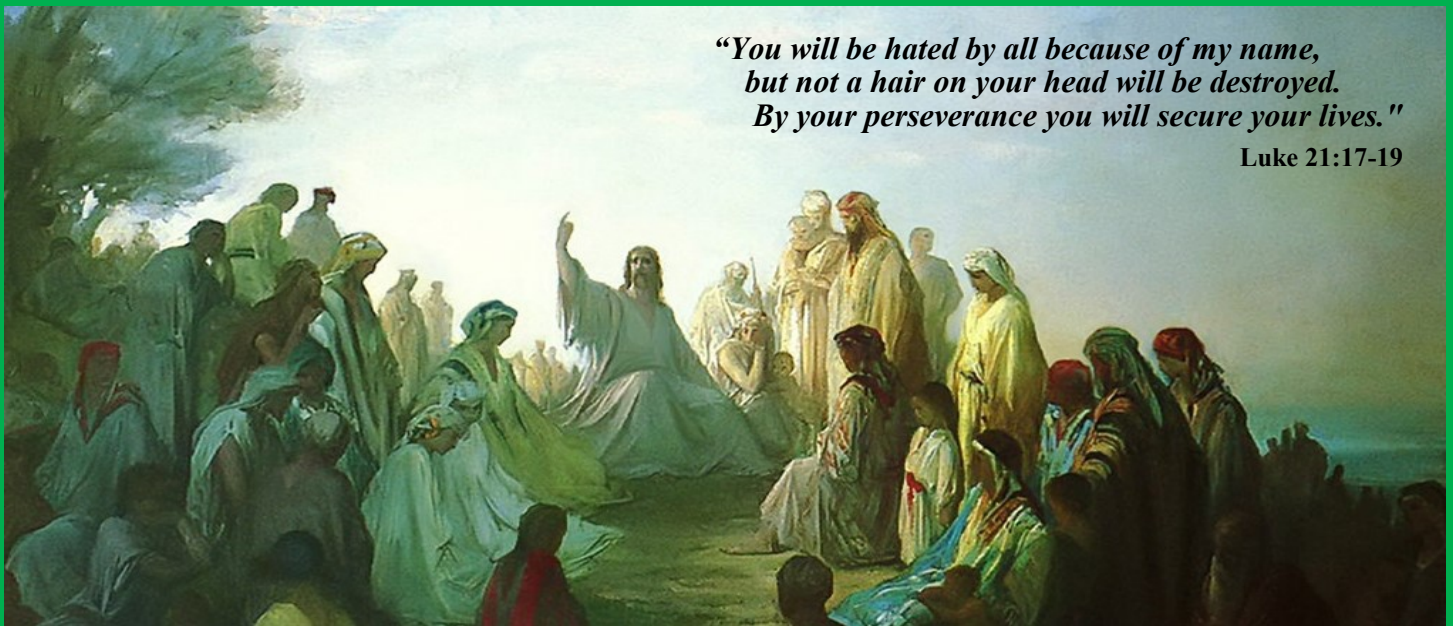

From Fr. Mike's Desk

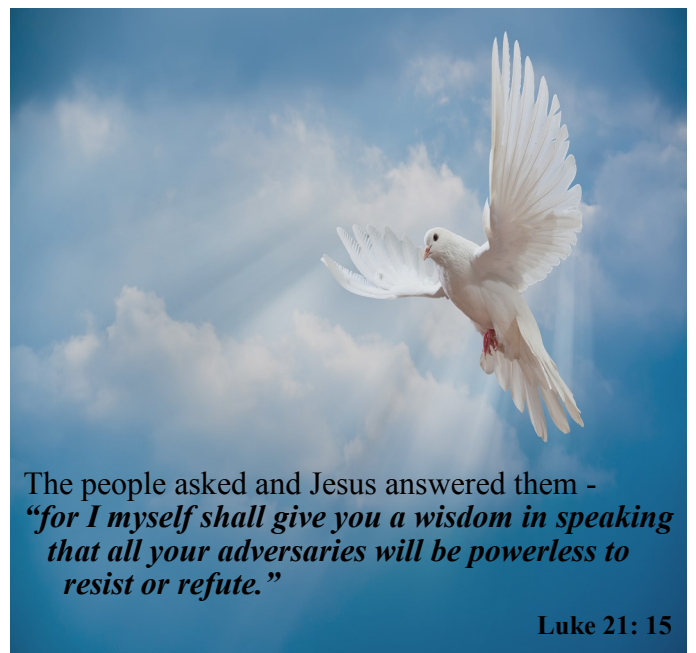
“Jesus said, ‘All that you see here-the days will come when there will not be left a stone upon another stone...’ Then they asked him, ‘Teacher, when will this happen?’ He answered, ‘See that you not be deceived, for many will come in my name...Do not follow them! ‘...Nation will rise against nation...There will be powerful earthquakes, famines and plagues...Before all this happens, however, they will seize you and persecute you, they will hand you over to the synagogues and to prisons...because of my name...Remember you are not to prepare your defense beforehand, for I myself shall give you wisdom...that all your adversaries will be powerless to resist or refute.’”

Jesus, what are you telling us? You are painting a terrible picture, and if the events you are sharing with us are unavoidable why should we go on? Why should we bother to preach and live out the good news, if these things are going to happen anyway? Where is the good news? Well there is one very good reason why we should carry on; Jesus tells us to go out and preach. We also should do it because Jesus tells us that He is going to be with us throughout the whole ordeal so there is no reason to give into despair or fear. Our Lord is even going to tell us what to say, and by our perseverance, we will indeed secure our own lives in this world and the world to come. In the end, this Gospel reading is one of joy and hope, because we will receive the constant assurance of divine support and guidance that will lead us into the Kingdom of Heaven. Thus, it is up to us to live according to the Gospel so we do not fall prey to the powers of destruction that would rob us of Eternal Life.

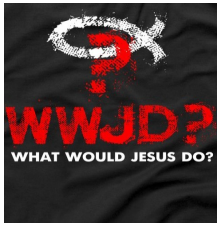

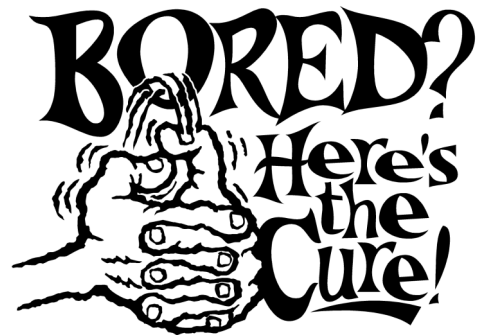
