

#### **Twenty-sixth Sunday in Ordinary Time**

#### **Reading 1 - Amos 6:1a, 4-7**

Thus says the LORD the God of hosts: Woe to the complacent in Zion! Lying upon beds of ivory, stretched comfortably on their couches, they eat lambs taken from the flock, and calves from the stall! Improvising to the music of the harp, like David, they devise their own accompaniment. They drink wine from bowls and anoint themselves with the best oils; yet they are not made ill by the collapse of Joseph! Therefore, now they shall be the first to go into exile, and their wanton revelry shall be done away with.

#### Reading 2 — 1 Timothy 6:11-16

But you, man of God, pursue righteousness, devotion, faith, love, patience, and gentleness. Compete well for the faith. Lay hold of eternal life, to which you were called when you made the noble confession in the presence of many witnesses. I charge you before God, who gives life to all things, and before Christ Jesus, who gave testimony under Pontius Pilate for the noble confession, to keep the commandment without stain or reproach until the appearance of our Lord Jesus Christ that the blessed and only ruler will make manifest at the proper time, the King of kings and Lord of lords, who alone has immortality, who dwells in unapproachable light, and whom no human being has seen or can see. To him be honor and eternal power. Amen.

#### Gospel — Luke 16:19-31

Jesus said to the Pharisees: "There was a rich man who dressed in purple garments and fine linen and dined sumptuously each day. And lying at his door was a poor man named Lazarus, covered with sores, who would gladly have eaten his fill of the scraps that fell from the rich man's table. Dogs even used to come and lick his sores. When the poor man died, he was carried away by angels to the bosom of Abraham. The rich man also died and was buried, and from the netherworld, where he was in torment, he raised his eyes and saw Abraham far off and Lazarus at his side. And he cried out, 'Father Abraham, have pity on me. Send Lazarus to dip the tip of his finger in water and cool my tongue, for I am suffering torment in these flames.' Abraham replied, 'My child, remember that you received what was good during your lifetime while Lazarus likewise received what was bad; but now he is comforted here, whereas you are tormented. Moreover, between us and you a great chasm is established to prevent anyone from crossing who might wish to go from our side to yours or from your side to ours.' He said, 'Then I beg you, father, send him to my father's house, for I have five brothers, so that he may warn them, lest they too come to this place of torment.' But Abraham replied, 'They have Moses and the prophets. Let them listen to them.' He said, 'Oh no, father Abraham, but if someone from the dead goes to them, they will repent.' Then Abraham said, 'If they will not listen to Moses and the prophets, neither will they be persuaded if someone should rise from the dead."

#### Next Week's Gospel Question

At the end of next week's Gospel the question is asked if our faith is limited to doing what we are obligated to do or do we go beyond that which we are obligated... like Jesus did?

#### From Fr. Mike's Desk

In our second reading today, Paul tells Timothy to, "...pursue righteousness, devotion, faith, love, patience and gentleness. Compete for faith. Lay hold of eternal life, to which you were called when you made your confession in the presence of many witnesses. I charge you before God who gave life to all things, and before Christ Jesus...to keep the commandment without stain or reproach until the appearance of Our Lord Jesus Christ...To him, be honor and eternal power. Amen."

The Commandment that Timothy is to keep without stain or reproach is the basic Commandment of Israel and the Church; to love the Lord God with all your heart, soul, fiber, and being, and to love your neighbor as yourself and for us in the Church, to love one another as Jesus has loved us, and to follow all that Jesus has told us in the Gospel. This is what Timothy is to do until Christ comes again and this is what we are also supposed to do.

Today's readings from the Book of the Prophet Amos and the Gospel of Luke, give us two cases when this commandment was not followed. Amos tells the rich people of the Northern Kingdom that they are living lives of luxury while the poor have nothing. The rich were violating the Law of the Lord by not trying to ease the poor's burden. They were not inflicting any harm to the poor; they were just doing nothing to help ease their suffering or sorrow. The same is being said of the rich man in today's Gospel. Dives (as he is known, which is not really his name but simply means rich man) has everything while we are told that Lazarus has nothing. Dives eats well every day, while Lazarus would gladly eat the scraps that fell from Dives' table. Dives does no harm to Lazarus; in fact, it is seen as a kindness that he allows Lazarus to live inside his doorway and that he gives him the scraps. However, he does nothing else to relieve the poor man's burden. Dives ignores Lazarus' condition, shows no love to his neighbor, and certainly does not love as Jesus loves. The lesson of this part of the story is obvious, for Christians we must seek to help the poor and relieve their sufferings whether it be here, in our local region, and even in other parts of the world. We must do more than just give handouts; we must try to change the situation and events that make so many people hungry and poor throughout the world.

Love your neighbor as yourself or love one another as I have loved you is certainly what is missing in the lifestyle of Dives and the people of the Northern Kingdom, but they and the Pharisees, to whom Jesus is directing this story were also failing in the first part of the Commandment. They were failing to love God with their whole soul, heart, and being. This is clearly illustrated when we are told that both Dives and Lazarus died and we learn that Lazarus has gone to heaven in the bosom of Abraham, while Dives is in a not so pleasant place (where we are told it is mighty HOT). When he requests that Lazarus come to his aid, Abraham tells him no, and that he has received the just reward for how he lived his life. So, the rich man asks Abraham to send Lazarus to his father's house to warn his brothers so they can change their lives before it is too late. He hopes that if someone would come back from the dead they would immediately change. Notice what Abraham says to Dives, he tells him that they have Moses and the Prophets, and that they have been told the correct way to live and to love God and neighbor. All they have to do is listen to those who were already sent by God, and if they would not listen to them now, as this appears to be Jesus' criticism of the Pharisees, then they would not listen if one should come back from the dead. The Pharisees should have known who Jesus was as they studied Moses and the Prophets, but they refused to listen to Jesus; and as Luke tells us they still refused to listen even when they heard He had risen from the dead! Luke is making a formal accusation against the Pharisees and even the Government of Rome for failing to help change society and for failing to do what Jesus has commanded us to do. Let us make sure that we do not make the same mistakes.

Let us pray: All-powerful Father, God of mercy and love, look kindly on those who are suffering, hungry, homeless, unemployed and ease their burdens. Make their faith strong that they may always have confidence and trust in your Fatherly care. Grant this through our Lord Jesus Christ who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, God for ever and ever, Amen.

God bless you always and thank you for all you do for the poor!



## Registration Info for Religious Education Classes for the 2022-2023 School Year

St. Edward's Religious Education is an 8 year religious studies program. Public School Students are required to begin their religious studies in grade 1 and finish in grade 8.



Preparation for First Holy Communion takes place in grades 1 and 2. Students will receive their First
Confession in March of grade 2 and then their First
Communion in May of that year. Children in Grades
3 through 6 are required to attend classes for further
study in their religious formation. Formal preparation
for the Sacrament of Confirmation occurs in grades 7
and 8. Students then receive the Sacrament of
Confirmation in the Fall of grade 9.
