Reading 2 - Colossians 3:1-5, 9-11

Brothers and sisters:

If you were raised with Christ, seek what is above, where Christ is seated at the right hand of God. Think of what is above, not of what is on earth. For you have died, and your life is hidden with Christ in God. When Christ your life appears, then you too will appear with him in glory. Put to death, then, the parts of you that are earthly: immorality, impurity, passion, evil desire, and the greed that is idolatry. Stop lying to one another, since you have taken off the old self with its practices and have put on the new self, which is being renewed, for knowledge, in the image of its creator. Here there is not Greek and Jew, circumcision and uncircumcision, barbarian, Scythian, slave, free; but Christ is all and in all.

Gospel - Luke 11:1-13

Someone in the crowd said to Jesus, "Teacher, tell my brother to share the inheritance with me." He replied to him, "Friend, who appointed me as your judge and arbitrator?" Then he said to the crowd, "Take care to guard against all greed, for though one may be rich, one's life does not consist of possessions."

Then he told them a parable. "There was a rich man whose land produced a bountiful harvest. He asked himself, 'What shall I do, for I do not have space to store my harvest?' And he said, 'This is what I shall do: I shall tear down my barns and build larger ones. There I shall store all my grain and other goods and I shall say to myself, "Now as for you, you have so many good things stored up for many years, rest, eat, drink, be merry!"' But God said to him, 'You fool, this night your life will be demanded of you; and the things you have prepared, to whom will they belong?' Thus will it be for all who store up treasure for themselves but are not rich in what matters to God."

From Fr. Mike's Desk

Picking up from last week's letter, we now look at the diverse types of prayer. The first is **Intercessory Prayer**. This is the prayer that we offer up for others when we ask for special request for them. Of course, we can use this type of prayer for ourselves when we are also asking for special requests. This is also the nature of prayer that is used when we ask the Blessed Mother or one of the other saints like St. Edward to pray for us. Remember we are never praying to the saints; we are asking them to pray for us to God. We never pray to anyone but God.

The second type of prayer is Prayer of Praise and Thanksgiving. We offer thanks to God for all the wonderful things that God has done for us and will continue to do. God has no need of our praise and thanksgiving, but we are encouraged to offer such prayer because it helps us. It helps us to see the glory, wonder and generosity of God. This type of prayer helps us to remember how God is always present in our lives. As we see in the Common Preface IV (said just before the Eucharistic Prayer); "For, although you have no need of our praise, yet our thanksgiving is itself your gift, since our praises add nothing to your greatness but profits us for salvation..." The third type of prayer is Praying with Scripture. Many people say they do not read the Bible because it does not seem to say anything to them. This is because of the way they read the Sacred Texts. Scripture is ancient indeed, but it speaks to all generations because it deals with the most basic aspects of human life. It is not literature, nor is it history, and yet it is both. Scripture is a faith narrative, and as we see in the Old Testament it related the story of how God called the people of Israel and how God worked in their lives throughout the ages. In the New Testament we encounter the story of how the early Church related and responded to the life, the teachings, death, and resurrection of our Lord Jesus Christ. With this understanding, we should not read the Bible like we read a newspaper or magazine. We should pray with it and take our time with it. Scripture asks us to listen to it and to ask the text (God actually) what it is that it wants to say to us today. Scripture can help us figure out the major questions in our life, it can show us the way to solve our problems, and most importantly it can help us find God. Scripture is not just words on a page, it is the living Word of God, and it will speak to us if we are open to it. God does not utter His Word to just one generation or to one group of people no, God wants to talk to each one of us.

The fourth type of prayer is **Prayer of Sorrow and Reconciliation**. This type of prayer is certainly said when we celebrate the Sacrament of Reconciliation or participate in the Penitential Rite at the beginning of Mass. However, prayer of this type could and should be prayed every day, especially as we come to the end of each day. It is a good idea to look back at the day and see where we followed the Gospel and where we failed

to. The fifth type of prayer is Communal and Liturgical Prayer. This prayer is offered when the community gathers. The community can be the whole parish or as Jesus tells us, when two or more are gathered in my name He is there. Some examples of Liturgical Prayer are the Eucharist, exposition of the Blessed Sacrament and benediction, The Liturgy of the Hours, praying the Rosary as a group, and so much more. The sixth type of prayer is Contemplative Prayer and Meditation. In today's fast paced world this type of prayer is often too difficult, if not impossible for most people to attempt. It is difficult because it requires spending time alone with God. While all prayer should contain an element of Meditative Prayer, this type of prayer calls us to set aside a good bit of time and to spend that time in quiet. The great saints used this form of prayer all the time, but one does not need to be a saint to pray like this. Remember quiet is necessary because we need to allow God to do the talking, so we can know the difference between God's voice and our own.

As you can appreciate, there are several types of prayer, and these are just a few, there are many more. Prayer is a personal experience, and no two people share the same experience or the same type of prayer. Thus, it is proper that we find our own ways to pray. Granted, when we gather for some other type of communal prayer, we do need to say the same thing and be on the same page. No one can tell you the best way to pray, this is a decision that only you and God can make. However, you must decide, for it is only through prayer that we can form a true relationship with God. If this relationship is not true and in order, we cannot have a good relationship with other people. Keep in mind that all good relationships flow from God's love and lead us back to that same love.
