Reading 1 - Sirach 3:2-6, 12-14

God sets a father in honor over his children; a mother's authority he confirms over her sons. Whoever honors his father atones for sins, and preserves himself from them.

And over all these put on love, that is, the bond of

perfection. And let the peace of Christ control your hearts, the peace into which you were also called in one body. And be thankful. Let the word of Christ dwell in you richly, as in all wisdom you teach and admonish one another, singing psalms, hymns, and spiritual songs with gratitude in your hearts to God. And whatever you do, in word or in deed, do everything in the name of the Lord Jesus, giving thanks to God the Father through him.

Wives, be subordinate to your husbands, as is proper in the Lord. Husbands, love your wives, and avoid any bitterness toward them. Children, obey your parents in everything, for this is pleasing to the Lord. Fathers, do not provoke your children, so they may not become discouraged.

Gospel – Luke 2:41-52

Each year Jesus' parents went to Jerusalem for the feast of Passover, and when he was twelve years old, they went up according to festival custom. After they had completed its days, as they were returning, the boy Jesus remained behind in Jerusalem, but his parents did not know it. Thinking that he was in the caravan, they journeyed for a day and looked for him among their relatives and acquaintances, but not finding him, they returned to Jerusalem to look for him. After three days they found him in the temple, sitting in the midst of the teachers, listening to them and asking them questions, and all who heard him were astounded at his understanding and his answers. When his parents saw him, they were astonished, and his mother said to him, "Son, why have you done this to us? Your father and I have been looking for you with great anxiety." And he said to them, "Why were you looking for me? Did you not know that I must be in my Father's house?" But they did not understand what he said to them. He went down with them and came to Nazareth, and was obedient to them; and his mother kept all these things in her heart. And Jesus advanced in wisdom and age and favor before God and man.

From Fr. Mike's Desk

Way back in 1990 (31 years ago) one of the popular Christmas films in circulation was *Home* **Alone**. It is still a holiday favorite, and it was so popular that it spun off a sequel, which was not so successful. If you know the film, you will recall that the plot surrounds an eight-year-old boy named Kevin and his family. The whole extended family was planning a holiday trip to Paris, and they were all excited. The day before the flight everyone arrives at Kevin's house and there is nothing but confusion. Kevin is picked on by his older brother Buzz, and so to escape goes up to the third floor of the house. While he is there, he sulks and wished that his whole family, especially Buzz, would disappear. As luck would have it, there was a power failure the night before and so the alarm clocks did not go off as planned. When the family realizes what the time really is, they rush around because they are afraid of missing their flight. So, hurriedly they pack up what they need, leave the house, and make it to the airport on time. However, because of all this they do not realize that they left Kevin behind, who was by himself on the third floor. Now Kevin wakes up and finds his whole family gone, and at first, he thinks his wish had come true, but eventually he regrets his wish and prays for his family to return. As for the rest of his family, his mother Kate keeps saying "I think I am forgetting something!" Her husband and the rest of the adults tell her not to worry and they have everything they need. When they are in the air, and it is too late to do anything about it, she realizes what she forgot and she yells out in terror, "Kevin!" The parents on their part make every effort to get back home once they land in Paris, but only Kate can get on the next flight back. Kevin, on his part, enjoys being alone for a while until he encounters the Wet Bandits.

In a way, this type of story is just like the account we are reading about in today's Gospel, when Joseph and Mary realize that their 12-year-old son, Jesus is not with them on the journey back to Nazareth. When they realize He is missing, they make a frantic rush back to Jerusalem even though it was quite dangerous. When they arrive in the Holy City, they have no idea were to start looking for their Son. After a few days, they find Him in the Temple speaking to the scribes and elders, who were totally amazed about the wisdom and knowledge this boy possessed. When His parents hear His voice, they

are overjoyed, likewise they are upset, so they ask Jesus why He put them through this ordeal. Now, I am sure that Jesus did not want to make them worry, but instead of offering an apology, He says to them, "Why were you looking for me everywhere, didn't you know that I must be in my Father's House?" How many parents would appreciate an answer like that? How would you react if your 12-year-old answered you like that or even pulled this kind of stunt? Do not answer now, and please note the time of confessions to handle the answers you just made. Yet Mary and Joseph did not react as most parents would because His answer reminds them of His true origins. On this Sunday after Christmas, when we focus on the Holy Family, we are not looking at a family without problems, no, we are looking at a totally human family just like other families, like yours. But this family has God in its midst, in the person of Jesus, but so does your family. Perhaps not in the same way, but Jesus is always with us, and we are always members of His family.

