Reading 1 - Wisdom 18:6-9

The night of the passover was known beforehand to our fathers, that, with sure knowledge of the oaths in which they put their faith, they might have courage.

Reading 2 - Hebrews 11:1-2, 8-9

Brothers and sisters:

Faith is the realization of what is hoped for and evidence of things not seen. Because of it the ancients were well attested.

By faith Abraham obeyed when he was called to go out to a place that he was to receive as an inheritance; he went out, not knowing where he was to go. By faith he sojourned in the promised land as in a foreign country, dwelling in tents with Isaac and Jacob, heirs of the same promise; for he was looking forward to the city with foundations, whose architect and maker is God. By faith he received power to generate, even though he was past the normal age —and Sarah herself was sterile— for he thought that the one who had made the promise was trustworthy. So it was that there came forth from one man, himself as good as dead, descendants as numerous as the stars in the sky and as countless as the sands on the seashore.

All these died in faith. They did not receive what had been promised but saw it and greeted it from afar and acknowledged themselves to be strangers and aliens on earth, for those who speak thus show that they are seeking a homeland. If they had been thinking of the land from which they had come, they would have had opportunity to return. But now they desire a better homeland, a heavenly one. Therefore, God is not ashamed to be called their God, for he has prepared a city for them.

By faith Abraham, when put to the test, offered up Isaac, and he who had received the promises was ready to offer his only son, of whom it was said, "Through Isaac descendants shall bear your name." He reasoned that God was able to raise even from the dead, and he received Isaac back as a symbol.

Gospel - Luke 12:32-48

Jesus said to his disciples: "Do not be afraid any longer, little flock, for your Father is pleased to give you the kingdom. Sell your belongings and give alms. Provide money bags for yourselves that do not wear out, an inexhaustible treasure in heaven that no thief can reach nor moth destroy. For where your treasure is, there also will your heart be.

"Gird your loins and light your lamps and be like servants who await their master's return from a wedding, ready to open immediately when he comes and knocks. Blessed are those servants whom the master finds vigilant on his arrival. Amen, I say to you, he will gird himself, have them recline at table, and proceed to wait on them. And should he come in the second or third watch and find them prepared in this way, blessed are those servants. Be sure of this: if the master of the house had known the hour when the thief was coming, he would not have let his house be broken into. You also must be prepared, for at an hour you do not expect, the Son of Man will come."

Then Peter said, "Lord, is this parable meant for us or for everyone?" And the Lord replied, "Who, then, is the faithful and prudent steward whom the master will put in charge of his servants to distribute the food allowance at the proper time? Blessed is that servant whom his master on arrival finds doing so. Truly, I say to you, the master will put the servant in charge of all his property. But if that servant says to himself, 'My master is delayed in coming,' and begins to beat the menservants and the maidservants, to eat and drink and get drunk, then that servant's master will come on an unexpected day and at an unknown hour and will punish the servant severely and assign him a place with the unfaithful. That servant who knew his master's will but did not make preparations nor act in accord with his will shall be beaten severely; and the servant who was ignorant of his master's will but acted in a way deserving of a severe beating shall be beaten only lightly. Much will be required of the person entrusted with much, and still more will be demanded of the person entrusted with more."

From Fr. Mike's Desk

In last week's Gospel, Jesus tells us the story of the rich man whose land produced a bountiful harvest. The man decided that he would tear down his barns and build larger ones to store his extra grain and other fruits of the land. As Our Lord continues the story, He has the rich man saying," ... you have so many good things stored up for many years, rest, eat, drink and be merry!" Not a bad idea, after all who would not like to have this same security. Who would not be happy not to worry about monetary needs? Yet, the story does not end with the rich man being comfortable and contented for very long. As Jesus continues the story, we hear the voice of God the Father saying, "You fool, this night your life will be demanded of you; and the things you have prepared to whom will they belong?" The rich man's mistake was he only focused on himself and his comfort. He did not think of those who were in need. He did not share any of his wealth with others, and for this he was indeed foolish. As Jesus says, he failed because he stored up treasure for this world and did not act as God would have liked. So, in fact this man was not rich at all.

This takes us to today's Gospel and Jesus' teaching of how we are to become truly rich in God's eyes. Jesus tells us about the servants who await their master's return from a wedding. As He says, "Blessed are those servants whom the master finds vigilant on his arrival. Amen, I say to you, he will gird himself, have them recline at table and proceed to wait on them. And should he come in the second or third watch and find them prepared in this way, blessed are those servants." What Jesus is saying is that those disciples who are working hard to build the Kingdom of God will be ready to greet Jesus when He returns or when they are called home. Peter does not understand what Our Lord is saying. So, Jesus continues by telling the Apostles, that the servant who does the will of his master will be put in charge of the master's property and goods. The faithful servant will do his job for as long as it takes. Whereas the servant who says my master is delayed in returning and starts abusing his power and the people who are under him, he will receive a severe beating.


Christ has told us what we are to do through the Four Gospels and through the Epistles of Saints Paul, Peter, James, John, and Jude; therefore, none of us can say we are unaware of what is required of us. Some of us can do the job well, while some cannot, but we are to strive to do the best we can,

because we have been given much. We cannot say I did not know I was supposed to feed the hungry or take care of the poor, etc. We can say that Christ has given much, and much will be required of the person so entrusted. We, therefore, must work hard to do our best, and we must not be afraid to ask for help from our fellow disciples. For we are supposed to be in this together, and God will certainly help and guide us if we allow Him. We must not be the servant who fails to stay awake, and we cannot be the servant who only thinks about himself, for like the man last week we will lose everything.

Let us seek first the treasure of Heaven which no thief can rob, nor moth destroy. Let us seek God and His gifts always, for as Jesus says, "For where your treasure is, there also your heart."

Memorial of Saint Dominic



St. Dominic, was board c. 1170 on Bologna, Spain. His full name was Santo Domingo de Guzmán. His feast day is August 8th. He was founder of the Order of Friars Preachers (Dominicans), a mendicant religious order with a universal mission of preaching, a centralized organization and government, and a great emphasis

on scholarship. He is a patron saint of the Dominican Republic and of astronomers.

St. Dominic was gifted in being able to conceive his ideal, to form his men to that ideal, and then to trust them completely. His leadership had great clarity of vision, firmness of command, and certainty of execution. At the same time it was said of him that his gentleness was such that anyone who came to speak to him, even for reproof, went away happier.

It has been said that Dominic prayed for divine mercy for everyone. He would look upon the crucifix, gazing intently on Christ on the Cross, kneeling down, then getting up, over and over again. Sometimes he could not contain his voice, saying, "To you Lord, will I cry, do not turn away from me in silence . . . " (Psalm 27:1). St. Dominic died on August 6, 1221, and was canonized on July 3, 1234.




