From Fr. Mike's Desk

Our Lenten Journey is rapidly coming to an end as we begin this last week of Lent, also known as Holy Week. Today we will read and participate in the Passion of Our Lord Jesus Christ according to Mark. We will read about the Last Supper and the Institution of the Eucharist as Jesus transforms the Passover Covenant into the new Covenant in His Body and Blood. remember Jesus' Agony in the Garden, the betrayal of Judas, His arrest and trial and Pilate's handing down the death sentence for this innocent man. We will again hear about the pain Our Lord endured for our salvation and we will be left contemplating Jesus' lifeless body as it is taken down from the Cross and laid in the empty tomb. As we go through Holy Week, we will relive each of these events on their proper day of Holy Thursday, Good Friday, and Holy Saturday, and of course, next week when we gather here, our sadness will be turned to great joy!

What we are recalling (especially at the Easter Vigil on Holy Saturday Night) is God's plan for our salvation, and how the time of Jesus' entry into Jerusalem and the Passion took place during the Passover Season and was part of that plan. The Law required that every Jewish male who lived within fifteen miles of Jerusalem had to go up to the city to celebrate the Passover. This was the desire of so many Jews even those from other countries, who likewise were required to spend at least one Passover of their life in Jerusalem. We are told that every year at this time the city and the surrounding towns were packed with devout Jews. Therefore, many people were on hand to witness Jesus' entry into the city and many of the visitors were equally interested in seeing Him. Mark wants us to know, that they witnessed Jesus' love for God and humanity. This love was manifested fully in the fact that Jesus took up His Cross and despite the temptation placed before Him by the religious leaders, He did not come down from the Cross by using the power of His divinity. No, Jesus makes the ultimate sacrifice and gives up His life so that death could be destroyed. To quote

Jesus, "Those who have eyes should see", and those who could see saw more than just the death of a carpenter from Nazareth. The question for this Holy Week is, will we?

Please consult the bulletin for the times for Confessions, Services, and Prayerful Moments during this Holy Week and for next Sunday, which is Easter Sunday. Again, use this week well, so that when we assemble here next weekend, we can truly all rejoice.



THERE IS NO EVENING MASS

The Ancient Christian Tradition of Tenebrae

"Watch and pray," Jesus tells his apostles in the garden of Gethsemane, "that you may not enter into temptation." He invites them to pray for courage and strength as they will be confronted with His betrayal, arrest, false condemnation, passion and crucifixion. We, who are baptized into Jesus' death and resurrection, also hear His call, especially in Holy Week, to watch and pray as we commemorate these most sacred and life-giving days in our own lives and in the history of the world.

The major liturgies of The Lord's Supper on Holy Thursday, the Good Friday Service and the great Easter Vigil are our principal ways of prayerfully commemorating the events that won our salvation. But our Tradition also offers other ways to watch and pray during these holy days. The Liturgy of the Hours is prayed with great intensity and beauty during Holy Week. Many of you join the Office of Morning Prayer which our parish celebrates on Holy Thursday, Good Friday and Holy Saturday mornings.

As we did last year, we will again be praying an evening office in the ancient Christian tradition known as *Tenebrae*. The word is Latin for *darkness*. The office commemorates the growing darkness enveloping Jesus as he faces the betrayal and arrest that lead to his passion. As the psalms are prayed and the scriptures are read, the candles of the church are extinguished one by one until the church is left in darkness. A loud thunder sound is heard. One lit candle remains, hidden away, as a sign that the darkness cannot completely overcome the Light, that the Cross leads to Resurrection.

Tenebrae is one of the most moving services of Holy Week. It offers a wonderful opportunity to "watch and pray" as we enter into these sacred days. Join us on March 27th, the Wednesday night of Holy Week at 7:30 PM and enter into this great prayer experience.

Liturgical Minister Training-Spring 2024

The Diocese of Rockville Center will offer training in Spanish and English for those who wish to serve as Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion and Lectors. No walk-ins permitted, all participants must be registered in advance with a letter from their pastor.

Extraordinary Minister of Holy Communion: Part A - This training is required for all those who are beginning as Ministers. This "BASIC" training is required for all Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion. 
