From Fr. Mike's Desk


Today's Gospel is very familiar to most of us. It is the reading for the third Sunday of Lent for the Cycle A, which we are in this year. We also do these readings on this Sunday when we have people preparing to celebrate Baptism at Easter. The theme of water giving new life in the Gospel and in the reading from Exodus is why we use these readings for those getting ready for Baptism. However, since we do not have catechumens this year, I thought we should look at some of the other elements that are at work in these readings.

The Gospel tells us that Jesus is passing through Samaria to get to Judea and Galilee as a short cut. Normally, Jews would avoid Samaria because the Jews and Samaritans did not get along. In fact, they hated each other. The Jews looked down on them because they were of mixed heritage and did not practice the faith in the proper way. However, Jesus knows time is fleeting, so He takes the short cut, and when they arrive at the village, Jesus sends the Apostles out to get food and supplies. Now comes the part we are familiar with, the woman comes to the well at noon, which was not the usual time for people to come to the well. She goes at that time because she will be alone, but there is this strange man at the well that day! Who is he, why is he here, and finally why is he speaking to me, the woman wonders? After Jesus asks her for water she protests. He then tells her that she should be asking Him for water, the water of eternal life, the Holy Spirit. He tells her about her past and present, and she now believes Him to be a prophet. At one point, she asks Jesus if He was greater than Jacob who founded the well centuries ago. What she does not know is that He is! As we continue with the account, Jesus will reveal to this foreigner that He is the Messiah.

Why does Our Lord tell her? I think He tells her because she is seeking the truth and she wants to change her life. Jesus tells her because she, and those like her, are the food Jesus seeks and tells the Apostles about when they return. Of course, it is not physical food to eat. His food is souls who are seeking new life and a new relationship with God. As Jesus tells us later in John's Gospel, He is the way, the truth and the life, and no one can come to the Father except through Him. Jesus has come into the world to call all people, and He has come to show mercy and forgiveness to all. The woman, who was caught up in sin, was now set free. Of course, she had to change. However, after meeting Jesus how could she not help but change? We also see God's love and mercy even in the Exodus account. When the people were rebelling against Moses and God, and as they complained about no water, God, out of love, still gives them the life-giving water. It didn't even matter though how they complained against Him. As we continue our Lenten Journey, we should look at the areas in our life that need to change, certainly the parts that come between God and ourselves. Like the woman at the well, we should change, and remember that she did not do it all by herself. She did it with the help of Jesus and the Father and the Holy Spirit. We can do the same, all we have to do is ask.

Happy Third Sunday of Lent!

Directives and Guidelines for Parishes for Health Considerations during Virus Seasons from the Office of the Chancellor Announcements

As a health precaution, the Diocese of Rockville Centre instructs all Pastors, Clergy and Parish Churches to enact the following measures immediately:

- 1. Until further notice, the Precious Blood of Christ (the Chalice) is not to be distributed to anyone other than clergy (priests / deacons) or those who for health reasons must only receive the Precious Blood.
- 2. Until further notice, the Sign of Peace will not be given / exchanged in any form during Holy Mass.
- 3. The following practices are encouraged in all parishes:

a. Parishioners are instructed to remain at home if they are sick. This includes deacons, extraordinary ministers of Holy Communion, lectors, altar servers, ushers, music ministers, etc.. Those who are able to attend Mass should be encouraged to wash and sanitize their hands.

b. Priests, deacons, extraordinary ministers of Holy Communion and altar servers should wash their hands immediately before serving. Disinfectant soap and/or hand sanitizer should be provided for them. Clergy and extraordinary ministers of Holy Communion are encouraged to wash / disinfect their hands after serving as well.

c. Holy water fonts at the doors of the church should be emptied and cleaned several times per week, especially before and after weekends.

d. Parishioners who prefer to receive Holy Communion on the tongue still have that right, though they may freely choose to receive the Sacred Host in their hands during this precautionary time. (See Redemptionis Sacramentum, no. 92)

e. Cleaning and disinfecting practices normally carried out in our churches and parish facilities should be given extra and careful attention during this time.

f. Clergy may wish to discontinue the practice of shaking hands if greeting parishioners after Mass.

Lenten Rules - Fasting & Abstinence



Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are obligatory days of fasting and abstinence for Catholics. In addition, Fridays during Lent are obligatory days of abstinence. For members of the Roman Catholic Church, the norms on fasting are obligatory from age 18 until age 59. When fasting, a person is permitted to eat one full meal, as well as two smaller meals that together are not equal to a full meal. The norms concerning abstinence from meat are binding upon members of the Roman Catholic Church from age 14 onwards.




