Easter Sunday of the Resurrection of the Lord

Reading 1 - Acts 10:34a, 37-43

Peter proceeded to speak and said: "You know what has happened all over Judea, beginning in Galilee after the baptism that John preached, how God anointed Jesus of Nazareth with the Holy Spirit and power. He went about doing good and healing all those oppressed by the devil, for God was with him. We are witnesses of all that he did both in the country of the Jews and in Jerusalem. They put him to death by hanging him on a tree. This man God raised on the third day and granted that he be visible, not to all the people, but to us, the witnesses chosen by God in advance, who ate and drank with him after he rose from the dead. Gospel - John 20:1-9

On the first day of the week, Mary of Magdala came to the tomb early in the morning, while it was still dark, and saw the stone removed from the tomb. So she ran and went to Simon Peter and to the other disciple whom Jesus loved, and told them, "They have taken the Lord from the tomb, and we don't know where they put him." So Peter and the other disciple went out and came to the tomb. They both ran, but the other disciple ran faster than Peter and arrived at the tomb first: he bent down and saw the burial cloths there, but did not go in. When Simon Peter arrived after him, he went into the tomb and saw the burial cloths there, and the cloth that had covered his head, not with the burial cloths but rolled up in a separate place. Then the other disciple also went in, the one who had arrived at the tomb first, and he saw and believed. For they did not yet understand the Scripture that he had to rise from the dead.

From Fr. Mike's Desk

When we celebrated the second Sunday of Lent, we heard from Luke's account of the Transfiguration. We were told that Jesus took Peter, James, and John up to the mountain to pray. This was a great honor for them as Jesus usually went off to pray by Himself. While in prayer, His face changed in appearance, and His clothing became dazzlingly white. He was joined by Moses and Elijah who appeared the same way. This happened days after Jesus asked the Apostles, "who do people say that I am". No one answered until Peter had the correct answer that Jesus was the Messiah. After Jesus acknowledged that Peter was correct, He proceeded to tell them that He was going to Jerusalem where He would be betrayed, turned over to the authorities and crucified. Jesus brought them with Him so they would be strengthened and believe after the events of Holy Thursday, Good Friday and even Easter occurred. The way Jesus appeared on the Mount of the Transfiguration, is the same way He appeared on the first Easter Sunday. The Risen Lord was different than before, He had taken on the Glorified Body, and everything had changed for Him and for us. We have not experienced a change like that since Christ was born in Bethlehem. After Jesus told them what would happen to Him, He told Peter that He was praying for him. He was praying that Peter would be able to get a hold of himself quickly so he could be the rock for his brothers and sisters.

This now takes us to today, the most important day on the Christian calendar. The gospel reading for this year's Easter Vigil comes from Luke. We are told that the women go to the tomb to do the last bit of homage to His body. When they arrive, they find the stone rolled away and two angels in dazzling garments. The two tell them not to seek the living among the dead, He is not here. After they do not see Jesus' body, the women go off and tell the Apostles, but they do not believe the women and called their story nonsense. However, Peter hearing the words Jesus told Him earlier, and remembering what he saw at the Transfiguration, got up and ran to the tomb and saw it was empty and the burial clothes alone. He went away and was amazed. He was amazed and started to believe, he was amazed and once again became the rock who would no longer deny Jesus, and indeed he was the Rock on which Christ would build His Church.

As we will see in next week's gospel, the Risen

Lord will appear to the Apostles and others on Easter Night, while they were filled with joy, they did not totally understand, and they would not until they receive the Holy Spirit at Pentecost. Just as Peter returned to his senses, so would the rest, and so will we when we have questions about our faith or experience times of difficulty and disbelief. Remember with Jesus' resurrection we are shown the path to eternal life in the Kingdom of God. His life, death, and resurrection changes humanity completely, so we should no longer be afraid, and we should not allow periods of doubt or trouble to stop us from believing. Easter is about new life; the new life we must share with everyone we meet. As our Orthodox Christian brothers and sisters say. CHRISTOS ARESTI, ALITHOS ANES-TI- meaning Christ is Risen. Truly He has risen!

