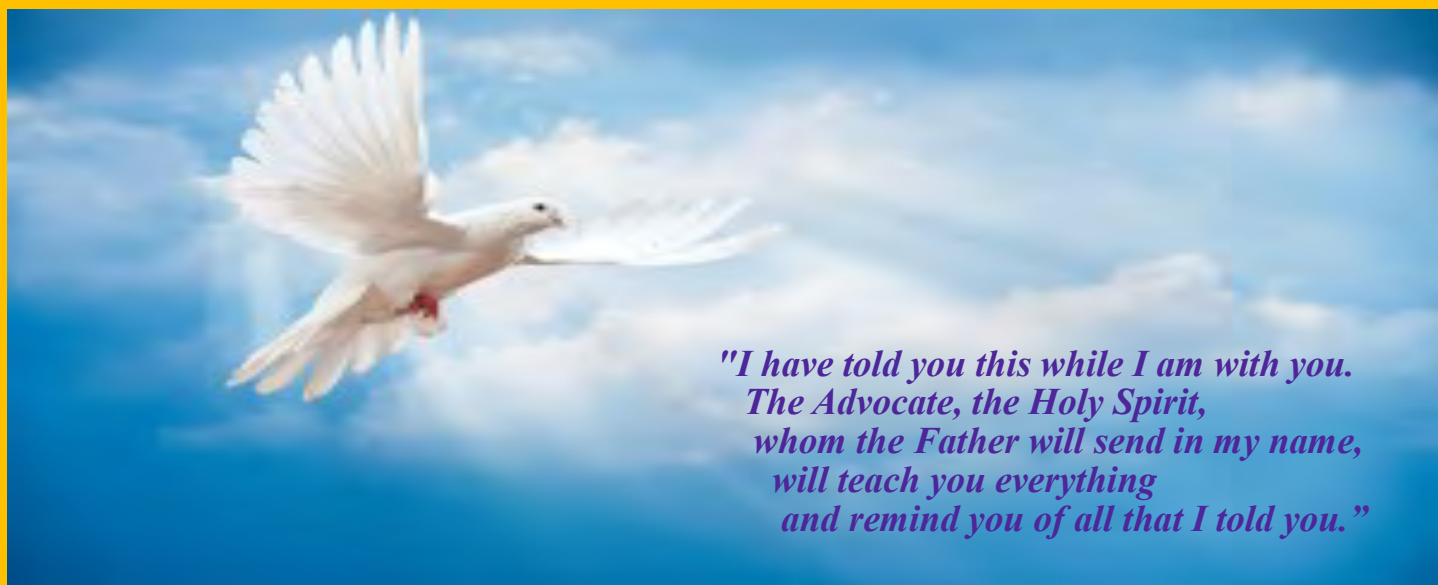

From Fr. Mike's Desk

Our first reading from the Acts of the Apostles lets us into a major argument that broke out in the early Church between Jewish Christians and Gentile Christians. The main force of this constant argument was whether Gentile Christians had to follow all of the Jewish laws and customs before they could be baptized. This problem was so big, that we even see it referred to in Saint Paul's letters. Disputes seem to be an inevitable aspect of the human condition and the Church is not immune from this aspect of human life. So how has the Church been able to solve its arguments and still survive after all these years? The answer is seen in John's Gospel, "I have told you...the Advocate, the Holy Spirit, whom the Father will send in my name, will teach you everything and remind you of all that I told you." The Holy Spirit has always been present to guide the Church along the right path and tell us which actions we should take. The Apostles solved this above-mentioned problem, by calling the Council of Jerusalem under the guidance of the Holy Spirit. The Spirit guided the Church to the decision that the Gentiles did not need to adopt Jewish laws and customs in order to be baptized. Baptism is all that is necessary for someone to belong to Christ and His Living Body, the Church. The Spirit will guide us and help us in the difficult times we are undergoing now. The Spirit will tell us what we need to do to get through this and ensure that it does not happen again.

Jesus in the Gospel also tells us about how the Holy Spirit will help us achieve peace! "I leave with you, my peace I give to you. Not as the world gives [it] I give it to you." This peace is the Shalom spoken about in the Old Testament and it was understood that the Messiah would manifest it. This peace is different from humanity's idea of peace. The peace the world offers is a peace, which comes from avoiding trouble and from refusing to face things. The peace Jesus gives us is the peace of the conquest won by Christ on the Cross, which allows us to have no sorrow, and no danger from sin and spiritual death.

Many have also referred to this Peace as a peace which destroys all of the barriers between the Jews and the Gentiles, so that all humanity can be one with God. For the Jews had their laws and the temple and they considered themselves separate from all others, and of course that meant for them that God was separated from all others as

well! The Christ has come into the world to put an end to this and unite us into one family.

This Thursday, May 30 is the Solemnity of the Ascension of the Lord and it is a Holy Day of Obligation. We observe this day by attending and celebrating the Mass. Our schedule is Wednesday night May 29 at 5PM and Thursday May 30 at 9AM, 12:10PM and 7PM.

Let us pray, O God, who in the celebration of Easter graciously give to the world the healing of heavenly remedies, show benevolence to your Church, that our present observance may benefit us for eternal life. Through our Lord Jesus Christ your, Son who lives and reigns with you in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God, for ever and ever. Amen.

Our Lord even speaks of hospitality when He is in the house of the Pharisee. Read Luke 7:36-50, it is the sinful woman who showed love and hospitality to Jesus, not the Pharisee whose house it was.



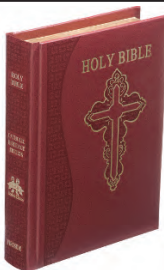
