Reading 1 - Deuteronomy 30:10-14

Moses said to the people:

"If only you would heed the voice of the LORD, your God, and keep his commandments and statutes that are written in this book of the law, when you return to the LORD, your God, with all your heart and all your soul.

"For this command that I enjoin on you today is not too mysterious and remote for you. It is not up in the sky, that you should say, 'Who will go up in the sky to get it for us and tell us of it, that we may carry it out?' Nor is it across the sea, that you should say, 'Who will cross the sea to get it for us and tell us of it, that we may carry it out?' No, it is something very near to you, already in your mouths and in your hearts; you have only to carry it out."

Reading 2 - Colossians 1:15-20

Christ Jesus is the image of the invisible God, the firstborn of all creation. For in him were created all things in heaven and on earth, the visible and the invisible, whether thrones or dominions or principalities or powers; all things were created through him and for him. He is before all things, and in him all things hold together. He is the head of the body, the church. He is the beginning, the firstborn from the dead, that in all things he himself might be preeminent. For in him all the fullness was pleased to dwell, and through him to reconcile all things for him, making peace by the blood of his cross through him, whether those on earth or those in heaven.

Gospel - Luke 10:25-37

There was a scholar of the law who stood up to test Jesus and said, "Teacher, what must I do to inherit eternal life?" Jesus said to him, "What is written in the law? How do you read it?" He said in reply, "*You shall love the Lord, your God, with all your heart, with all your being, with all your strength, and with all your mind, and your neighbor as yourself.*" He replied to him, "You have answered correctly; do this and you will live."

But because he wished to justify himself, he said to Jesus, "And who is my neighbor?" Jesus replied, "A man fell victim to robbers as he went down from Jerusalem to Jericho. They stripped and beat him and went off leaving him half-dead. A priest happened to be going down that road, but when he saw him, he passed by on the opposite side. Likewise a Levite came to the place, and when he saw him, he passed by on the opposite side. But a Samaritan traveler who came upon him was moved with compassion at the sight. He approached the victim, poured oil and wine over his wounds and bandaged them. Then he lifted him up on his own animal, took him to an inn, and cared for him. The next day he took out two silver coins and gave them to the innkeeper with the instruction, 'Take care of him. If you spend more than what I have given you, I shall repay you on my way back.' Which of these three, in your opinion, was neighbor to the robbers' victim?" He answered, "The one who treated him with mercy." Jesus said to him, "Go and do likewise."

From Fr. Mike's Desk

Today we are given two valuable lessons regarding the Commandments and our response to them. Moses in the Book of Deuteronomy is telling us what God wants from us. What He wants is not up in the sky, or so far across the sea, that we cannot obtain it. No, what God wants is extremely near to us. God does not need special messengers to talk to us, for God speaks to every human heart, to listen, all we must do is remain quiet, open our minds, and just listen! This is especially important to remember, because sometimes people have the misconception that God is extremely far away, and so different from us that we can never possibly understand Him or carry out His will.

Jesus also tells us in today's Gospel a great deal about the Commandments, when He is asked about which one is the greatest. After the scholar of the Law gives, the correct answer (the correct answer for all time and for every person), Jesus commends him, but the scholar needs more, he needs clarification. Some believe he was trying to justify himself, but some say he really wanted more. What does it matter? What matters more is the answer that Jesus gave him, when he asked, "Who is my neighbor?" It is here that Jesus' lesson comes forth. One must understand that for the scholar and the Law of Israel, your neighbor was understood to mean a fellow Israelite or a convert to Judaism. Neighbor was never to be extended to anyone outside this narrow definition, and especially not to an enemy like a Samaritan or a Roman.

Jesus, through the most beloved and known story of The Good Samaritan, tells the scholar, those gathered to hear the story, and every Christian, that everyone is our neighbor, even our enemies. God's love and forgiveness is given freely to all, and if God extends this to all, so must we. God, by the very same Commandments which are close at hand, call us to act as the Good Samaritan. To act like Jesus when He took on all our sins as He died on the Cross (as St. Paul tells us in our second reading).

To extend love, forgiveness, and a helping hand to my enemies, that's impossible! According to Jesus, no it is not. How can I do this? The answer is to see Jesus in everyone, see in everyone the Father's love, as we are all God's children. We must see past our fears and prejudices, we must understand that everyone is our neighbor and act just like the Samaritan.

One way we can help our neighbors in need is through the *Catholic Ministries Appeal*. Currently, we are at **82% of goal** with a little over **\$92,000 pledged**. **Our goal this year is \$112,100**, so we still have a way to make goal. If you have not yet made your pledge to this worthwhile appeal that helps so many people throughout the Diocese of Rockville Centre, there is still time, and a great need. All the funds raised go to the support of the various ministries throughout the Diocese, none of it goes to lawsuits, or to the bankruptcy that is pending. This is a real opportunity for you to help just like the Good Samaritan who saw everyone as his neighbor.

Saint Kateri Tekakwitha



St. Kateri Tekakwitha is the first Native American to be recognized as a saint by the Catholic Church. She was born in 1656, in the Mohawk village of Ossernenon. Her mother was an Algonquin, who was captured by the Mohawks and who took a Mohawk chief for her husband.

She contracted smallpox as a four-year-old child which scarred her skin. The scars were a source of humiliation in her youth. She was commonly seen wearing a blanket to hide her face. Worse, her entire family died during the outbreak. Kateri Tekakwitha was subsequently raised by her uncle, who was the chief of a Mohawk clan.

Kateri was known as a skilled worker, who was diligent and patient. However, she refused to marry. When her adoptive parents proposed a suitor to her, she refused to entertain the proposal. They punished her by giving her more work to do, but she did not give in. Instead, she remained quiet and diligent. Eventually they were forced to relent and accept that she had no interest in marriage.

At age 19, Kateri Tekakwitha converted to Catholicism, taking a vow of chastity and pledging to marry only Jesus Christ. Her decision was very unpopular with her adoptive parents and their neighbors. Some of her neighbors started rumors of sorcery. To avoid persecution, she traveled to a Christian native community south of Montreal.

According to legend, Kateri was very devout and would put thorns on her sleeping mat. She often prayed for the conversion of her fellow Mohawks. According to the Jesuit missionaries that served the community where Kateri lived, she often fasted and when she would eat, she would taint her food to diminish its flavor. On at least one occasion, she burned herself. Such self-mortification was common among the Mohawk.

Kateri was very devout and was known for her steadfast devotion. She was also very sickly. Her practices of self-mortification and denial may not have helped her health. Sadly, just five years after her conversion to Catholicism, she became ill and passed away at age 24, on April 17, 1680.

Her name, Kateri, is the Mohawk form of Catherine, which she took from St. Catherine of Siena.

St. Kateri Tekakwitha was canonized by Pope Benedict XVI on Oct. 21, 2012. She is the patroness of ecology and the environment, people in exile and Native Americans.

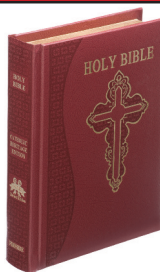