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ-

Christ is Risen, Alleluia!

Every Easter, as we celebrate our Lord's victory over death, we delight in the consolation that all is restored through the Resurrection, and we ponder God's relentless invitation to live the divine life given at baptism.

This is the good news of our faith: Christ has conquered death and we are invited to life. This good news needs to be heard time and again. Even when things are bleak, we remember Christ is victorious and that we have been invited to witness to his victory. As Pope Francis says:

"Where all seems to be dead, signs of the resurrection suddenly spring up. It is an irresistible force. Often it seems that God does not exist: all around us we see persistent injustice, evil, indifference and cruelty. But it is also true that in the midst of darkness something new always springs to life and sooner or later produces fruit. On razed land life breaks through, stubbornly yet invincibly. However dark things are, goodness always re-emerges and spreads. Each day in our world beauty is born anew, it rises transformed through the storms of history. Values always tend to reappear under new guises, and human beings have arisen time after time from situations that seemed doomed. Such is the power of the resurrection, and all who evangelize are instruments of that power." ¹

We know well the bleakness that can overwhelms us. How good it is to recall God's goodness! The Risen Lord moves through the locked doors of fear to lead us, to lead our families and to lead the world to peace. May we never forget God's triumph over death and our baptismal call to be an instrument of that power. May we show the Risen Lord to all we meet.

This Easter, as we rejoice in Christ's Resurrection, let us remember especially those who suffer in Ukraine and the millions who have been displaced by that tragic war. Together, we pray that the Risen Christ bring light to their darkness and give them peace.

The Ukraine Invasion and Religion

I thought it might be helpful to our parishioners if I noted a few things that are not being extensively covered by our secular media. Those who don't want to learn about the religious aspects of the Ukrainian conflict are ignoring a central aspect of the issue and risk abandoning their fellow Catholics.

While Ukrainian Catholics represent a much smaller number than the Orthodox, they are nevertheless a significant presence, especially in western Ukraine. The principal bishop of their Church is the Major-Archbishop of Lviv. When Ukraine was part of the Soviet Union, the Ukrainian Catholic Church was outlawed. Its bishops and priests were executed or imprisoned. Ukrainian Catholics have a well-founded fear that if Russia should prevail in the current conflict and take over their country again, their church would once again become illegal, a church of martyrs. Indeed the current Major-Archbishop, Sviatoslav Shevchuk, recently learned that he is on Putin's "hit list." So I fail to see how any American Catholic can say that the Russian invasion is no concern of our country.

On a more positive note, we can be very grateful for the courage of the leadership of the Orthodox Church of America. The OCA, with something under one million members, is the second largest Orthodox Church in our country. The largest is the Greek Orthodox Church with something under two million members. Greek Orthodox Christians in the US have their roots in Greece, Turkey and other Mediterranean countries. Members of the Orthodox Church in America trace their roots to Russia, Romania, Serbia and other Slavic countries.

Until recently, the headquarters of the Orthodox Church in America was right here in Syosset – up on Rt. 25A. They recently moved to D.C.

The OCA was founded by the Russian Orthodox Church and, while now self-governing, still has close ties to the Moscow Patriarchate. Thus it was a great act of courage and Christian faith for the Synod of Bishops of the OCA to issue a strong condemnation of the Russian invasion of Ukraine, calling it an unjust war of aggression. The OCA Primate, Metropolitan Tikhon has sent a letter to Moscow Patriarch Kirill asking him "to do whatever possible to end the war." (Kirill is one of Putin's biggest supporters.) I thank God for the courage of the OCA leadership as we all continue to thank God for the incredible courage of the Ukrainian people.

Sadly, religion and politics are inseparably entwined in the Ukraine crisis. We American Catholics dare not ignore the dangers facing all people of faith in Ukraine. To be silent in the face of this evil because of our own political preferences is what is really meant by "bringing politics into church."

5 mornings of Bible stories, playtime, music, snacks, gym time, arts and crafts and fun!






