We Must Pray Always

During his General Audience this past Wednesday, Pope Francis spoke on the importance of focusing on the quality of *perseverance* in prayer. Jesus Himself, the Pope said, “has given an example of continual prayer, practiced *perseveringly*.” “The teaching of the Gospel is clear,” says Pope Francis: “We need to pray always, even when everything seems vain.” Even when it is difficult to pray, and even when it seems God is not listening, it is necessary to persevere in prayer. “During those nights, the one who prays is never alone,” Jesus is always present with those who pray, welcoming us “in His prayer, so that we might pray in Him and through Him. This is the work of the Holy Spirit.”

The Readings for the Thirty-third Sunday in Ordinary Time

Reading 1 - Proverbs 31:10-13, 19-20, 30-31

When one finds a worthy wife, her value is far beyond pearls. Her husband, entrusting his heart to her, has an unending prize. She brings him good, and not evil, all the days of her life. She obtains wool and flax and works with loving hands. She puts her hands to the distaff, and her fingers ply the spindle. She reaches out her hands to the poor, and extends her arms to the needy. Charm is deceptive and beauty fleeting; the woman who fears the LORD is to be praised. Give her a reward for her labors, and let her works praise her at the city gates.

Reading 2 – 1 Thessalonians 5:1-6

Concerning times and seasons, brothers and sisters, you have no need for anything to be written to you. For you yourselves know very well that the day of the Lord will come like a thief at night. When people are saying, "Peace and security," then sudden disaster comes upon them, like labor pains upon a pregnant woman, and they will not escape. But you, brothers and sisters, are not in darkness, for that day to overtake you like a thief. For all of you are children of the light and children of the day. We are not of the night or of darkness. Therefore, let us not sleep as the rest do, but let us stay alert and sober.

Gospel – Matthew 25:14-30

Jesus told his disciples this parable: "A man going on a journey called in his servants and entrusted his possessions to them. To one he gave five talents; to another, two; to a third, one--to each according to his ability. Then he went away. Immediately the one who received five talents went and traded with them, and made another five. Likewise, the one who received two made another two. But the man who received one went off and dug a hole in the ground and buried his master's money.

"After a long time the master of those servants came back and settled accounts with them. The one who had received five talents came forward bringing the additional five. He said, 'Master, you gave me five talents. See, I have made five more.' His master said to him, 'Well done, my good and faithful servant. Since you were faithful in small matters, I will give you great responsibilities. Come, share your master's joy.' Then the one who had received two talents also came forward and said, 'Master, you gave me two talents. See, I have made two more.' His master said to him, 'Well done, my good and faithful servant. Since you were faithful in small matters, I will give you great responsibilities. Come, share your master's joy.' Then the one who had received the one talent came forward and said, 'Master, I knew you were a demanding person, harvesting where you did not plant and gathering where you did not scatter; so out of fear I went off and buried your talent in the ground. Here it is back.' His master said to him in reply, 'You wicked, lazy servant! So you knew that I harvest where I did not plant and gather where I did not scatter? Should you not then have put my money in the bank so that I could have got it back with interest on my return? Now then! Take the talent from him and give it to the one with ten. For to everyone who has, more will be given and he will grow rich; but from the one who has not, even what he has will be taken away. And throw this useless servant into the darkness outside, where there will be wailing and grinding of teeth.'"

From Fr. Mike's Desk

“So, you knew that I harvest where I did not plant and gather where I did not scatter? Should you not have put my money in the bank... throw this useless servant in the darkness outside where there will be wailing and grinding of teeth.”

These words, or those like them are not the words any of us want to hear from God. None of us wants to be told that God thinks we are wicked and lazy servants, who have done absolutely nothing with the gifts He has given us, the gifts given to us by our Lord Jesus Christ through the power and grace of the Holy Spirit. We may ask, what gifts? I do not believe that I have been given any special gifts or talents. Well, Jesus is not speaking about an ability to sing or dance or play a musical instrument. Nor is he speaking about a great ability to write or paint, or to be good with numbers. While these are indeed great talents, and we should use them to the best of our ability, these are not the talents Jesus is referring to in this parable.

