The Readings for Easter Sunday The Resurrection of the Lord

Reading 1 - Acts 10:34a, 37-34

Peter proceeded to speak and said:

“You know what has happened all over Judea, beginning in Galilee after the baptism that John preached, how God anointed Jesus of Nazareth with the Holy Spirit and power. He went about doing good and healing all those oppressed by the devil, for God was with him. We are witnesses of all that he did both in the country of the Jews and in Jerusalem. They put him to death by hanging him on a tree. This man God raised on the third day and granted that he be visible, not to all the people, but to us, the witnesses chosen by God in advance, who ate and drank with him after he rose from the dead. He commissioned us to preach to the people and testify that he is the one appointed by God as judge of the living and the dead. To him all the prophets bear witness, that everyone who believes in him will receive forgiveness of sins through his name.”

Reading 2 – Colossians 3:1-4

Brothers and sisters:

If then you were raised with Christ, seek what is above, where Christ is seated at the right hand of God. Think of what is above, not of what is on earth. For you have died, and your life is hidden with Christ in God. When Christ your life appears, then you too will appear with him in glory.

Gospel – John 20:1-9

On the first day of the week, Mary of Magdala came to the tomb early in the morning, while it was still dark, and saw the stone removed from the tomb. So she ran and went to Simon Peter and to the other disciple whom Jesus loved, and told them, “They have taken the Lord from the tomb, and we don’t know where they put him.” So Peter and the other disciple went out and came to the tomb. They both ran, but the other disciple ran faster than Peter and arrived at the tomb first; he bent down and saw the burial cloths there, but did not go in. When Simon Peter arrived after him, he went into the tomb and saw the burial cloths there, and the cloth that had covered his head, not with the burial cloths but rolled up in a separate place. Then the other disciple also went in, the one who had arrived at the tomb first, and he saw and believed. For they did not yet understand the Scripture that he had to rise from the dead.



Prayer to St. Michael

St. Michael the Archangel, defend us in battle, be our protection against the wickedness and snares of the devil. May God rebuke him we humbly pray; and do thou, O Prince of the Heavenly host, by the power of God, cast into hell Satan and all the evil spirits who prowl about the world seeking the ruin of souls. Amen.

From Fr. Mike's Desk

"Peter proceeded to speak and said, 'You know what has happened all over Judea, beginning in Galilee after the baptism that John preached, how God anointed Jesus of Nazareth with the Holy Spirit and power... We are witnesses of all that he did both in the country of the Jews and in Jerusalem. They put him to death... This man God raised on the third day and granted that he be visible not to all... but to us, the witnesses chosen by God in advance.'"

These words, from *the Acts of the Apostles*, tell us what we are celebrating today and for the next fifty days. Christ has risen from the dead, therefore sin, spiritual death and darkness have been conquered. Christ has risen from the dead and so the joyful promise of Christmas has been fulfilled. For on Christmas we celebrated the Mystery of the Incarnation, how God, in the person of Jesus, took on our human life. Today we celebrate the reason why the Incarnation happened, as we rejoice in the realization that we have been given, the gift of Eternal Life. On Christmas we acknowledged that all of humanity was changed, and now at Easter we see that all have been given this great gift and all we need to do to gain it is to accept it!

This year our Gospel Reading (from the Easter Vigil on Holy Saturday Night) comes from Mark's account of the Resurrection. Mark tells us that Mary Madeline, Mary the mother of James and Salome were bringing spices to the tomb to properly anoint Jesus' dead body as was the custom of the day. As they were walking along the way on that very early Sunday morning, their biggest concern was who would roll the very large stone from the tomb's entrance. However, when they arrived at the tomb they were amazed! They entered the tomb and saw a young man sitting at the right of where the body of Jesus was, and the young man was dressed in a pure white garment. Notice what he says to the women, *"Do not be amazed! You seek Jesus of Nazareth, the crucified. He is not here."*

Do not be amazed he tells the women, but how could they not be? And yet we are told not to be, as if a person rises from the dead everyday. Well in a way it does, and it happens as a person leaves this world and goes to the next in the Kingdom of Heaven. It also happens to us, right here and now, as on every day we die to sin and death, in our

own lives and rise to something new and become a better person. So in a way, we do witness the Resurrection everyday. But there is another reason why the women should not have been amazed, and that is Jesus told them that three days later he would rise from the dead, and that God keeps all of His promises. Mark also seems to criticize the women for being pre-occupied about the great stone at the tomb's entrance. But we may say, well why wouldn't they be concerned, how could they move such a great stone? Again they should have remembered the promise that Jesus made and totally placed their trust in God.

