we have not reached that part of our lives. All of us wonder and question what will it be like, but none of us truly know the answer. Only Christ can tell us, and only Christ can be our role model: as His Resurrection from the dead shows us the total transformation of human life. As He tells us, life in the Resurrection is not a continuation of this life; no, it is something more wonderful than we can ever imagine. If you doubt this, think about the Apostles and those who saw the Risen Lord (especially Saint Paul). They transformed so much that they left their homeland and gained the courage to proclaim openly the Gospel, even if it meant their deaths, and for all but one it did!

We too should allow the Resurrection to transform us, and we can accomplish this by not living just this life. No, we should live this life with our focus on the next life. We must also do our part to build the Kingdom of God here on Earth, so that we can prepare for its fulfillment in Heaven. We ought to pray more often, read the Scriptures, receive the Sacraments and support the good works of the Church. We can do this last thing by becoming more involved with the Church. You could be a Liturgical Minister (Altar Server, Usher, Greeter, Lector, Extraordinary Minister of Holy Communion for at Mass or the Homebound, Hospital or Nursing Homes), you could teach Religious Education, Volunteer for Youth Ministry, join one of the Choirs. You could join the St. Vincent de Paul Society or help at the Parish Social Ministry. You can join our Pre-Cana Ministry or our Lazarus Ministry, which is desperately in need of volunteers. There is so much to be done and not enough to do the work of the Church's Divine Mission.

We close with this Resurrection Prayer: O Risen Lord, the Way, the Truth, and the Life, make us faithful followers of the spirit of Your Resurrection. Grant that we may be inwardly renewed, dying to ourselves in order that You may live in us. May our lives serve as signs of the transforming power of Your love. Use us as Your instruments for the renewal of society, bringing Your life and love to all, and leading them to Your Church. We ask this through ChristOur Risen Lord. Amen.




