The Readings for the Second Sunday of Advent

Reading 1 - Baruch 5: 1-9

Jerusalem, take off your robe of mourning and misery; put on the splendor of glory from God forever: wrapped in the cloak of justice from God, bear on your head the mitre that displays the glory of the eternal name. For God will show all the earth your splendor: you will be named by God forever the peace of justice, the glory of God's worship.

Up, Jerusalem! stand upon the heights; look to the east and see your children gathered from the east and the west at the word of the Holy One, rejoicing that they are remembered by God. Led away on foot by their enemies they left you: but God will bring them back to you borne aloft in glory as on royal thrones. For God has commanded that every lofty mountain be made low, and that the age-old depths and gorges be filled to level ground, that Israel may advance secure in the glory of God. The forests and every fragrant kind of tree have overshadowed Israel at God's command; for God is leading Israel in joy by the light of his glory, with his mercy and justice for company.

Brothers and sisters:

I pray always with joy in my every prayer for all of you, because of your partnership for the gospel from the first day until now. I am confident of this, that the one who began a good work in you will continue to complete it until the day of Christ Jesus. God is my witness, how I long for all of you with the affection of Christ Jesus. And this is my prayer: that your love may increase ever more and more in knowledge and every kind of perception, to discern what is of value, so that you may be pure and blameless for the day of Christ, filled with the fruit of righteousness that comes through Jesus Christ for the glory and praise of God.

Gospel – Luke 3:1-6

In the fifteenth year of the reign of Tiberius Caesar, when Pontius Pilate was governor of Judea, and Herod was tetrarch of Galilee, and his brother Philip tetrarch of the region of Ituraea and Trachonitis, and Lysanias was tetrarch of Abilene, during the high priesthood of Annas and Caiaphas, the word of God came to John the son of Zechariah in the desert. John went throughout the whole region of the Jordan, proclaiming a baptism of repentance for the forgiveness of sins, as it is written in the book of the words of the prophet Isaiah:

A voice of one crying out in the desert:

"Prepare the way of the Lord,
make straight his paths.

Every valley shall be filled
and every mountain and hill shall be made low.

The winding roads shall be made straight,
and the rough ways made smooth,
and all flesh shall see the salvation of God."

From Fr. Mike's Desk

"Jerusalem, take off your robe of mourning and misery: put on the splendor of glory from God forever..." The Prophet Baruch, in our first reading, is calling for Jerusalem, Israel, and the world to rejoice. Take off your robe of mourning and misery and put on the splendor of the Lord. This is the call of the second Sunday of Advent. It calls us to turn away from anything that overwhelms us or interferes with our relationship with God. The misery is taken away in the event we will celebrate on the 25th. However, the Lord has been taking away our misery every day and will continue to do so until He comes again in full glory.

The events of today's Gospel also gives us and the people of 2000 years ago reason to be joyful. Today's Gospel gives us our first Advent glance of St. John the Baptist. Luke places him in time by telling us who the Emperor, the Governor and the King were at that time. The evangelist is giving us more than a history lesson, for he is showing us that in the fullness of time the divine plan for salvation came into the world. He is also showing us that salvation did not come through the powerful people just mentioned, but through a member of the people held captive by Rome and abused by Herod. The one sent was meek and mild, and John was sent before Him to announce His coming. John like Baruch, was telling the people that prophecy was about to be fulfilled, especially the words of the Prophet Isaiah that he would be the "Voice crying out in the wilderness..." During this second week of Advent, we are still focusing on Christ's second coming, which like the first coming, will come in the fullness of God's time, and during this week we are asked to follow the example of John. We are asked to prepare the way of the Lord, for those who want to listen and especially for those who don't. If all of us can follow John's example, the Gospel will constantly be lived out and achieve its goal to prepare souls for the coming of the Lord.

This Wednesday December 8th is the Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception of the Blessed Virgin Mary, and it is a Holy Day of Obligation. We will celebrate Mass on Tuesday the 7th at 5PM, and on Wednesday the 8th at 9AM, 12:10 PM and 7PM. On the night of the 8th, we will also participate in the National Night of Prayer for Life. We will start at 9PM with the exposition of the Blessed Sacrament and praying a decade of the

Rosary. This will continue to 1AM December 9th with Benediction and reposing of the Blessed Sacrament. During each hour we will pray a decade of the Rosary, other prayers, and some quiet time. Come for one hour or all four, spend some time in prayer praying for the end of abortion and the taking of all innocent human life.

We close with this prayer for the Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception as we honor our Dear Blessed Mother the patron saint of the United States of America.

Father, you prepared the Virgin Mary to be a worthy mother of your Son. You let her share beforehand in the salvation Christ would bring by His death and kept her sinless from the first moment of her conception. Help us by her prayers to live in your presence without sin. We ask this through our Lord Jesus Christ, your Son who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, God forever and ever. Amen



Once the Mass is over, we kindly ask all parishioners to return the missals to the book carts in the gathering area of the church. Please do not leave the missals in the pews.

Aside from the convenience of being a self-contained hardcover missal, it will last much longer. It also comes at considerable savings over the financial cost of the former missalettes, volunteer labor, and is an environmentally friendly solution.


