Thirty-third Sunday in Ordinary Time

Reading 1 - Malachi 3:19-20a

Lo, the day is coming, blazing like an oven, when all the proud and all evildoers will be stubble, and the day that is coming will set them on fire, leaving them neither root nor branch, says the LORD of hosts. But for you who fear my name, there will arise the sun of justice with its healing rays.

Reading 2 - 2 Thessalonians 3:7-12

Brothers and sisters:

You know how one must imitate us. For we did not act in a disorderly way among you, nor did we eat food received free from anyone. On the contrary, in toil and drudgery, night and day we worked, so as not to burden any of you. Not that we do not have the right. Rather, we wanted to present ourselves as a model for you, so that you might imitate us. In fact, when we were with you, we instructed you that if anyone was unwilling to work, neither should that one eat. We hear that some are conducting themselves among you in a disorderly way, by not keeping busy but minding the business of others. Such people we instruct and urge in the Lord Jesus Christ to work quietly and to eat their own food.

Gospel - Luke 21:5-19

While some people were speaking about how the temple was adorned with costly stones and votive offerings, Jesus said, "All that you see here-- the days will come when there will not be left a stone upon another stone that will not be thrown down."

Then they asked him, "Teacher, when will this happen? And what sign will there be when all these things are about to happen?"

He answered, "See that you not be deceived, for many will come in my name, saying, 'I am he,' and 'The time has come.' Do not follow them! When you hear of wars and insurrections, do not be terrified; for such things must happen first, but it will not immediately be the end." Then he said to them, "Nation will rise against nation, and kingdom against kingdom. There will be powerful earthquakes, famines, and plagues from place to place; and awesome sights and mighty signs will come from the sky.

"Before all this happens, however, they will seize and persecute you, they will hand you over to the synagogues and to prisons, and they will have you led before kings and governors because of my name. It will lead to your giving testimony. Remember, you are not to prepare your defense beforehand, for I myself shall give you a wisdom in speaking that all your adversaries will be powerless to resist or refute. You will even be handed over by parents, brothers, relatives, and friends, and they will put some of you to death. You will be hated by all because of my name, but not a hair on your head will be destroyed. By your perseverance you will secure your lives."

Next Week's Gospel Question

In next week's Gospel we find Jesus crucified, and subject to the same fate as the two condemned criminals hanging nearby. While one criminal asks Jesus to use His power to save them all from a horrible death, the other criminal acknowledges Jesus' innocence of any crime, and asks only to be remembered by Jesus when he enters His kingdom. What do you think separates one criminal from the other?

From Fr. Mike's Desk

Perhaps in your study of World History you might have heard of the Great Wall of China, the Wall of Hadrian, or the infamous Maginot Line. These were constructed so they could offer protection. The Emperor of China built the Great Wall to keep out invaders, the emperor Hadrian had his wall built to keep out non-Romans from the English settlements, and then there was the Maginot Line. The French built it following the First World War to keep out invaders who might try to pass through the lowlands. The line was the strongest fortifications in the world when it was constructed in 1939. All these fortifications worked for a time, however, the people they were intended to keep out came through. This was not the case with the Maginot Line because it was never put to the test. The Germans simply went around the line and came into France through the Ardennes Forest (which everybody thought was impossible for tanks, and since the line had guns facing the lowlands, they could not stop the invaders).

And now we come to the Temple of Jerusalem, which was adorned with costly stones and votive offerings. The Great Temple, which the people of Israel 2,000 years ago believed would be their salvation and strength. After all, the Temple was God's special dwelling place on earth, and God would never allow anything to destroy it or the nation that supported it. Many believed that it had a type of magic or power. Yet, what does the Son of God say about the temple! "All you see here - the day will come when there will not be left a stone upon another stone that will not be thrown down." The Great Temple would not be able to prevent nor escape the approaching danger, and in 70AD we see the Temple destroyed by the Roman General Titus, Emperor Vespasian's son. This structure, no matter how holy, could not

protect them, as the only dependable protection was and is God. Walls cannot keep death and destruction from coming, nor can they protect anyone from the death and destruction brought on by sin. Only God, who sent His only Son can protect us from sin and the death that comes from it. Only Christ can lead the soul to eternal life, and only Christ will protect us against a world that does not want to hear the Gospel. Even when family members put us to the test, God will be there to help us with what to say and do. As we read, "You will be hated by all because of my name, but not a hair on your will be destroyed. perseverance you will secure your lives." Even the Prophet Malachi suggests this with the closing line from the first reading; "But for you who fear my name, there will arise the sun of justice with its healing rays."

Keep this in mind anytime life seems too hard to bear! Keep this in mind anytime you read the papers or watch the news and hear about destruction, wars, and natural disaster and think that nothing can be done or that God has abandoned us! He has not and with His help, we can try to change the terrible things that keep on happening.

God bless you always and thank you for all you do for Saint Edwards!


