#### Reading 2 - Hebrews 1:1-6

Brothers and sisters: In times past, God spoke in partial and various ways to our ancestors through the prophets; in these last days, he has spoken to us through the Son, whom he made heir of all things and through whom he created the universe, who is the refulgence of his glory, the very imprint of his being, and who sustains all things by his mighty word. When he had accomplished purification from sins, he took his seat at the right hand of the Majesty on high, as far superior to the angels as the name he has inherited is more excellent than theirs. For to which of the angels did God ever say: You are my son; this day I have begotten you? Or again: I will be a father to him, and he shall be a son to me?

And again, when he leads the firstborn into the world, he says: Let all the angels of God worship him.

#### Gospel - John 1:1-18

In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God. He was in the beginning with God. All things came to be through him, and without him nothing came to be. What came to be through him was life, and this life was the light of the human race; the light shines in the darkness, and the darkness has not overcome it. A man named John was sent from God. He came for testimony, to testify to the light, so that all might believe through him. He was not the light, but came to testify to the light. The true light, which enlightens everyone, was coming into the world. He was in the world, and the world came to be through him, but the world did not know him. He came to what was his own, but his own people did not accept him.

But to those who did accept him he gave power to become children of God, to those who believe in his name, who were born not by natural generation nor by human choice nor by a man's decision but of God. And the Word became flesh and made his dwelling among us, and we saw his glory, the glory as of the Father's only Son, full of grace and truth. John testified to him and cried out, saying, "This was he of whom I said, 'The one who is coming after me ranks ahead of me because he existed before me." From his fullness we have all received, grace in place of grace, because while the law was given through Moses, grace and truth came through Jesus Christ. No one has ever seen God. The only Son, God, who is at the Father's side, has revealed him.

#### **Next Week's Gospel Question**

In the Gospel of Luke we hear that the shepherds went to Bethlehem to find the infant Jesus after receiving a message (from the Angel of the Lord). Upon arriving at the manger the shepherds spoke of the message which had been told to them by the Angel, and all who heard it were amazed. The shepherds then left, glorifying and praising God.

Having witnessed Jesus' presence and having rejoiced in God being with us on Christmas day, will we now go out into the world as the shepherds did, spreading the message and glorifying and praising God for all that we have heard and seen?

#### From Fr. Mike's Desk

I shared this story a few years ago, about this Norwegian Legend. The Legend is the story called the Night the Animals Talked, and it draws children (and childlike adults) to stalls and stables throughout Norway every Christmas Eve. They are all hoping to see a miracle like the one described in the Legend. This is how the story goes. According to accounts, Christ's birth occurred exactly at midnight inside the stable, and while this was happening the animals watched in wonder as the newborn baby was lovingly wrapped in swaddling clothes and placed in a manger. Suddenly, God gave voice to the animals, and they began to praise God for the miracle they had just seen. This went on for several minutes, and just before the entrance of the shepherds, who had hurried to the stable because the angels had told them about the Messiah's birth. When they arrived, the animals went silent, and the only humans who heard them were Jesus, Mary, and Joseph. This Legend of the Talking Animals persists to this day in Scandinavia, and as stated above, wide-eyed children creep into stables just before midnight to hear the animals praise God for the wondrous birth of His Son. Adults scoff at this, and say it is an old wife's tale, and the children should be in bed at midnight instead of waiting for a cow to preach a Christmas sermon. Yet, the children know or at least believe, that the animals really do praise God every Christmas Eve. Who of us, who believe in an all-powerful God, can say that it really does not happen!

