



From Fr. Mike's Desk

"Thus says the Lord: Share your bread with the hungry, shelter the oppressed and homeless; clothe the naked...and do not turn your back on your own. Then your light shall break forth like the dawn...and the glory of the Lord shall be your rear guard. Then you shall call, and the Lord will answer; you shall cry for help, and He will say: Here I am! If you remove from your midst oppression, false accusation and malicious speech...then light shall rise from you in the darkness."

"You are the light of the world. A city set on a mountain cannot be hidden...your light must shine before others that they may see your good deeds and glorify your heavenly Father."

Both the Prophet Isaiah and Jesus are calling for the same objective in today's readings. They are both calling God's people to act differently from all other people in the world. Isaiah tells the people of Israel how they must act toward one another, sharing their bread and their resources with their brothers and sisters in need. However, more than that, they must act rightly toward one another as they avoid gossip, false accusations, rash judgment, etc. They must be a people of justice, and Jesus echoing Isaiah tells us that we must do the same. Our Lord expands the call for justice from being just the people of Israel, but to all people in the world. We, through Jesus, are to be the Light of the World, and when we do this, we will give true glory to God. This Divine Command is not to be taken lightly or to be put off on to anyone else with the idea that, "it's his job or your job, but it's not mine!" The Son of God warns us not to allow ourselves to become complacent, not to become salt that loses its taste. Jesus warns us, when that happens, salt (meaning us), is no longer good for anything and is to be thrown out underfoot.

It would be to our advantage to remember that the presence of God is not just found in heaven, but also in the person next to you, especially the person in need. This is how the Gospel is calling us to live; however, the world does not live this way and that is why society is failing. Society is failing because it has not overcome the divisions between people, and has allowed racism, sexism, and materialism to grow. Society is failing because it has caused wars and not exhausted the possibilities for mediation and reconciliation. Society is failing because it has not borne constant and authentic witness to the sanctity and dignity of all human life.

While our willingness to look at society's failures is a good step, but it is only one-step toward our answering of this Radical Call to build the Kingdom of God. We must be the Light for all to see, and we must show Christ to all. One of the ways we can help show Christ's Light locally is to support the work of the Catholic Ministries Appeal. Please keep in mind, when you support this worthwhile appeal, you are helping vital ministries like Catholic Charities, Catholic Schools, Religious Education throughout the Diocese. You are supporting the education of those in Ordained Ministry. Also, please remember that all of the money given to the Catholic Ministries Appeal goes only to the appeal. It is not used for any other purpose or pay off any settlements. This is according to the laws of the State and the Church. Your support is truly needed; if you have not made your pledge yet, please do so soon. Society cannot wait!

Let us pray, Heavenly Father help me to awaken in myself and in others your redeeming power. Thank you for the light you give to me, may we all shine brightly through Christ our Lord. Amen.

Catholics and Confirmation

Do you know of a Catholic who has never received the sacrament of confirmation? Would you be that Catholic?

Sometimes a baptized Catholic, one who has made their First Holy Communion, has not been confirmed. There are many reasons for this sickness, the family moves, illness - all these can interrupt a young person being fully initiated as a Catholic. Occasionally a young man or woman, preparing for the Sacrament of Matrimony, are advised to find out about getting confirmed. The Sacrament of Confirmation is important for all Catholics, as it strengthens a person's faith, and brings with it the grace and strength of the Holy Spirit. Saint Edward's will offer a program of preparation for this sacrament beginning in March, and concluding on Pentecost, May 31, when the sacrament of Confirmation will be celebrated. 

The 2020 Census is coming! Everyone counts! Why does the Census matter?

It's about fair representation. Every 10 years, the results of the census are used to reapportion the House of Representatives, determining how many seats each state gets. It's also about redistricting. After each decade's census, state officials redraw the boundaries of the congressional and state legislative districts in their states to account for population shifts. The distribution of more than \$675 billion in federal funds, grants, and support to states, counties, and communities are based on census data. That money is spent on schools, hospitals, roads, public works and other vital programs.