Jesus is speaking about the gifts of Faith, Holiness, Love and Salvation. He is talking about the gifts of the Holy Spirit. And the gifts of receiving Jesus in Word and Sacrament. These are the gifts which each of us have been freely given by God from before we even came upon the world stage. When Jesus tells this story, He is using the example of talents (in this case a unit of wealth) to make a tangible point. So, when Jesus tells us about the first and second servants, who go out and double what they have been given, He is speaking about how they did their part to increase and build up the Kingdom of God - how they did their part to draw more people closer to Christ. As we look at the first servant, he was given more than the others and likewise brought back more, and as we look at the second servant we see he was given a little less than the first but he still brought back double of what he was given. They were each given the proper amount according to their abilities to use the talents God gave them.

Now we come to the third servant, he was given less because he used his gifts poorly, yet he was given a chance to make his gifts grow. However, he did nothing with the talents given to him, as we are told he did not even think of putting the money in the bank, where he would get interest. He thought that if he told his master that he was afraid, all would be right. Nothing could

be more wrong. God does not want to hear from us that we were paralyzed by fear, especially when God gives us everything to fight all fear. Likewise, He does not want to hear that I did not know what to do, so I did nothing. God's answer to that would be, what do you mean you did not know what to do, I told you everything you need to do and know in the **Gospels, the Beatitudes, and the Corporal and Spiritual Works of Mercy**. Jesus would add, I have empowered my Living Body the Church to teach and guide and to be the custodian of *the Great Deposit of Faith*, from Pope Peter to Pope Francis. Now keep in mind that God is not asking us to do this alone, we are being asked to do this all together as members of the Church.

The Church is that which is spoken of in the Book of Proverbs, for she is truly **the Worthy Wife** who will receive her reward for her labors in God's Kingdom. Since we are the Church, we are the spouse of Our Lord who is challenging us this week to do our part everyday and to use what God has given us always. We are not to procrastinate because we do not have all the time in the world, as St. Paul reminds us, *“For yourselves know very well that the day of the Lord will come like a thief at night.”* *“Therefore, let us not sleep as the rest do, but let us stay alert and sober.”*

Fr. Mike's Letter for Week 34 of the Corona Virus Crisis

The following letter was posted last week, prior to The 32nd Sunday in Ordinary Time, on the St. Edward's website as well as on Flocknote.

We have entered the 11th month of 2020. This month of November has many important days for us to remember. For example, this week we just completed remembering All Saints Day and All Souls Day, and on Tuesday Election Day. Thanks to COVID19, and some of the fears that it created, voting was done differently in many places. We have seen that people could vote early, or they could apply for an Absentee Ballot, that in the past required a valid reason to receive it. Many people sent their Ballots through the mail or dropped them off in Ballot Boxes located throughout the area. So, as you read this message, we may still not know who was elected, another thing to try our patience.

November also features many Saints Days, who were very important in spreading the faith, as well as effecting the foundation of the Church. These people and events are well worth paying attention to, so as an assignment I am asking you to look them up. One day that stands out in November is Veterans' Day which we commemorate on the 11th. This day used to be called Armistice Day, because it was on this day that the fighting ended for World War I. This day was chosen because it was the feast day of Saint Martin of Tours, who is a Patron Saint of France and Soldiers. So, the armistice was signed on the 11th day of the 11th month, at the 11th hour. While World War I ended more than 100 years ago, we still remember this day, only now we changed this day to remember all our Veterans. All who fought or served in our nation's wars or conflicts especially remembering those who made the ultimate sacrifice. Let us always keep them in our prayers and pray for an end of all war, and hopefully obtain a victory in the peace and grace of Our Lord Jesus Christ!

At the end of this month we will celebrate Thanksgiving Day. This year many of us will not feel like giving thanks after all that has been hurled at us during this past year. However, we must try not to focus on the terrible things that have happened or that we have been forced to endure. Try instead to look at the good things we have experienced and received. Please keep in mind, that many more people will need help from Parish Social Ministry and our Saint Vincent DePaul Society Chapter here at St. Edward's. If you can help with food donations, buying gift cards (when we put out the giving tree) or making a monetary donation to St. Vincent De Paul, it will assist so many people. 
