

From Fr. Mike's Desk

Today's readings deal with commitment, primarily our commitment to God and the community. Joshua asks the people entering the Promised Land if they would serve God, or the gods of the people who were already living in the Holy Land. Joshua gives his answer that he and his household would follow the Lord, but he wants to hear the response of the others. As we see, they too will follow God because of all He did for them in freeing them from slavery in Egypt and leading them across the desert.

Today, Jesus confronts the twelve with the question of whether they want to remain with Him after so many disciples turned away from Him after the Bread of Life Discourse. Again, we see in Peter's response (and those of the other Apostles) that commitment to Christ and the one who sent Him. "Jesus then said to the Twelve, 'Do you also want to leave?' Simon Peter answered him, 'Master, to whom shall we go? You have the words of eternal life. We have come to believe and are convinced that you are the Holy One of God!"" They committed because they did not find Jesus saying anything hard to bear. Mind you, they did not totally understand everything Jesus said and did, but they knew God sent him. They knew because the Father chose them to hear the words of the Son. "For this I have told you that no one can come to me unless it is granted him by my Father."

As it was 2,024 years ago, so it is for us today. It is not our idea that we have answered Jesus' call. It is through the Father calling us that brings us where we are today in our relationship with God. Certainly, we have the free will to say yes or no, but in some way or shape, we have said yes to the Father. We have said yes, to come closer to the Father by following the Son and receiving Him in Word and Sacrament. Now, we know that some are coming to Mass every weekend because other family members are making them come, as is seen in children, or young adults.

I would like to offer two comments, first to parents. Thank you for bringing your children, God's precious gift to you, to Mass even when they fight you. Please do not give up the fight, because you are doing a remarkable thing for them, especially when it is so hard to accomplish. However, do not convince your children to come through punishment or threats, for that will make your child associate Mass and God with punishment. Try to convince them the same way Jesus did, to convince people by love and compassion, and to share with your children how important your faith is to you, and how much Jesus means to you. When parents/ families make Mass a weekly priority the children usually grow up making God and Mass a focus in their lives. Even if there is a period when they stop going to Mass, they always seem to return later in life. This can indeed happen if you give your children and yourself a good foundation. I direct

my second comment to our young people. Kids, even when you do not want to come to Mass or feel that you are getting nothing out of it, keep coming! As you grow older and wiser, you will see the great need to come to Mass, as you will have your spiritual batteries charged. You will find great comfort in knowing that there is a special place where you can come to get away from the world's problems and feel safe and at home with Jesus. Again, this will come with time, and if you keep focused, listen to what is being said, and whom you are receiving in the Eucharist. Think about how important you are to God that He called you to Himself and desires to share everything with you through Jesus. This can only happen if you are open to God and the best way to stay open is to celebrate Jesus in your life every Sunday. Jesus is asking for a commitment as He asks this week, "Will you leave me too?" I hope that all of us will answer, "Lord where can we go, you have the words of everlasting life."



The Hail Mary Prayer - Did You Know...?


Part 3...The Holy Rosary Explained - There are two purposes in reciting the Holy Rosary:

To keep in memory central principal events in the history in our salvation, and to acquiesce to Mother Mary's request that we continually meditate on her Son's Earthly journey and the profound sacrifice He made for us as we continue to pray for peace and unity.

There are 20 mysteries reflected in the Rosary and these are divided into the 5 Joyful Mysteries (said on Mondays and Saturdays), the 5 Luminous Mysteries (said on Thursdays), the 5 Sorrowful Mysteries (said on Tuesdays and Fridays), and the 5 Glorious Mysteries (said on Wednesdays and Sundays).

The question is sometimes asked, "why of all of the incidents in our Lord's life does the Rosary only consider certain ones"? Think of it this way.... Each mystery depicts another key chapter in the life of Christ and His Mother as celebrated in the Liturgy.

In next week's Chapter 4 (our final chapter regarding the Holy Rosary), we will address these individual Mysteries as steppingstones through the life of Christ and His Mother. In the meantime, take great consolation in looking up at the beautiful stained-glass windows in the ceiling of St. Edward's Church where you will find the 20 Mysteries of the Holy Rosary.