We close with this prayer; Father, help us to live as the Holy Family, united in respect and love. Bring us to the joy and peace of your eternal home. Grant this through Our Lord Jesus Christ your Son, who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, God forever and ever. Amen.

New York State - Important Update to Mask Mandate

Dear Brothers:

The New York State website FAQ's that accompany the Governor's directives regarding masks now includes "houses of worship".

Therefore, since Churches will **not** be requiring parishioners to present proof of vaccination, we ask that the following announcement be clearly communicated to parishioners through your normal means of communication:

"The Governor of New York State has included houses of worship in her recent directives. Therefore, since the Church does not require parishioners to present proof of vaccination in order to worship God, we ask that all parishioners (two years of age and older) comply with the requirement to wear masks when participating in any activities on parish grounds. This State requirement is currently in effect through January 15, 2022. We will continue to adapt accordingly as new information becomes available. Your patience and Christian charity towards one another during this difficult time is appreciated."

For your information: Priests and any other clergy / assistants may wear masks while processing in / out and while distributing Holy Communion. Please encourage all parishioners, especially volunteers / ushers, to be patient and charitable towards all. It is **not** the responsibility of any individual to police / enforce State regulations. Thank you for your patience and calm leadership.

Where there is kindness there is goodness; where there is goodness there is God.

The kindness of the parishioners of St. Edward Confessor Church and the Syosset community has changed the lives of so many here in Syosset and beyond. For many of our pantry families, the pandemic has made their difficult life circumstances more of a burden. Between the financial hardship and ongoing health related issues, life leaves them feeling hopeless and abandoned by God. The volunteers in both the Parish Social Ministry and our St. Vincent dePaul Conference help the less fortunate to witness the goodness of God. One women wrote to us, "You have restored my faith with kindness and understanding."

Let me share with you how we are able to continuously help others in need and the ways we are helping them. At the food pantry, we are currently providing assistance to 68 families and 24 individuals. Throughout the year, with your help and from Island Harvest, we are able to weekly provide nutritious food and basic needs items. We receive a tremendous amount of assistance from members of our Syosset community holding food drives and making monetary donations: Syosset Public Library, Syosset Woodbury Chamber of Commerce, Mid-Island Jewish Center, Sisters of Mercy, parishioners from Holy Name of Jesus, the non-profit group J.E.T.S. of America, Signature Premier Properties, staff, students and parents from all the Syosset Public Schools, Our Lady of Mercy Academy, St. Edward Confessor School, and Boy Scouts Troop 205. There are several neighbors who heard about our pantry and regularly drop off food and basic need items as well as make significant monetary donations. They hear the voices of the poor and want to help. God is good, all the time.

At Christmas, Easter, Back to School and Thanksgiving, each family receives gift cards to make their own purchases as well as grocery cards as needed. For Christmas, the families are given a choice of a frozen lasagna dinner, turkey, ham or chicken. Parents are able to select toys from our toy drive. At Thanksgiving, they receive a choice of a turkey or chicken with all the trimmings and homemade pumpkin bread or fresh made rolls. They can select a coat for each family member from our yearly coat drive. This year, there was a nice selection of brand new coats, gloves and hats for the children. Our back to school drive provides each student with a backpack filled with all the necessary school supplies. This year we gave out a total of 96 backpacks, 81 to our pantry children and 15 to Jericho Cares for the children living in motels. At Easter, we distributed 100 Easter baskets and gave 15 to the children living in the Jericho motels. Just as it is important for us to receive your generous donations, it is also important for us to give, we donate food and other items to St. John of God in Islip on a monthly basis. Where there is goodness there is God.

The kindness of the parishioners continues to change lives by comforting someone who is sick or grieving, by prayer and with handmade prayer shawls. We are so fortunate to have parishioners who returned to volunteer their time to bring communion to the sick in Syosset Hospital, the elderly living in the nearby nursing homes and the homebound. We returned to Cold Spring Hills Nursing Home in June, the surviving residents warmly welcomed and greeted us with Joy to receive Jesus and hear the Word of God. We have an amazing outreach ministry here at St. Edward Confessor Church; every volunteer works tirelessly to give of their time to help our neighbors in need.


