
Brothers and sisters,

At the time, all discipline seems a cause not for joy but for pain, yet later it brings the peaceful fruit of righteousness to those who are trained by it.

So strengthen your drooping hands and your weak knees. Make straight paths for your feet, that what is lame may not be disjointed but healed.

Gospel - Luke 13:22-30

Jesus passed through towns and villages, teaching as he went and making his way to Jerusalem. Someone asked him, "Lord, will only a few people be saved?" He answered them, "Strive to enter through the narrow gate, for many, I tell you, will attempt to enter but will not be strong enough. After the master of the house has arisen and locked the door, then will you stand outside knocking and saying, 'Lord, open the door for us.' He will say to you in reply, 'I do not know where you are from. And you will say, 'We ate and drank in your company and you taught in our streets.' From Fr. Mike's Desk

Chances are you have seen on TV or heard on the radio or saw on the internet, ads for the New York State Lottery. Every day we see something about the recent Scratch-Off Game or what the new total is for the Mega Millions or Power Ball. These ads all offer us a chance to become a millionaire and I know many people play these games every week in hope of winning. Some people like me, will play when the jackpot is extremely high in the hope if I win even a lower prize, I can help St. Edward's. Some people have said that if they win, they will give some to St. Edward's..., from their lips to God's ears!

Yes, we are all offered the promise of winning a high sum of money, but there is, of course, one catch, and the ads tell you this all the time, namely, "You have to be in it to win it!" This is true for the Lottery, and it is true for what is offered to us in today's readings. God tells us through the Prophet Isaiah that He will come to gather the nations of every language, even lands that never heard of Him. They, like Israel, will see His glory and will proclaim it. The promise of salvation is freely given by God to all people, no matter where or when they live. God has given us the invitation to eternal life, a promise greater than winning the Lottery. However, there is one catch, you must be in it to gain it! Eternal life while freely given, is something we must strive for, and embrace totally, and if we do, God will not hold it back. We must make it our goal, and how we live our lives should totally serve that goal. It requires us to have more than a knowledge of God, Jesus, and Heaven. It requires us to know God, Jesus and Heaven in our heart and soul. It requires us to follow what the Letter to the Hebrews recommends to us today, Discipline!


These days, many people do not like the word discipline because it seems to suggest that we are not free and must yield to the power of someone else. Well, like it or not, life in this world is not completely free and we all must yield to the authority of someone else. If you do not believe it, try going one hundred mph. on the L.I.E. and see how far you get before someone makes you yield or, until recently, a pothole gets you! The very word discipline goes along with the word Disciple, and it means to follow a way of life. Whose life? Jesus' life and all He has taught us in the Gospel, what we have learned from the Church's Ancient traditions and what we continue to learn through the direction and grace of God the Holy Spirit. As we read in

Hebrews, "...all discipline seems a cause not for joy but for pain, yet later it brings the peaceful fruit of righteousness to those who are trained by it."

People asked Jesus if only a few people would be saved, and Jesus answers with, "Strive to enter through the narrow gate, for many, I tell you will attempt but will not be strong." Many will try, and while it seems that Jesus is withholding salvation from them, He is not. Those who are not strong enough to enter the kingdom are those who did not commit to it and hoped they could come along for a free ride. Eternal life will not be given to those who openly deny it or cry out, "Lord open the door for us". No, it will be given to those who listen to the call, strive to do their best to be open, and try to put the call into practice. What Jesus is telling us today, therefore, is you must genuinely want salvation to get it. It is yours for the asking all you need to do is say yes and follow Jesus' great law of love. For this love, makes up for our own imperfections and for the times when we seek discipline and fail.




Registration Info for the 2022-2023 School Year



St. Edward's Religious Education is an 8 year religious education program. Public School Students are required to begin their religious studies in grade 1 and finish their formation classes in grade 8.

Preparation for the reception of First Reconciliation and First Holy

Communion takes place in grades 1 and 2. Students will receive their First Reconciliation in March of grade 2 and then their First Holy Communion in May of grade 2. Grades 3 through 6 are required continuation study years for students in their religious education. Preparation for Confirmation occurs in grades 7 and 8. Students will receive the Sacrament of Confirmation in the Fall of grade 9.
