From Fr. Mike's Desk

When you look up in the gathering area of Saint Edward's you notice the window dedicated to the Blessed Trinity. In this window, we see the Son of God crowned and He is bearing the Cross. We see the Holy Spirit in the form of a Dove, and He is between the Father and the Son. God the Father looks like the Son, but in the appearance of an older person. Above the Father's head is a halo in the form of a triangle, this represents all creation and the elements and forces of nature. This is an ancient way of depicting the Trinity and it is a way for us to understand in a little way, this great mystery of our faith

However, we will not see God appearing in this manner when we end this life and appear before God. We will certainly experience God as Father, Son, and Holy Spirit, but how God will appear to us, we will not truly know until He calls us to Himself. When we experience the Beatific Vision, we will be caught up with the beauty, wonder, and love of God, so nothing else will really matter. Yet, the revelation given to us by the Son and the grace poured upon us by the Spirit we know that God exists in this community of Divine Persons, and yet is still One True God. As we say in the Creed (when we are speaking about the Son) God from God, Light from Light, True God from True God, consubstantial with the Father. The same is true about the Holy Spirit, as He proceeds from the Father and the Son. The Spirit is the person who binds us to the Love of God. As Saint Athanasius, one of the Church Fathers, writes," We acknowledge the Trinity, holy and perfect, to consist of the Father, the Son, and the Holy spirit...It is wholly creative and energized reality, self-consistent and undivided in its active power, for the Father makes all things through the Word (the Son) and in the Holy Spirit, and in this way the unity... is preserved."

God is completely unique, and different from us, and exists in this wonderful Trinity of Three Divine Persons, and yet we must remember we are made in His image and likeness. So here is another element of this great mystery of our faith. We do not exist like God does, but is that 100% true? We cannot know now, but we will in the future, something to look forward to. As was pointed out to me in the seminary, God loves a crowd, He even lives in one, is this not true about us? Do we not seek to be with others? Think about two years ago, when we were in the lockdown! For me, the hardest part was not being able to see my family and friends, especially all the people of St. Edward's. If this does not say that we are made like God, and our need for others what else will? Christ called us to exist in the Community of the Church to be His living body, of which every baptized person is a member.

Next weekend we will celebrate another great mystery of our faith on the feast of Corpus Christi, and the fact that Jesus is truly present in the Blessed Sacrament. Hopefully, we will be able to have our procession with the Blessed Sacrament on the grounds of the Church (COVID permitting)!

Let us pray: God, we praise you: Father all-powerful, Christ Lord and Savior, Spirit of love. You reveal yourself in the depths of our being, drawing us to share in your life and love. One God, three Divine Persons, be near to the people formed in your image, close to the world your love brings to life. We ask this through our Lord Jesus Christ your Son, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, God forever and ever. Amen.

The Saint Joseph Prayer Group



Come to the church on Thursday nights at 7:30 PM and join others in praying the **Rosary** and the **Chaplet of the Divine Mercy**. The benefits of what Pope St. John Paul II called "an exquisitely contemplative prayer". According to the tradition, the Blessed Virgin Mary has related to us 15 promises to those who pray the Rosary devoutly. This week the fourth promise is:

The recitation of the Rosary will cause virtue and good works to flourish. It will obtain for souls the abundant mercy of God. It will withdraw the hearts of men from the love of the world and its vanities, and will lift them to the desire for eternal things. Oh, that souls would sanctify themselves by this means.

Liturgy of the Hours

This week we continue our introduction to the Liturgy of the Hours, the official prayer of the Catholic Church. Of the five canonical Hours, which are; Office of Readings, Morning Prayer, Daytime Prayer, and Evening Prayer, the two important Hours are Morning and Evening Prayer. By the venerable tradition of the universal Church, lauds as morning prayer and vespers as evening prayer are the two hinges on which the daily office turns; hence they are to be considered as the chief hours and celebrated as such."

Morning Prayer - As is clear from many of the elements that make it up, morning prayer is intended and arranged to sanctify the morning. St. Basil the Great gives an excellent description of this character in these words: "It is said in the morning in order that the first stirrings of our mind and will may be consecrated to God and that we may take nothing in hand until we have been gladdened by the thought of God, as it is written: 'I was mindful of God and was glad' (Ps 77:4), or set our bodies to any task before we do what has been said: 'I will pray to you, Lord, you will hear my voice in the morning; I will stand before you in the morning and gaze on you' (Ps 5:4-5). Celebrated as it is as the light of a new day is dawning, this hour also recalls the resurrection of the Lord Jesus, the true light enlightening all people (see Jn 1:9) and "the sun of justice" (Mal 4:2), "rising from on high" (Lk 1:78). Hence, we can well understand the advice of St. Cyprian: "There should be prayer in the morning so that the resurrection of the Lord may thus be celebrated."

Evening Prayer - When evening approaches and the day is already far spent, evening prayer is celebrated in order that we may give thanks for what has been given us, or what we have done well, during the day. We also recall the redemption through the prayer we send up 'like incense in the Lord's sight,' and in which 'the raising up of our hands becomes an evening sacrifice.' This sacrifice may also be interpreted more spiritually as the true evening sacrifice that our Savior the Lord entrusted to the apostles at supper on the evening when he instituted the sacred mysteries of the Church or of the evening sacrifice of the next day, the sacrifice, that is, which, raising his hands, he offered to the Father at the end of the ages for the salvation of the whole world. Again, in order to fix our hope on the light that knows no setting, we pray and make petition for the light to come down on us anew; we implore the coming of Christ who will bring the grace of eternal light. Finally, at this hour we join with the Churches of the East in calling upon the joy-giving light of that holy glory, born of the sun and have seen the evening star, we sing in praise of God, Father, Son, and Holy Spirit.

Try starting and ending each of your days in prayer, and look for the gifts which God wants to bestow upon you.