As we celebrate Christmas Day today, and the Feast of the Holy Family this Friday (because Christmas is falling on a Sunday this year) we remember what this great season is all about. It is about the birth of Jesus at Bethlehem and our re-birth to a new and eternal life. On Friday, we will read the account of how the Holy Family fled into Egypt to escape Herod's command to kill all male children two years old and younger. We know that Jesus, Mary, and Joseph existed like any other family with troubles and trials, but they knew happiness and joy. We also know that Jesus experienced a full human life, so that being one of us, He could fully transform us. This is the greatest gift God has given to us, after our physical life and the gift of our spiritual and eternal life. We could not have realized this gift on our own since we lost so much by the sin of Adam. God would not allow any chaos caused by sin to keep us away from Him and He does this by giving us the gift of His only Son, who saved us by His life, death, and

resurrection. So, if God could transform us through the wondrous gift we celebrate today, just maybe the animals did speak and do speak every Christmas Eve.

We close with the following prayer from Christmas Mass during the night; Grant us, we pray, O Lord our God, that we are gladdened by participation in the feast of our Redeemer's Nativity, may through an honorable way of life become worthy of union with Him. Who lives and reigns for ever and ever.



#### PARISH SOCIAL MINISTRY

#### Where there is kindness there is goodness; where there is goodness there is God.

The kindness of the parishioners of St. Edward Confessor Church and the Syosset community has changed the lives of so many here in Syosset and beyond. For many of our pantry families, the increasing cost of living has made their difficult life circumstances more of a burden. Between the financial hardship and ongoing health related issues, life leaves them feeling hopeless and abandoned by God. The volunteers in both the Parish Social Ministry and our St. Vincent DePaul Conference help the less fortunate to witness the goodness of God. One gentleman who we have help at both the pantry and SVdP conference wrote to us, "I can't thank you enough for all the kindness and warmth that you have given me over the many months. A million blessings on all of you. Thank you."

Let me share with you how we are able to continuously help others in need and the ways we are helping them. At the food pantry, we are currently providing assistance to 76 families and 26 individuals. Throughout the year, with your help and from Island Harvest, we are able to weekly provide nutritious food and basic needs items. We receive a tremendous amount of assistance from members of our Syosset community holding food drives and making monetary donations: Syosset Woodbury Chamber of Commerce, Mid-Island Jewish Center, parishioners from Holy Name of Jesus, the non-profit group J.E.T.S. of America, staff, students and parents from all the Syosset Public Schools, Our Lady of Mercy Academy, St. Edward Confessor School, and Boy Scouts Troop 205. There are several neighbors who heard about our pantry and regularly drop off food and basic need items as well as make significant monetary donations. They hear the voices of the poor and want to help. God is good, all the time.

At Christmas, Easter, Back to School and Thanksgiving, each family receives gift cards to make their own purchases as well as grocery cards as needed. For Christmas, the families are given a choice of a frozen lasagna dinner, turkey, ham or chicken. Parents are able to select toys from our toy drive. At Thanksgiving, they receive a choice of a turkey or chicken with all the trimmings and homemade pumpkin bread or fresh made rolls. They can select a coat for each family member from our yearly coat drive. This year, there was a nice selection of brand new coats, gloves and hats for the children. Our back to school drive provides each student with a backpack filled with all the necessary school supplies. At Easter, we distributed many Easter baskets. Just as it is important for us to receive your generous donations, it is also important for us to give, we donate food and other items to St. John of God in Islip when we are able. Where there is goodness there is God.

The kindness of the parishioners continues to change lives by comforting someone who is sick or grieving, by prayer and with handmade prayer shawls. We are so fortunate to have parishioners who continue to volunteer their time to bring communion to the sick in Syosset Hospital, the elderly living in the nearby nursing homes and the homebound. We returned to Cold Spring Hills Nursing Home last year with a small group of dedicated volunteers, residents warmly welcome us and greeted us with joy to receive Jesus and hear the Word of God. We have an amazing outreach ministry here at St. Edward Confessor Church; every volunteer works tirelessly to give of their time to help our neighbors in need.

Parishioners, because of your kindness, your soul has found a place in the hearts of those whose daily lives are a struggle and it is truly a shelter fortified with gratitude. Thank you!

May God's love surround you at Christmas and always.