How many times have we allowed great stones to get in our way of trusting in God's promises, and not fully allowing the Resurrection to raise us up to new life in Jesus? The Easter Season is a time of great joy for Christians, it is a time when we shout out about who we are, and remember with great gratitude all that God has done for us through Jesus the Risen Lord.

Fr. Mike's Letter for Week 54 of the Corona Virus Crisis

The following letter was posted last week, prior to Palm Sunday, on the St. Edward's website as well as on Flocknote.

Are you ready for the story of another special day on the Church's calendar? Well here goes, this past Thursday March 25th, we celebrated the Solemnity of the Annunciation. On this day we remembered the account of the Archangel Gabriel being sent to Nazareth to tell and ask the Virgin Mary if she would become the mother of the Savior. This is important for us to realize that God asked Mary if she would agree to become the Savior's mother. Even though God had chosen her from before she was born (as God also did with the great Prophets), God still asked her permission. This is because God gives us all the gift of free will, and God did not want to press His will on Mary.

If you follow the account in Luke's Gospel, Gabriel was first sent to the Temple where Zechariah the priest (who was married to Mary's cousin Elizabeth) was fulfilling his term of priestly service and making the Incense Offering. When the archangel told him that Elizabeth would bear a son, which seemed impossible since she was past childbearing age, he refused to believe it. As a result of his disbelief, he lost the ability to speak (which would remain until Jesus' cousin John the Baptist was born). Yet, when the archangel asked Mary if she would bear the Savior, at first, she was afraid and asked questions (like "How can this be since I do not know man?") but she still said yes. In fact, she answered with, "I am the servant of the Lord, let it be done to me as you say." Our dear Blessed Mother trusted God completely and no matter what the consequences would be she was willing to accept them. One of those consequences to her, became an advantage to us. Recall the words of Simeon, when Joseph and Mary presented Jesus at the temple, as he told our dear mother, "...you yourself shall be pierced with a sword-so that the thoughts of many hearts may be laid bare." We have always understood that was a reference to the powerful intercession of the Blessed Mother as she continues to pray for the Church, the world, and each of us.

This intercession has indeed been powerful during this past year, and it will continue to get us through COVID-19. Even when the situation is grim, she still prays for us to her Divine Son so if the worse happens we can be with Him in Heaven. Now you may ask, why is the 25th of March the day we celebrate the Annunciation? Well, that is easy, nine months from March 25th, is December 25th and Christmas Day, so you still have time to get ready. Let us all pray asking our dear mother to pray for us, that this Christmas may not be dominated by COVID-19.

I desire that the first Sunday after Easter be the Feast of Mercy



These words are the instructions our Lord Jesus Christ gave to Sister Faustina, a young, uneducated nun in a convent of the Congregation of Sisters of Our Lady of Mercy in Poland during the 1930s., She received extraordinary revelations — or messages — from our Lord Jesus. Jesus asked Sr. Faustina to record these experiences, which she compiled into notebooks. These notebooks are known today as the *Diary of Saint Maria Faustina Kowalska*, and the words contained within are God's loving message of Divine Mercy. Our Lord Jesus also asked Saint Faustina to have an artist paint a picture of Jesus, with the three rays of light emanating from His Sacred Heart.

When St. Pope John Paul canonized Sr. Faustina (making her St. Faustina), he also, on the same day, surprised the entire world by establishing Divine Mercy Sunday (the feast day associated with the message) as a feast day for the entire Church. The feast day falls on the Second Sunday of the Easter season. On that day, John Paul II declared, "This is the happiest day of my life."

Come and join us on April 11th at 3:00 PM in the church as we honor our Lord's request and pray the Chaplet of Divine Mercy.


