

Twenty-second Sunday in Ordinary Time

Reading 1 - Sirach 3:17-18, 20, 28-29

My child, conduct your affairs with humility, and you will be loved more than a giver of gifts. Humble yourself the more, the greater you are, and you will find favor with God. Reading 2 - Hebrews 12:18-19, 22-24a

Brothers and sisters:

You have not approached that which could be touched and a blazing fire and gloomy darkness and storm and a trumpet blast and a voice speaking words such that those who heard begged that no message be further addressed to them. No, you have approached Mount Zion and the city of the living God, the heavenly Jerusalem, and countless angels in festal gathering, and the assembly of the firstborn enrolled in heaven, and God the judge of all, and the spirits of the just made perfect, and Jesus, the mediator of a new covenant, and the sprinkled blood that speaks more eloquently than that of Abel.

Gospel - Luke 14:1, 7-14

On a sabbath Jesus went to dine at the home of one of the leading Pharisees, and the people there were observing him carefully.

He told a parable to those who had been invited, noticing how they were choosing the places of honor at the table. "When you are invited by someone to a wedding banquet, do not recline at table in the place of honor. A more distinguished guest than you may have been invited by him, and the host who invited both of you may approach you and say, 'Give your place to this man,' and then you would proceed with embarrassment to take the lowest place. Rather, when you are invited, go and take the lowest place so that when the host comes to you he may say, 'My friend, move up to a higher position.' Then you will enjoy the esteem of your companions at the table. For every one who exalts himself will be humbled, but the one who humbles himself will be exalted." Then he said to the host who invited him, "When you hold a lunch or a dinner, do not invite your friends or your brothers or your relatives or your wealthy neighbors, in case they may invite you back and you have repayment. Rather, when you hold a banquet, invite the poor, the crippled, the lame, the blind; blessed indeed will you be because of their inability to repay you. For you will be repaid at the resurrection of the righteous."

Next Week's Gospel Question

From Fr. Mike's Desk

Today Jesus gives us an important lesson on how to receive rewards in this life, and more importantly how to enter Eternal Life. That lesson is to be humble and to have a proper understanding of the word humility. Jesus gives this lesson in the practical situation of a formal dinner, but it can apply to any gathering of people, even an office or company meeting. Jesus tells us not to exult ourselves or automatically take the place of honor, we should take a lower place and have our host or employer tell us to move up in place. Without a doubt, people will think better of you, and you will avoid embarrassment. But this lesson is meant to do more than just inform us on how we should act in a social or business occasion. This lesson is a plan on how we really should live our lives. We must strive to lead a humble life!

Humility comes from the Latin word humilis, which means low from the earth. A humble person is usually unpretentious and modest, someone who does not think he or she is better or more important than others. Humility is not to be confused with humiliation, which is the act of making someone else feel ashamed. Different faiths look at humility in diverse ways. The Buddhists see humility as allowing us liberation from the sufferings of this life. The aim is to achieve a state of enlightenment through meditation and other spiritual practices. Humility can help us achieve Nirvana, which is the ultimate emptiness of oneself. For the followers of Islam, humility is extremely important because without it, one cannot engage in a true relationship with Allah.

Christianity defines humility as that quality which helps a person submit him or herself to God, and others, for the good of all. Humility is one of the foundations of the spiritual edifice and is inferior only to faith. However, humility is the first virtue in as much as it removes all obstacles to faith. Humility removes pride and makes one become a fit recipient of grace. Humility has the following attributes: submission to God and all legitimate authority, recognition of the virtues and talents that others have, particularly those which surpasses one's own, and giving due honor where it is required. Humility helps us to recognize the limits of our talents, abilities or authority and helps us not to reach for what is beyond one's grasps. We also must try to avoid false humility, which consists of belittling one's own sanctity, gifts, talents, and accomplishments for the sake of receiving praise

from others. In short, we must avoid being proud of our humility! Christ's call for humility is essential for us to truly know who we are before God and others, and to remind us that we all belong to God our Father who loves us all the same. To stress this point, Jesus urges that we know the poor and share life with them. Not just to know about the poor, but to really know those who are poor. We should not help the poor out of guilt or for tax write offs, but out of a powerful desire to help. We can do that here at Saint Edward's in many ways. We can support our Parish Social Ministry Office with cash donations or gift cards and certainly food donations which are collected on the first Sunday of each month. We can also help by supporting our Saint Vincent de Paul Society which helps people with various other needs including, clothing, heat, utility bills and more. We can support them by placing money in the poor boxes in the church or making a monetary donation to our society. Think about what you can do and think about how you can keep yourself humble before God and humanity.

To All Parishes,

On October 1, 2020 The Roman Catholic Diocese of Rockville Centre, New York (the "Debtor") filled a petition in the United States Bankruptcy Court of the Southern District of New York seeking relief under chapter 11 of the United States Bankruptcy Code. As such, The Roman Catholic Diocese of Rockville Centre, New York has published information pertaining To All Persons or Entities with Adult Survivors Act Sexual Abuse Claims and the bar date for claims filing. To assist these Survivors, and to provide all Parishioners with information regarding reorganization under the Bankruptcy proceeding, the Diocese is making notices and claims information available on the website of its claims agent:



Registration Info for the 2022-2023 School Year




St. Edward's Religious Education is an 8 year religious education program. Public School Students are required to begin their religious studies in grade 1 and finish their formation classes in grade 8.

Preparation for the reception of First Reconciliation and First Holy

Communion takes place in grades 1 and 2.

Students will receive their First Reconciliation in March of grade 2 and then their First Holy Communion in May of grade 2. Grades 3 through 6 are required continuation study years for students in their religious education.

Preparation for Confirmation occurs in grades 7 and 8. Students will receive the Sacrament of Confirmation in the Fall of grade 9.
