The Readings for The Third Sunday of Lent

Reading 1 - Exodus 20:1-17

In those days, God delivered all these commandments:
“I, the LORD, am your God, who brought you out of the land of Egypt, that place of slavery. You shall not have other gods besides me. You shall not carve idols for yourselves in the shape of anything in the sky above or on the earth below or in the waters beneath the earth; you shall not bow down before them or worship them. For I, the LORD, your God, am a jealous God, inflicting punishment for their fathers’ wickedness on the children of those who hate me, down to the third and fourth generation; but bestowing mercy down to the thousandth generation on the children of those who love me and keep my commandments.

“You shall not take the name of the LORD, your God, in vain. For the LORD will not leave unpunished the one who takes his name in vain.

“Remember to keep holy the sabbath day. Six days you may labor and do all your work, but the seventh day is the sabbath of the LORD, your God. No work may be done then either by you, or your son or daughter, or your male or female slave, or your beast, or by the alien who lives with you. In six days the LORD made the heavens and the earth, the sea and all that is in them; but on the seventh day he rested. That is why the LORD has blessed the sabbath day and made it holy.

“Honor your father and your mother, that you may have a long life in the land which the LORD, your God, is giving you.

You shall not kill.

You shall not commit adultery.

You shall not steal.

You shall not bear false witness against your neighbor.

You shall not covet your neighbor’s house.

You shall not covet your neighbor’s wife, nor his male or female slave, nor his ox or ass, nor anything else that belongs to him.”

Reading 2 – 1 Corinthians 1:22-25

Brothers and sisters:

Jews demand signs and Greeks look for wisdom, but we proclaim Christ crucified, a stumbling block to Jews and foolishness to Gentiles, but to those who are called, Jews and Greeks alike, Christ the power of God and the wisdom of God. For the foolishness of God is wiser than human wisdom, and the weakness of God is stronger than human strength.

Gospel – John 2:13-25

Since the Passover of the Jews was near, Jesus went up to Jerusalem. He found in the temple area those who sold oxen, sheep, and doves, as well as the money changers seated there. He made a whip out of cords and drove them all out of the temple area, with the sheep and oxen, and spilled the coins of the money changers and overturned their tables, and to those who sold doves he said, **“Take these out of here, and stop making my Father’s house a marketplace.”** His disciples recalled the words of Scripture, Zeal for your house will consume me. At this the Jews answered and said to him, “What sign can you show us for doing this?” Jesus answered and said to them, **“Destroy this temple and in three days I will raise it up.”** The Jews said, “This temple has been under construction for forty-six years, and you will raise it up in three days?” But he was speaking about the temple of his body. Therefore, when he was raised from the dead, his disciples remembered that he had said this, and they came to believe the Scripture and the word Jesus had spoken.

While he was in Jerusalem for the feast of Passover, many began to believe in his name when they saw the signs he was doing. But Jesus would not trust himself to them because he knew them all, and did not need anyone to testify about human nature. He himself understood it well.



Prayer to St. Michael

St. Michael the Archangel, defend us in battle, be our protection against the wickedness and snares of the devil. May God rebuke him we humbly pray; and do thou, O Prince of the Heavenly host, by the power of God, cast into hell Satan and all the evil spirits who prowl about the world seeking the ruin of souls. From Fr. Mike's Desk

The most important event on the Jewish calendar is the ***Feast and the Season of Passover***. I am sure you will recall that Passover remembers the over 400 years of Israelite slavery in Egypt and how God set the people free by sending ***Moses*** to Pharaoh. Their freedom was gained by God sending a series of plagues upon Egypt with the last and most serious one being ***the death of the first born***. The angel of death went through Egypt and killed the first born in every house which was not marked with the blood of the sacrificed lamb. When the angel came across a marked house, he passed over that house and all inside remained safe and sound.

The time of Passover is the setting for all the readings for today's celebration. Our Old Testament Reading speaks of the time after the Passover when the Israelites were at the foot of *Mount Sinai* and God, through Moses, delivered to them the ***Ten Commandments***. Both the blood of the sacrificed lamb and the Commandments mark the new covenant that God made with the people. It is in the giving of the Commandments that God solidifies His agreement with the people that he would be their God and they would be His (special/chosen) people. Like so many covenant treaties of that day, the Commandments state how each side would keep its part of the agreement. The people were expected to keep the Commandments and God would always be by their side to guide and protect them, even during the times they failed to recognize it. If you look at the Commandments, you will see that they are more than a list of rules and "Thou shall not." They are God's instructions for us to keep out of trouble and to avoid all the areas that can lead us into unhappiness in this life. The first Commandments are about our relationship with God. They tell us to avoid placing false gods before Him, they tell us not to use the Holy Name in vain, and we should set aside one day of the week to focus on Him and it is to be called the Sabbath. The remaining Commandments tell us the things we must avoid in this life that will cause us and others pain and sorrow.

The Passover was occurring in today's Gospel, when Jesus goes up to the Temple and reacts violently at the sight of the money changers and those who were selling sheep, oxen, and doves. Jesus is very upset because they had forgotten what the Temple was all about. They were not there to offer sacrifices, but were there to make a dishonest profit. Unfortunately, the priests and the leadership of the Temple received a large portion of these ill-gotten gains. However, Jesus was doing more than calling out the leaders on their misuse of the Temple area. He was calling them to understand a new reality about humanity's relationship with God, a relationship which goes beyond the Ten Commandments and the Blood of the Passover Lamb. He presents to them a new *Passover Covenant which will supersede or better yet fulfill the earlier covenant*. The new Passover Lamb will pour out His blood and set free from slavery not just one people or generation, but all of humanity and He will set us free from slavery to sin, darkness, and spiritual death. All of this comes to pass through His death on the Cross and through His Resurrection from the dead. This is the very same life-giving event we are getting ready to fully celebrate in three weeks and what we have been celebrating for the past 2021 years at the new Passover Meal, which we celebrate today and everyday as the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass.

Sacrament of Reconciliation


