

From Fr. Mike's Desk

"The community of believers was of one heart and mind..." "With great power the apostles bore witness to the resurrection of the Lord Jesus..." "On the evening of the first day of the week, when the doors were locked, where the disciples were, for fear of the Jews..."

Oh, what a contrast we see in our two readings from today's Gospel and from the Acts of the Apostles as we celebrate this Second Sunday of Easter also known as Divine Mercy Sunday. In the Acts, we hear that all of the believers are acting as one, and at the heart of this community are the Apostles who have such great power and fearlessly bear witness to the Risen Lord. They gave their all to preach the good news, and they converted many to the faith. However, on that first Easter Sunday Night and the Sunday that followed, they were behind locked doors and windows fearing that they too would be arrested and executed. Likewise, they were frightened and confused because of the other events that happened on that first Easter Morning, when Mary told them that Jesus' body was taken. confusion continued when she later told them that she spoke to the Risen Lord.

How do we get from John's Gospel account to the account found in the Acts? The answer is none other than Jesus. For locked doors and windows and even hearts could not keep out the Risen Lord. He does not appear to them to frighten them, no He comes to give them comfort when they needed it the most! He appears to them and tells them, "Peace be with you...As the Father has sent me so I send you." Then He breathes upon them and tells them to receive the Holy Spirit. What wonders Christ has done for them! He forgives them and gives them the power to go out and preach the good news all in one action. Fear is useless, what is necessary is Trust, these are Jesus' words from the Gospel, and this is what Jesus was telling them that night. All who saw Him rejoiced and believed, except Thomas who was not present, because he could not deal with the events of Holy Thursday and Good Friday. Thomas refused to believe even after all of those gathered told him the same story, but seven days later he did believe and what came out of his mouth is the greatest proclamation of faith and the most proper identification of Jesus ever uttered in the New Testament: "My Lord and My God!"

Thomas sees and his fear disappears, and while Jesus accepts his praise, He tells him that he

believed because he saw, but blessed are those who believe without seeing. Blessed are they who see Jesus not with their eyes, but with their hearts and souls through the power and grace of the Holy Spirit. I hope that blessed are we, for the Lord is speaking about us, and all who have followed Him for the past 2,019 years. However, our faith in Him cannot be lukewarm, and it cannot be on our terms. It must be on fire and we must listen to what He wants for us, after all, He only wants what is good and right.

The Risen Lord is able to come through locked doors and windows, and if we allow Him our hearts. Fear is the dead bolt that locks our hearts. so we are to remove it with Trust. That is what is important for us to contemplate on this Divine Mercy Sunday. This day's theme is why St. John Paul II declared this day Divine Mercy Sunday. Jesus told St. Faustina that this was to be the day that we should rejoice over all that the Father has given us through His Divine Son. Christ knows our struggles, our hardships, and even the terrors we experience living in this world. Christ is here to assure us, as He did for the Apostles in the locked room, that we can trust in Him. As He told St. Faustina, "I am offering people a vessel with which they are to keep coming for graces to the fountain of mercy. That vessel is this image with the signature: 'Jesus, I trust in you!' I desire that this image be venerated, first in your chapel, and [then] throughout the world." With all this and all that God has given us through our Risen Lord, let us put away all fear and shout out just as St. Thomas did, My Lord and My God!

Last Saturday Night at the Easter Vigil, we welcomed into the Church Vivian and her daughter Anya who were Baptized, Confirmed and received Jesus in the Eucharist for the first time. Today we welcome to St. Edward's the Most Rev. John O. Barres, Bishop of Rockville Centre. Bishop Barres will celebrate the 11:30 Mass and dedicate our new stained glass windows that were fully completed earlier this year. We welcome our dear Bishop to our parish on this day, which also marks the 16th Anniversary of the dedication of our Church building what a wonderful event to celebrate on this Divine Mercy Sunday



WASHINGTON – In a bold response to the decision of New York and other states to legalize abortion up until the moment of birth, Focus on the Family is gearing up to blast live ultrasounds on monitors and screens across Times Square.

Focus on the Family announced the May 4 event Tuesday on CBN News' "Faith Nation."

"We'll have great speakers. We're going to have music, but we're also going to do a live ultrasound of a third-trimester baby," Focus on the Family President Jim Daly explained.

"And with the 4-D technology that we have, it looks like a picture of a 1-year-old," he noted. "There is no way a person is going to be able to say, 'That is not a child.' It is a child and we want everybody to see it."

This pro-life project comes as states like New York roll back restrictions on late-term abortion, permitting the procedure up until the point of delivery.




