




### From Fr. Mike's Desk

Three years ago, I wrote these very words in this space. As I look back on them, I cannot find a better way to express what our readings are about for this week. As we see, our Gospel and the readings for the past two weeks have been calling us to put our faith into a new perspective. Two weeks ago, we were challenged to put our faith into action and let it be more than just words that come out of our mouths. Last week we were challenged to follow not just the letter of the Law, but the Law's true spirit, and Jesus gave us a deeper wisdom as to how we are to approach our relationship with others. Today we are given another challenge, as Jesus calls us to a greater understanding of how we are to live with, not only those who we know, but with those whom we do not know, those whom we do not like, and even those whom oppress us. Jesus tells us that the key to every relationship is love. Love those who are our neighbors and love those who are our We are to go beyond our normal enemies. understanding of love, and we are to love as God loves. We are not to seek revenge, and we are to offer forgiveness. Our Lord tells us; "'You have heard it said, 'An eye for an eye and a tooth for a tooth.' But I say to you, offer no resistance to one who is evil...You have heard that it was said, 'You should love your neighbor and hate your enemy.' But I say to you love your enemies and pray for those who persecute you, that you may be children of your heavenly *Father... for if you* love those who love you, what recompense will vou have? Do not tax collectors do the same? So be perfect, just as your heavenly Father is *perfect.*" Thus Our Lord is saying go beyond the wisdom of the world and be instruments of the Father's perfect love, seek not revenge, but offer forgiveness. When we do this the world will change, we ourselves will change as we will feel the love of God grow inside us.

Is this hard to do? It sure is, and for most of us we will struggle with this teaching, but Jesus is correct (of course He is). Why? For when we let go of all the hate and we forgive those who hurt us, we succeed in making our lives better, and we have less upset and stress, and usually when we forgive, the one who hurt us also changes. Yes, there are exceptions, and no matter what we do some will never change, but that should not mean we do not try to forgive them. Sometimes a person hurts us so much and the hurt runs so deep that a future relationship is not possible; nevertheless we are still called by Jesus to wish that person no harm, pray for that person, and try to forgive. Remember when we forgive someone, we are doing just as much for our sake as for the sake of the other.

Literature gives us many examples of how this has played out, so many of the saints had experienced this in their lives, and likewise so many people have converted to Christianity when they saw those who were tortured for their faith, prayed for those who abused them and forgave them as they gave up their lives for Christ. This was true for the early Church at the hands of the Romans and it is still true today as many, especially in the Middle East and Africa, suffer because of their faith in Jesus Christ. But with God's grace and the power of the Holy Spirit we will be able to follow this difficult teaching that God has given us through His Son. Pray about it!





### LENTEN RULES - FASTING & ABSTINENCE



Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are obligatory days of fasting and abstinence for Catholics. In addition, Fridays during Lent are obligatory days of abstinence.

For members of the Roman Catholic Church, the norms on fasting are obligatory from age 18 until age 59. When fasting, a person is permitted to eat one full meal, as well as two smaller meals that together are not equal to a full meal. The norms concerning abstinence from meat are binding upon members of the Latin Catholic Church from age 14 onwards.

The cross powerfully captures the depth of the Christian message. Jesus' total surrender of self to the Father, and the Father's acceptance of Jesus' sacrifice centers on this symbol. Our Lenten journey invites us to recognize the importance of the cross in our faith and in our lives. As we carry it from the signing of Ash Wednesday to the crucifixion of Good Friday, we express and approach our hope in the Resurrection.

### Monday, March 2nd

#### The Sign of the Cross (Ash Wednesday) -Place of Prayer

From our earliest days, we have marked ourselves with the sign of the cross as we begin and end prayer. What does this action mean and where does it lead?

### Tuesday, March 3rd

#### The Stations of the Cross (Daily journeying)-Place of Reconciliation

The Stations of the Cross invite us to journey with Jesus to the place of final surrender. Along the way, there are foes and friends, suffering and support, falling and rising. Our life finds expression in the movement forward one step at a time.

### The Wood of the Cross (Good Friday)—Place of Community and Eucharist

The sacrifice of the cross involves the total gift of self for one's friends. Around the cross, a community forms. From the cross, hope and life emerge. The cross becomes a holy place.


